LOUISIANA COMPLIANCE QUESTIONNAIRE

A resolution to complete and authorize Mayor Toups to sign the Louisiana Compliance Questionnaire for the 2018 audit was offered by Councilor Cazes; seconded by Councilor Acosta and adopted unanimously.

DOTD MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

Mayor Toups presented the 2019-2020 DOTD Maintenance Agreement and informed the Council that the maximum amount for which the Municipality may claim reimbursement is \$6,860.00, which is the same as the current agreement. A motion approving Mayor Toups to sign the 2019-2020 Maintenance Agreement (including mowing and litter pick-up) between the Town of Addis and the State of Louisiana, Department of Transportation and Development was made by Councilor Kelley; seconded by Councilor Parrish and adopted.

RACETRAC

Mayor Toups advised that the RaceTrac has requested Liquor and Beer Permits. He also advised that all State and Parish permits as well as the Town Occupational License have been obtained by the company. A motion to approve the issuance of permits to RaceTrac for the sale of liquor and beer was made by Councilor Kelley; seconded by Councilor Cazes and adopted unanimously.

REPORTS

Parish Council: Parish Representative Kirk Allain advised that the new road from Sid Richardson to LA 448 has been completed and the Parish is asking for suggestions for a name for the new road. Mayor Toups asked anyone with an idea to let him know as soon as possible.

Mr. Allain noted that work is progressing on the new well and water lines in the Parish. Most of the Right-of-Way agreements have been obtained.

He also advised that Bill #578 which involves getting money to build the 415 overpass and other road improvements in the state, has passed the Appropriations Committee and is being sent to the full House.

Police Report: The police report for the month of April 2019 was provided by Chief Anderson and included 108 traffic citations; 39 misdemeanor arrests; 14 felony arrests; and 4 vehicle crashes worked. The **Misdemeanor Arrests** included 1 dangerous animal, 2 disturbances; 1 leash law; 4 warrants and 32 narcotics. The **Felony Arrests** included 14 narcotics.

Sewer Report: The sewer report for the month of April 2019 was provided by Public Works Director, Phil Smith and included 81 Residential and Commercial equipment calls; 17 Lift Station equipment calls; 143 LA One Call tickets completed and 10 new construction tie-in inspections. Phil also provided an update on the various sewer projects taking place in Town. A copy of the report provided by Town Engineer, Mr. Oscar Boudreaux is attached and made part of these minutes.

i. Home Occupation Applications

- a. **William Quirk** – Mr. William Quirk of Bacopa Services LLC, which is a janitorial service, requested a Home Occupation license. ORDINANCE 2019- 3

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING, SUPPLEMENTING AND REVOKING/DELETING CERTAIN PROVISIONS IN THE ADDIS CODE OF ORDINANCES, PARTICULARLY, PART II, CHAPTER 111, SUBDIVISIONS, BY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING §111-12 TO PROVIDE FOR DRAINAGE IMPACT STUDIES, 100 YEAR FLOOD DESIGN REQUIREMENTS AND TRAFFIC IMPACT STUDIES FOR NEW SUBDIVISIONS AND § 111-13 PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EARTHWORK, SEWER, LIME TREATMENT AND OTHER GENERAL PROVISIONS, AND AMENDING, DELETING AND REVOKING SUBSECTIONS PERTAINING TO *STREET IMPROVEMENTS*.

WHEREAS, the Town of Addis, Louisiana, is desirous of amending, supplementing and deleting portions of its Code of Ordinances, particularly, Part II, Chapter 111, *Subdivisions* providing for additional requirements for Earthwork, Sewer, Lime Treatment, Street Improvements and other General Provisions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Town Council of the Town of Addis, Louisiana, acting as the governing authority thereof, that Part II, Chapter 111, *Subdivisions* shall be amended and supplemented to read as follows:

“§ 111-12 Preliminary Plat Approval

Legals

(a)(8) *A full drainage impact study must be completed by a certified engineer and reviewed by the Town engineer prior to the submission of a preliminary plat for approval. The drainage impact shall not exceed the current existing volume for the property. All costs for the drainage impact study and all review costs of the Town shall be paid by the developer at no cost to the Town. Any drainage improvements required no matter how far geographically from the subject property shall be paid for by the developer at no costs to the Town of Addis.*

(a)(9) *All developments shall design drainage and mitigate fill for a 100 year flood event.*

(a)(10) *A full traffic impact study must be completed by a certified traffic engineer approved by the Town of Addis and reviewed by the Town engineer prior to the submission of a preliminary plat for approval. All costs for the traffic impact study and all review costs of the Town shall be paid by the developer at no cost to the Town.*

§ 111-13 Improvements

(2) Street Improvements

a. **DELETED IN FULL**

b. *All streets shall be curb and gutter. The width shall be 27 feet measured from back-to-back of the curve.*

c. **DELETED IN FULL**

(5) Storm Drainage

b. *Cross pipes under streets shall be reinforced concrete or asphalt dipped corrugated metal that meets the specifications of the state department of highways. All specifications for pipes are found in section 9, part 4, division II, of the "State of Louisiana, Department of Highways—Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges," latest edition.*

(7). Additional improvements and general construction requirements

a. Earthwork

2. *All fill is to be installed in six-inch maximum lifts and compacted to 95 percent standard compaction. In place Moisture/Density tests should be performed on each lift at a rate of 10% of the lots.*

b. Sewer

15. *If ground water is encountered during installation, actions must be taken and approved by the Town of Addis to insure that the bedding, pipe and initial backfill is installed without any negative impact.*

16. *Mandrel and video can be performed 30 days after installation has been completed.*

h. Lime Treatment

1. *A lime determination is required prior to lime installation. A proof roll of the lime treated sub base and base must be performed using a loaded tandem axle dump truck prior to moving to the next step of construction.*

o. General

8. *Prior to request for the final inspection the Engineer of Record should perform an inspection of the site to insure that all items have been completed and submit an Engineering Certification Letter.*

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Addis, Louisiana that any provisions or items of this Ordinance or the application thereof if held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Town Council of the Town of Addis, Louisiana, acting as the governing authority thereof, that this Ordinance shall be designated as Ordinance 2019-3.

Police Department Report:

Police Department Report for the month of March was given by Assistant Chief Southon. The Mayor also gave Animal Control update following questions asked at last week's meeting. Following a meeting with Parish Administration, the Mayor feels that there will be service than in the past, as confirmed by Parish Council Member Kershaw.

Remarks of Personal Privilege:

Jennifer Lamana, 2408 Allene Street, spoke to describe water in her home following the recent rain events and asked what the Town can do to help their drainage issues. Mayor Rhodes described past drainage problems with that property and some projects in that area which had attempted to correct those issues. He further stated that we will meet with the Town engineer and Parish personnel to seek ways to relieve the problems through future drainage plans.

Wendy Parrish, 512 Bourgeois Street, expressed concerns regarding drainage issues in Front Brusly, specifically near her property where water was within an inch of getting into her home. Mayor Rhodes explained that the Town will check her property for problems and continue to clean our ditches in the area.

Council Member Bourgeois, Chief Lefeaux and Assistant Chief Southon attended the "Bridging the Gap" community forum session on April 30.
