 This number includes all students and staff who were being isolated or quarantined during this week, and includes those who were being isolated and quarantined from previous weeks. Quarantines and isolations will span multiple weeks.

Confirmed Exposure/Close Contact Defined: This means that a student or staff member was in close contact (within 6 feet) of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 for at least 15 consecutive minutes. This does not mean the exposure happened at South Hardin Schools and so far none of our exposure cases have been traced to school related exposure. The current guidance from the Department of Public Health is that those individuals that are deemed to be close contacts are instructed to quarantine for 14 days, as the virus has been known to develop 2-14 days after close contact exposure to a positive case.
