To attend, RSVP to the library at 706-657-7857. This will reserve you a place at the event and enter your name in a drawing for door prizes.

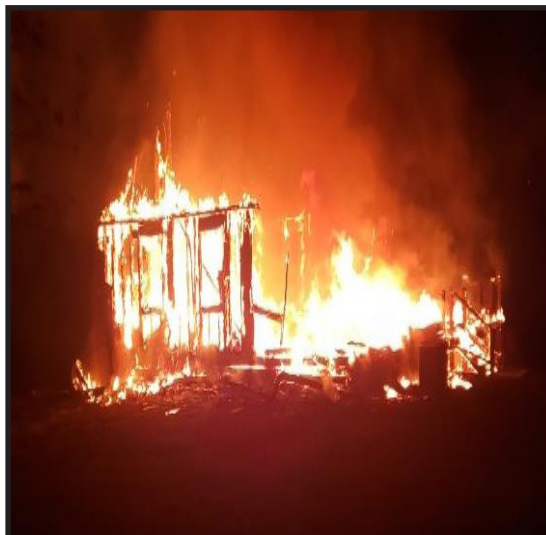

An early Sunday morning fire destroyed a home in the Davis Community on Sand Mountain.
