## How to Mark Your Ballot

### INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS:

Use a blue or black ballpoint pen.

**To vote for a candidate**, completely fill in the rectangle next to the candidate's name.

**Look for the number** of candidates to vote for at the top of each contest.

**Do not** vote for more than the number listed.

**To vote for a qualified write-in candidate**, completely fill in the rectangle next to the qualified write-in line and write the candidate's name on the line.

**To vote on a measure**, completely fill in the rectangle next to the word "YES" or "NO."

**If you make a mistake** or want to change your vote, ask an Elections Official for a new ballot.

A mistake on one contest does not affect the rest of the ballot.

There are contests on both sides of the ballot.

You may vote in as many or as few contests as you want.

Fill-in the rectangle (■) that appears next to your choice.



## How to Vote at the Polling Place

All polling places are open from 7 AM to 8 PM on Election Day. To find the location of your polling place look on the back cover of this guide. Not every voter has a polling place. If you wish to vote in person and you are not assigned a polling place, you may deliver your ballot to the Elections Office.

### Be Prepared:



- Bring your vote by mail ballot and envelope to surrender.
- Use your sample ballot to practice and bring that with you on Election Day.

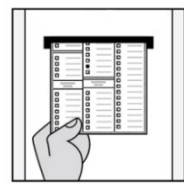
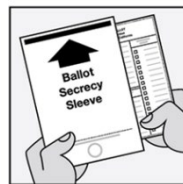
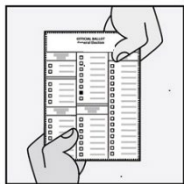
### Accessible Voting:

All polling locations have an accessible device with the following options:



- A universal plug for a personal assistive device.
- An audio option that reads the ballot to you.
- Enlarged print.

### How to Cast your Ballot:



1. Ask a poll worker for a ballot.

2. Mark your ballot.

3. Place your ballot into a secrecy sleeve.

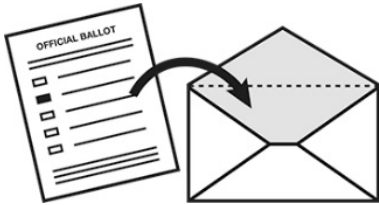
4. Scan your ballot.



## How to Return Your Vote by Mail Ballot

State law requires our office to mail every eligible voter a ballot. How you return your ballot is up to you. Early ballot returns help our office produce timely election results.

### How to Cast your Ballot:



- Mark your ballot.
- Check your ballot carefully.
- Put your ballot in the return envelope.
- Sign & seal your envelope.
- Return the ballot inside the ballot envelope.

### By Mail:

Mail your ballot so that it is postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the County Elections office no later than 7 days after Election Day.



- Use the postage paid envelope to return your ballot.
- **Mail your ballot early.**
- The postmarked date may not reflect the day you placed your ballot in the mail.

### Secure Drop Box:



- No postage required.
- Drop boxes are open 24 hours a day.
- Deliver your ballot before 8 PM on Election Day.

### In-Person:

You may deliver your ballot to the Trinity County Elections Office on or before Election Day or to any polling place by 8 PM on Election Day.



- The Elections Office is open Monday-Friday from 9 AM-1 PM and 2 PM-4 PM.
- Saturday May 30<sup>th</sup> the Elections Office will be open from 9 AM-3 PM.
- Election Day the Elections Office will be open 7 AM-8 PM.

### Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM):

This secure portal gives all eligible Trinity County voters access to verify their registration status, review your county voter information guide, and access to an accessible ballot format at home.



- RAVBM is **NOT** internet or online voting.
- RAVBM is an optional tool that allows voters to vote privately and independently at home.
- The secure portal provides access for eligible voters to download, mark & print their ballot.
- Once complete, you then must **return your ballot inside a ballot envelope.**

### How to request a copy of the ballot

You may request a copy of a Spanish ballot be mailed or emailed to you by contacting the Elections Office via mail, telephone, or email.

### Voting Assistance

As a voter, you may bring up to two individuals to your polling place to help you cast your ballot. Those individuals cannot represent your employer or union.

### Candidates accept campaign spending limits.

California law requires candidates running for State Senate and State Assembly to accept certain voluntary expenditure limits to have the option to pay for and publish a 250-word Candidate Statement of qualifications in this guide.

Pursuant to Proposition 34, adopted November 2000, the following candidates have accepted voluntary campaign expenditure limits and are eligible to submit a Candidate Statement to be printed in the County Voter Information Guide. This law only applies to candidates for State Legislative offices.

**Education and Qualifications:**

**Education and Qualifications:**

Third-generation Californian, raised in Mill Valley. My mother, Wanda Lee Ballentine, 87, practiced regenerative stewardship decades before it was fashionable. I grew up on Strauss dairy milk, explored Point Reyes with naturalist Mrs. Terwilliger, and birded with my uncle Stuart Keith, world record holder for species observed. Zucchini Bunch neighbors, teachers, and working families knew what Washington forgets: the land sustains us when we sustain the land.

Not a politician, a public servant with thirty years of experience: CDC Quarantine Public Health Officer, Special Education Teacher, Clinical Engineer at Stryker Corporation, US Postal Carrier, Teamster, union grievance representative, and behavioral health counselor.
