What started out as a simple Consent Agenda item involving City recognition of a new bargaining unit involving the three captains of the Crescent City Fire and Rescue, morphed into a quasi-discussion during Public Comments, of what will the future Fire Department look like.

With the rubber stamp approval of the City resolution of the Crescent City Firefighters Association as representative

- Structure fires have virtually disappeared from the 2000


logged calls. With this trend continuing, what role will the fire department play as the lack of structure fires are disappearing for a variety of different

Golden State Population Inches Upward

Governor Newsom announced California's population grew by 108,000 in calendar year 2024. The increase was calculated at .0027 percent.

The California Dept of Finance reported the State's population was 39,529,000 as of January 1.

According to the latest official count by the Dept. of Finance, Del Norte County showed a negative 2.01 percent decline to 25,503 population as of January 1, 2025. Del Norte had a population of 28,568 as of 2010. The population was:

- 27,082 (2022)
- 26,589 (2023)
- 25,503 (2024)

Del Norte includes inmates at Pelican Bay State Prison in its population count.

The slight increase follows a growth of 48,764 in 2023.

Census figures show 277,648 immigrants were added to the rolls from 2021-2024.

Texas experienced a two million population growth (23 percent) to 31.3 million

Florida experienced a similar growth to 23.3 million.

The Golden State lost one Congressional seat, from 53 seats to 52 Representatives as a result of the 2020 Census. The official census is conducted every ten years.



Remembering Indigenous People who've been murdered or go missing

Awareness Walk Sheds Light on Murdered and Missing Indigenous People

More than 50 sign-toting Tribal and non-tribal citizens walked silently through downtown Crescent City at noon, last Monday, bringing attention to the fact that thousands of Indigenous individuals have gone missing or fall victim to foul play, murder and human trafficking.

This event sponsored by the Tolowa Dee-ni Nation was the 3rd annual Missing and Murdered Indigenous People

Awareness Walk (MMIP), traversed both sides of the 101.

The MMIP event shines a spotlight on Indigenous victims throughout the United States and within the Tolowa Dee-ni service area, spanning Del Norte and Curry County.

The Family Wellness Victim Services Division helped make signs and assisted participants paint their faces with a red handprint which symbolizes the MMIP message. Displays included names and photos of missing and Murdered Indigenous People. "When we are

dealing with a lot of heavy issues, we recognize what we have to work through it," Tribal citizen Suntayea Steinruck told attendees. She continued, "It can be heavy on your heart, heavy on your soul but it's also healing."

The Tolowa Dee-ni Nation also released this statement after the event: "Since time immemorial, the Tolowa people have lived in harmony with their environment and have been stewards of this area prior to the arrival of the first

Newsom and Trump Working Together on Rural Housing

Governor Gavin Newsom and the Dept. of Housing and Community Development have announced the awards of \$118.9 million in federal funding for 29 California rural and tribal communities to create more affordable housing and supportive services.

The good news for Del Norte is it's one of the rural counties to receive the, as yet, unannounced amount awards. Besides Del Norte the other rural county awards will go to El Dorado, Kings, Lake, Madera, Mendocino, Merced, Monterey and Placer counties. The ten HOME-ARP RH awards announced last Monday include a total of 487 affordable rental homes, including 184 HOME-ARP funded units for low-income households and other qualifying populations. This includes people experiencing or at risk of homelessness, those fleeing violence or human

Del Norte Ambulance Enhances Emergency Medical Dispatching Services in Del Norte County

As Emergency Medical Services Week approaches, Del Norte Ambulance is proud to highlight major improvements in Emergency Medical Dispatching (EMD) services that are helping to save lives and improve emergency response times throughout Del Norte County.

In partnership with the Del Norte County Sheriff's Office and Bay City's Ambulance Dispatch Center, Del Norte Ambulance has implemented advanced dispatch technology and ensured that EMD-certified dispatchers are available 24/7. These investments are part of an ongoing effort to strengthen coordination, reduce response times, and enhance the quality of emergency care available to local residents.

"We remain committed to providing the

highest standard of emergency services to our community," said Ron Sandler, Paramedic and President of Del Norte Ambulance. "These improvements reflect our ongoing dedication to the safety and well-being of Del Norte County residents."

What Is Emergency Medical Dispatching?

Emergency Medical Dispatching (EMD) is the process of managing 911 calls related to medical emergencies. Using nationally approved protocols, trained dispatchers:

- Rapidly assess the situation by asking targeted questions,
- Dispatch the appropriate level of emergency response,
- Provide life-saving instructions—such as CPR, bleeding control, or childbirth guidance—over the phone until first responders arrive.

This process serves as the critical first link in the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) chain and often plays a vital role in patient survival.

How an EMD Call Works

When a 911 medical call is transferred from the Sheriff's Dispatch Center, the EMD process typically includes:

Initial Assessment

The dispatcher asks:

- "What is the address of the emergency?"
- "What is the phone number you're calling from?"
- "Tell me exactly what happened."

Protocol Selection

Based on the caller's responses, the dispatcher selects the appropriate medical protocol.

Determinant Assignment

The severity of the situation is determined, and the correct emergency response is dispatched.

Pre-Arrival Instructions

Vital instructions are given to the caller to assist the patient until emergency personnel arrive on the scene.

A Commitment to Public Safety

"It has taken years for us to get this service up and running and remain committed to continually improving the highest standard of emergency services to our community," said Ron Sandler, Paramedic and President of Del Norte Ambulance. to a fully paid Department. Fire Chief Carey offered no comments at the Monday-last meeting. The Public has not be advised on the discussion of more paid fire department employees; however, the item has been

broached. This discussion intercedes with Del Norte County's Request for Proposal, exploring the possibility of replacing Del Norte Ambulance, in three years, at the termination of its 9-1-1 Emergency service. The County has expended \$97,000 of Health and Human Ser-

vices emergency account on what is expected to be about \$150,000? In other City business, Councilors voted to install

a four-way STOP signage on the corner of 5th and A Streets, passed a Resolution to create an Underground Utility District,

introduce and waive full reading, adopt a Local Responsibility Area Fire Hazard Map and instructed the City Manager to file

a Notice of Completion for the Crescent City Fred Ender Pool HVAC project.

Euro-Americans. Sadly, many of the established villages and their inhabitants killed by state-funded militias in the 1850s. Today, many descendants of the Tolowa people are enrolled citizens of the federally recognized Tolowa Dee-ni Nation and Elk Valley Rancheria. We are here today because we know the impact this scourge is

having on our people." The Nation welcomed tribal members and the community to play any integral role in addressing this issue. If you have information about a missing or murdered individual, please call 9-1-1, immediately. Even the smallest bit of information can be a piece that leads to a successful recovery or closure of a missing Indigenous person.

trafficking and others at great risk of housing instability. The Yurok Tribe will also be benefiting from these awards. HCD's HOME-ARP Rental Housing announced ten awards totalling \$89 million, including two tribal awards. The Yurok Indian Housing Authority and the Big Valley Band of Pomo Indians received combined \$18.7 million to fund 31 HOME-ARP assists units. The Governor was thrilled with the awards and the healthy working relationship with Washington. "Our nation's housing crisis doesn't end at city limits, and we must ensure housing and services are available to all members

of our communities. We are grateful for the additional federal funding to insure that our rural and tribal communities they need and deserve," beamed Newsom.




Bartley a "work horse" and one of the hardest working people in the entire state of California.

Braydan Johnson, who finished third at the Humboldt-Del Norte League championships and eighth at the NCS tournament, will be going to College of the Redwoods in Eureka. Corsairs Coach Brandon Benvenuti believes Johnson is just starting to tap into his

potential. Johnson earned the nickname "Fearless" from Coach Schaad. "No matter who he is competing against he always has a chance of success because he doesn't care who you are or what your accomplishments are."

Alex Osborne will be taking his talents to Lassen

Community College in Susanville. Osborne won the Humboldt-Del Norte League championship in his weight class, then finished second at the NCS event. "He refuses to quit no matter what the situation," Coach Schaad said. "He has won more matches by simply refusing to give up than anyone I have ever coached."

James Gensaw Jr., will be in Arcata, wrestling for the recently revived Cal Poly Humboldt program. Gensaw finished second at the Humboldt-Del Norte League event after a standout Warrior career. "He is one of those special wrestlers that will always learn from a loss," Coach Schaad said. "James has the unique ability to be able to sit down and study a match

and truly analyze how things transpired and make in-season adjustments to better himself."

As a team, Del Norte has won seven consecutive HDN titles, back-to-back North Coast Section dual-meet championships, and finished third at the NCS championships this season.

Coach Schaad praised the group for their talents, dedication, and most of all, their leadership.

"As a 23-year-wrestling coach at DNHS, having this type of core leadership is a dream come true," Schaad said. "They all bring their own unique abilities, but those abilities blend together seamlessly. What these five bring to the table as a solidified leadership unit is a once-in-a-coaching career experience."
