



County closes hotels, rentals due to COVID-19

Sutter Coast Hospital readies for possible local surge of coronavirus

Del Norte County's public health officer issued an order Friday limiting the use of hotels and vacation rentals to prevent the spread of novel coronavirus from potentially overburdening the local healthcare system.

The order went into effect Friday evening, March 27.

Dr. Warren Rehwaldt said during a news conference on Friday the order resembles actions taken by Brookings, Ore., and other coastal communities. The

conference was also attended by Sutter Coast Hospital CEO Mitch Hanna and co-hosted by Crescent City Mayor Blake Inscore and Del Norte County Board of Supervisors Chairman Gerry Hemmingsen.

Rehwaldt said local emergency personnel and public health officials felt it was important to move quickly on the restriction of hotels and vacation rentals.

"The order discourages unnecessary travel. There's a high demand of travelers coming from out of the area and out of state. People may be trying to flee their own areas af-

fecting by COVID-19 but at the same time they might be bringing it with them," Rehwaldt said.

The closure includes the following areas:

- County parks are closed to camping except for hosts or other people expressly authorized by the county for stays of 30 days or longer.
- Short-term rentals, including vacation rentals or homestay lodging, are prohibited in Del Norte County until the emergency ends.
- Hotels, motels, RV parks and private camp-

grounds are prohibited from housing anyone for less than a 30-day period. Some exceptions include a county resident allowing a

family member or roommate to self-quarantine in their home.

- Pools, spas and other public bathing facilities

are closed.

Hanna then outlined the

FIRE DISPLACES 12 RESIDENTS OF SURF APARTMENTS

Twelve people were displaced by a fire at Surf Apartments Thursday, March 26, the Crescent City Fire Department reported.

The fire broke out at 12:47 p.m. Thursday in a fourth-floor apartment at the Surf Apartments, 108 H St., Crescent City.

Originally dispatched as a fire alarm sounding at the location, the response was quickly upgraded to a structure fire when dispatch advised there was smoke in an apartment on the fourth floor, and occupants were beginning to evacuate.

Upon arrival, light smoke was seen coming from an apartment on the front street side of the building and the fire alarm system was sounding. There were some occupants already on the street in front of the building.

Firefighters entered the building for fire attack and search and encountered several residents in the hallways and still inside their rooms. The ladder truck was positioned with the ladder to the apartment that had smoke coming from it. The fire attack crew found the

apartment full of smoke but the fire had been extinguished by one sprinkler head that activated in the bedroom.

The fire had burned a laundry basket of clothing and began to burn the mattress next to it.

Search efforts continued as additional occupants were removed or sheltered in place on lower floors away from the fire.

The sprinkler system was shut down, smoke was removed from the building, and crews worked to protect property from water damage. The building electrical was also shutoff.

Unfortunately, 12 occupants were displaced by the fire and subsequent water damage to apartments next to and below where the fire was found.

Del Norte County Office of Emergency Services assisted with Red Cross to temporarily house the 12 displaced occupants.

Property management on the scene was coordinating with an electrician to restore power to the undamaged apartments. Cleaning resources were also being brought in for water removal.

Superintendent keeps schools closed for now, plans for graduation

After re-evaluating the continued potential spread of the novel coronavirus, Del Norte Unified School District officials decided schools will continue to remain closed.

While Superintendent Jeff Harris recommended the school board revisit the situation at its April 9 meeting, he told the trustees graduation plans are still in the works.

"At the all-principal meeting, a couple of things I've been telling everyone is to plan everything after April 20 as if we're moving forward," Harris said. "I don't want to not plan for it and not have it because we didn't plan for it. I want to plan as if we're going to do it if we're able to. I don't want to miss an opportunity for lack of planning."

In the meantime, Harris said they are looking at canceling a physical ceremony and looking at virtual graduation options or a blended in-person and virtual graduation.

Student board member representative Elizabeth Ward asked how the grading period that ends May 1 would be handled during the closure.

Harris said after conversations with other county superintendents and State Superintendent of Schools Tony Thurmond, the bottom line is the state hasn't determined how grading would be handled for the interrupted semester.

"The Legislature hasn't decided what it wants to do yet. But what we're thinking of, for instance, if you were enrolled in civics class, then just being enrolled in civics class when we went out on March 13 would act for the state as if you have completed civics class," he said.

Harris added that because things are changing rapidly, he didn't know what would happen but promised to keep high school seniors in the loop.

Harris explained it wouldn't be prudent to reopen schools now as the state expects a surge in the number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in April and May. He added school districts in the Bay Area and Southern California, areas hardest hit by the coronavirus, have committed to remaining closed through the first full week of May.

Starting this week, Harris said there is a "soft closure" of the district administration office, located at 301 W. Washington Blvd. The doors will be closed to the general public Mondays and Fridays and open the rest of the week from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. To limit traffic to the building, there will be a table in the main office where parents can still pick up such things as applications for childcare, work and school registration packets. Harris said this follows the lead of the city and county offices which have closed

There's only so much to do when stuck in the confines of a home when practicing safe social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic.

For the Fletcher family, they took their burgeoning band, Weekend Sons, and reached out to friends and neighbors throughout Crescent City to contribute to their first online release, a cover of the Beatles' "All You Need is Love."

"It's really tough being stuck at home. So, we asked the community to help us with this song, because we're all in this together," Sage Fletcher, 14, says, kicking off the video, which was released to their Facebook page March 24.

"It was my idea that our band name reflected it was a family band. And my sons said not to make it too obvious. So, Weekend Sons implies we play on the weekend and sounded like an actual band name," James Fletcher said.

With Sage on bass guitar, brother,

Josh, 10, on the drums and tambourine and dad, James, on lead guitar, the video starts in their living room transformed into a recording studio.

The video then cuts to all the contributors singing and playing along. The video hasn't necessarily gone viral, but Fletcher said he was surprised by how many people passed it on, as it nears 5,000 views and sits at 105 shares.

City Council supports county ban on tourists at lodging facilities

During an emergency meeting Friday, the Crescent City City Council supported the county health officer's ban on tourists staying in local lodging facilities during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The city council's resolution of support came just after Del Norte County Public Health Officer Dr. Warren Rehwaldt issued his order Friday evening, March 27, that includes lodging facilities and campgrounds located both inside and outside Crescent City limits. The council's resolution also gives City Manager Eric Wier "the authority to do all things necessary to educate transient lodging operators, city residents and visitors about the restrictions in place due to the pandemic."

However, support for the resolution was not unanimous.

Councilor Jason Gre-

enough opposed it, looking for a more "measured approach."

"Local businesses are already suffering from the effects of Governor Gavin Newsom's March 19 stay-at-home order," Greenough said. "I am not debating whether this is a serious issue. But at the same time, we still live in a free country here. The fact that these orders are in place isn't going to change that. You can't use police to arrest people because they're out and about. Even the governor's order didn't have the teeth and I don't think, by law, they can have those teeth unless you do go to martial law."

City Attorney Martha Rice explained that violation of the governor's stay-at-home order and Rehwaldt's order is a misdemeanor and that Rehwaldt's order stands regardless of the city's resolution.

Wier added that businesses violating Re-

hwaldt's order could have their business license or city-county permit suspended for up to one year.

Greenough argued that telling a business how to operate is a serious issue. District 1 Supervisor Roger Gitlin, who spoke during the public comment period, echoed Greenough's concern.

Gitlin said he has received a steady stream of phone calls from the community about the virus.

"Despite the medical emergency, tourism is how Del Norte County maintains its sustenance and existence," Gitlin said.

He asked the council to consider the community's economic future before making their decision, adding that limiting tourism would cause more harm than the virus.

"If we move forward in an aggressive way in discouraging people, are we not contributing to our own economic suicide?" Gitlin asked. "The Trees

of Mystery have laid off 45 employees and stores are being closed left and right. I am very concerned about this disease, but at the same time I don't want to wake up and in 30 days from now we don't have a tax base in our town."

Mayor Pro Tem Heidi Kime said she welcomes people who are traveling to the community to work at the hospital or in another essential capacity but health officials couldn't curb the virus unless people shelter-in-place.

"I think that moving forward, we are collecting data on the impact that this is having to our businesses. But if we don't protect ourselves and stay home, we really aren't going to have any businesses to come back to," Kime said.

Businesses were encouraged to take an economic injury survey by Prepare Del Norte online at www.preparedelnorte.com.

Property tax payments still due April 10

The Del Norte County Tax Collector's Office reminds taxpayers that the second installment of the 2019-20 property taxes is still due by April 10 and has not been extended during the COVID-19 pandemic.

As of March 25, the Tax Collector's Office will be closed to the public for over-the-counter tax payments.

"The health and safety of our citizens and employees is my primary concern during this COVID-19 crisis. As such, I am asking all taxpayers to make their

tax payment by mail, online or by phone if possible," Barbara Lopez Del Norte County Tax Collector wrote on the county website.

Lopez said the Tax Collector has no legal authority to extend the due date. However, a penalty waiver process after April 10 may be available to those who are directly impacted either physically or financially by the COVID-19 crisis and who are unable to pay timely.

You can make your payment electronically via E-Check and

Credit Card online at www.co.del-norte.ca.us/departments/treasurer-taxcollector or by calling 1-866-477-2399.

Lopez notes there is a third-party processing fee of \$1.25 for E-Checks and 2.25% for credit/debit card payments (minimum fee of \$1.95).

If you need assistance making an electronic payment, contact the tax collector's office. Additionally, you can make your payment by sending a check, money order or cashier's check through the mail.

long history as a session musician, said the trio performed a lot together over the Christmas break, learning classic rock cover songs.

“We all got stuck at home. It hit us hard, so we recorded ‘All You Need is love,’” he said.

The original plan was to just post it to their Facebook page as is, then they decided to take it a step further and reach out to friends. They sent out a recording via Spotify, asked everyone to listen and record themselves singing along, then send it back. Fletcher estimates he got about 25 participants to contribute, including Del Norte High School band director Dan Sedgwick, his brother

and an intern contributing a horn section.

“I asked him, ‘Hey could you do something special?’ I was kind of shocked they sent eight clips to choose from,” Fletcher said.

He figures it took about 15 hours to edit together the two-minute video.

“I thought it was kind of crazy. I thought we’d get 500 views or so, didn’t expect that much,” Fletcher said.

Weekend Sons continues to jam an hour or so daily during the school closures and Fletcher said they’re not done recording.

“We’re going to keep truckin’, practicing original songs and covers. My goal is to teach my sons the process of releasing songs and how to promote them,” Fletcher said.

DMV allows customers to avoid coming to a DMV office for 60 days

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) asked California law enforcement to exercise discretion for 60 days in their enforcement of driver’s license and vehicle registration expiration dates beginning March 16.

The DMV is taking this action so that at-risk populations, including seniors and those with underlying health conditions, can avoid required visits to DMV field offices for driver’s license or vehicle registration renewals.

This 60-day period for driver’s license and vehicle registrations is intended to protect the health and safety of DMV customers who would otherwise have to come to a DMV office to take care of business, but are concerned during this coronavirus pandemic.

Those transactions that require a DMV office visit include a new driver’s license, duplicate driver’s license, some driver’s license renewals, new license plates, complex vehicle registrations or title transfers and off-highway permits.

Those Californians who will benefit from this action include the elderly, those with compromised immune systems and those who are ill.

Transactions that fall within this action include driver license renewals for those:

- 70 years of age and older, who are required to take a knowledge test
- Individuals who are required to renew in the office (last DMV visit was 15 years prior)

- Individuals subject to vision testing
- Individuals with a complex driving history

The 60-day period also applies to vehicle registration renewals for customers who are not eligible to use an alternative service channel because of the following reasons:

- Outdated insurance information
- Registration expired for 90 days or more
- Smog issues
- Recent transfer

Dozens of DMV tasks can be taken care of through other channels including online, through the mail, through the 365 kiosks statewide or in our business partner locations.

offices and the only access for the public is to call in advance or meet at the door with physical items. To keep the lines of communication open during the social distancing guidelines, Ryan Bahten, DNUSD's Director of Information Network Services, said the district can host up to 100 meetings via the Zoom video conferencing program simultaneously. She said this includes staff meetings, teacher interactions with students and the school board meeting itself. Harris also said the school district is working to set up childcare for residents who are first-responders, healthcare workers or other employees considered essential during the pandemic. "At this point, there are between 180 and 200 students who may need some sort of childcare because

we're a government-heavy community," he said. "Our families work as first-responders. They're healthcare workers, essential workers and that includes our staff." Harris said they are going to operate these childcare services at Mary Peacock and Pine Grove elementary schools, due to their proximity to local healthcare facilities. They will be limited to no more than 10 students per room to comply with social distancing guidelines, he said. Two employees will also be in the room with the students. "We have some of the best people in the state of California who do after school programs," Harris said. "We also have substitute teachers out there who cannot work in Oregon and cannot work in California and they're not getting paid like our employees are." steps Sutter Coast Hospital is taking to help reduce the potential spread of COVID-19.

First, the hospital has issued restrictions on who may visit its patients to include only those visiting end-of-life or obstetrical patients or whose children are already in the hospital. Other visitors will not be allowed, Hanna said.

He added as of Friday morning, the hospital is monitoring staff temperatures and sending anyone home with a fever of more than 100 degrees.

Hanna said Sutter Coast Hospital has just 49-beds and they are planning for the worst while being fortunate to not have seen any COVID-19 cases yet.

"The surge plan plans for an additional 20 beds in the event we should need those," Hanna said. "Our triage tent is in anticipation of a surge. Hopefully, that

will not come, but we'll be prepared if it does."

The tent will be deployed in the case of an overwhelmed emergency room, where COVID-19 patients will be kept, outside, until it is confirmed that they should be hospitalized or if their illness can be managed through self-care at home, Hanna explained.

He directed residents who think they have COVID-19 to call the hospital's RN Advice Triage Line at 866-961-2889.

"When patients call that number, they will be speaking with a registered nurse who will provide them with information on the appropriate level of care given their symptoms," Hanna said. "In some cases, that may just be how to manage symptoms at home. In other cases, we'll be directing them to the appropriate level of care within the community."

He added that Sutter Coast should have as of Monday, March 30, the ability to administer COVID-19 tests with fairly quick turnaround times.






