Reading, writing – and breakfast

All of the students at Mary Peacock Elementary School this year will have breakfasts in their individual classrooms, instead of in a schoolwide cafeteria. Because of the Community Eligibility Provision program, the students at Mary Peacock have had free breakfast provided to them for the past few years. This year, the school will take

that a step further and deliver the food in insulated bags to each classroom, where the students will eat their breakfast in small-group comfort. The breakfast in the classroom concept reportedly is spreading throughout U.S. schools, as research from national food organizations touts its benefits. It came to Del Norte County last year when two classrooms at Mary Peacock Elementary piloted the program.

“Nationwide, educators are realizing the importance of making sure that kids have access to food, good-quality food at the beginning of the day,” said fifth-grade teacher Paige Thompson. Thompson had heard of breakfast in the classroom’s popularity, and last year approached Principal Lara Hirt to propose implementing the idea. Hirt readily agreed. First-grade teacher Lisa Sedgwick also was

interested. Since she and Thomson have “buddy” classrooms, it only made sense for the two teachers to pilot the program together. Throughout last year, they saw numerous benefits as a result: children had a better attention span, they didn’t interrupt class as often, and more students participated in the free breakfast plan. “When I saw that my entire class was eating breakfast in my room,

and now all of a sudden their focus is right there, they’re ready to learn come 8:15, they’re able to get their work done... I was like, this is clearly what is helping my kids be more successful in school,” Sedgwick said. They saw particular improvement with students prone to being distracted easily, and those who have difficulty dealing with loud or

Officers chase RV through 2 states

An Oregon man faces criminal charges after investigators said he led them on a two-state, high-speed pursuit that began near Port Orford and ended in Crescent City. According to the Oregon State Police, the incident began about 6:15 p.m. Sept. 5, along U.S. Highway 101 near Humboldt State Park, when law-enforcement officers encountered a woman apparently in distress. A male operating a motorhome left that scene traveling southbound as the female was being offered assistance. The motorhome later was seen on Highway 101 near Brookings, where officers attempted to stop it for a traffic violation. The large RV refused to yield and was pursued as it fled further south along Highway 101 and into Del Norte County. California Highway Patrol and Del Norte County Sheriff’s Office personnel joined in the chase, but reportedly fell back because of the RV driver’s reckless driving.

Sgt. Edward Wilson, Crescent City’s acting chief of police, said a spike strip was deployed within the city limits that slowed the vehicle somewhat. A Crescent City police officer subsequently attempted to force the RV to the side of the road, then continued the pursuit. Meanwhile, another officer raced ahead to warn motorists that a dangerous pursuit was coming. “One driver was unable to pull away, and the suspect ended up ramming a Tesla from behind,” Wilson said. “The victim was not injured and the car suffered mild to moderate damage.”

The suspect, later described as Danniell John Anderson, 37, of Woodburn, drove down 9th Street in Crescent City to Pebble Beach, then on 5th Street to a dead end, where he attempted to make a U-turn in the 500 block of M Street but became stuck in the sand, Wilson said. Cmdr. Bill Steven of the Del Norte County Sheriff’s Office said that although sheriff’s deputies were involved in the pursuit, Crescent City police officers were given the lead in making the arrest. Anderson was held for suspicion of driving under the influence of drugs, evading police/causing injury, assault with a

Crescent City came alive last week for the three-year anniversary celebration of the Downtown Divas’ First Friday event. The event’s theme was: Disco! Tunes from bands like ABBA and the Miracles reverberated from large speakers throughout Friday evening as participants, many dressed in bell-bot-

tom pants and go-go boots, strolled ... or danced ... from booth to booth. The Downtown Divas is a Crescent City nonprofit committed to seeing the downtown flourish. Composed of five women who own local businesses, the Divas know the struggles that small businesses face and the support needed to thrive. Four ago, Billie Kaye Gavin-Tygart, owner of the 6 Degrees of Celebration shop, founded Downtown Divas. She had grown up in Crescent City and re-

called a once-vibrant downtown scene. But when she returned home after 9/11, it felt like a ghost town to her. “When I moved home, there was nothing downtown. chaotic environments. The smaller crowds eating in the classroom made it easier for those students to have breakfast in peace.

“We still have breakfast every day in school,” said Thompson, “but a lot of kids don’t take advantage of it, because they’re either feeling rushed or they’re feeling anxious because it’s a bigger room with a lot of kids.”

“Being in the classroom, in a smaller setting, is a huge factor in them deciding to take food.”

“It went super well in both classrooms and then the interest really spread,” said Hirt.

“So, I was interested in expanding it and then really pleasantly surprised when most staff members said, ‘Yeah, we really want to do this.’”

With the help of Del Norte County Unified School District’s nutrition services director, Deborah Kravitz, the staff worked on preparing the entire school for participation in 2019-2020.

The first couple weeks of school, they held breakfast in the traditional manner, to let everyone prepare for the year. But this Monday morning, they implemented breakfast in the classroom schoolwide.

Students ate their cereal while teachers made announcements and prepared for the day. “I think it’s easier than having breakfast in the lunchroom. It’s definitely quieter,” said fifth-grader Marlina Thompson.

Her friend and fellow fifth-grader, Tessa Bigham, added, “It’s more fun, because then it’s easier to sit by your friends.”

Steppenwolf Revisted will feature different lineup, same classic songs

Count on the spirit living on when Steppenwolf Revisited comes to perform at the Elk Valley Casino in Crescent City on Sept. 14.

There’s been one version or another of Steppenwolf touring for the past 50 years. Due to a bitter split among band members, lead singer John Kay kept legal ownership of the group’s name and toured until his retirement last year, appearing as John Kay and Steppenwolf.

A rotating lineup of the other founding members toured using some form of the Steppenwolf name. The latest lineup is headed by a longtime associate of the band, guitarist Glen Bui, who is bringing the “Born to be Wild Tour 2018-19” south from his home base of Seattle.

Founding Steppenwolf keyboardist Goldy McJohn was touring with Bui until McJohn’s death in 2017. “I was in a band way, way, way back in the day (called) Pegasus,” Bui said. “We were okay, having fun, with some limited success. Then I ran into Goldy in a music store in L.A. He was touring in a version of Steppenwolf, due to the license agreement, with Jerry

Emondton, and I got to play with them.”

That New Steppenwolf didn’t last, but with signature hits like “Born to be Wild” and “Magic Carpet Ride,” the sound did. Fans clamored for virtually any version of the band.

Bui got the opportunity to reunite with McJohn a few years back when they crossed paths again in the Pacific Northwest. “I ran into Goldy at an Alan White record-release party,” Bui said, of the founding member of Yes. “He said, ‘Let’s play again.’ We put together the ‘Born to be Wild Tour.’”

In addition to Bui on guitar, the current lineup features:

- Bryan Knapp on drums, from the “Born to Be Wild Tour” and Iron Butterfly
- Armond Blackwater on keyboards/bass, from Steppenwolf 1977/78, Barry White, Oris Day, Ricky Nelson and “Born to Be Wild Tour”
- Dillon Smith on vocals from “Born to Be Wild Tour,” Dillon Cash Band/Johnny Cash Tribute
- Traci Bland on backup vocals.

Regardless of which lineup Bui takes with him, “It’s about the music, not about egos. Keeping the music alive is worth it more than anything else, putting a smile on faces,” Bui said.

For example, their lineup once was invited to a Gresham, Oregon rodeo, where the manager was a huge fan of Steppenwolf. It was an intimate crowd, to say the least.

“We played in front of the fair staff,” said Bui. “All cowboys, six people who worked for the fair and the manager. They had a little-kid break dancing to ‘Magic Carpet Ride.’”

Fans at the Elk Valley Casino can expect a 90-minute to two-hour show. “We’ll play the main Steppenwolf songs the fans really, really know,” said Bui, “plus we’ll play whatever the audience wants - ‘Rock Me,’ ‘Never Too Late,’ ‘Sookie Sookie,’ a few standards and covers, some original stuff.”

“But it’s always really fun. We like to jam. We’re very good at keepin’ on goin’ and jammin’.”

Puente, Stamm celebrating their debuts in the ring with Warrior MMA club

Two Crescent City boxers made their debuts in the squared circle Aug. 24 and left a big impression on the competition.

Representing Crescent City’s Warrior MMA were Chris Puente and Bailly Stamm, appearing at the Spartan Fighting the Good Fight Second-Annual Boxing Event in the Medford (Oregon) Armory.

Six boxing associations entered 48 fighters in 24 fights.

Technically, this was Stamm’s second scheduled fight, but his opponent was a no-show at the previous event. Fighting at 151 pounds, the 19-year-old welterweight put on a show for the crowd of more than 200, earning a unanimous decision in the three-round bout and fight-of-the-night honors.

“In the third round alone, we counted 30 straight left-hand jabs he landed right to the guy’s nose,” said Warrior MMA boxing coach Pete Blancarte. “He looked good, had good footwork.”

“Once he found something that worked, he stuck right with it. Definitely earned fight-of-the-night.”

Puente, his coaches agreed, also could have earned fight-of-the-night honors. The 23-year-old made his debut in the ring at 191 pounds, as a light heavyweight.

Puente’s endless body shots exhausted his opponent, who was unable

to answer the bell for the third round, which gave Puente the win by technical knockout.

“I had no real goal going in, just hoping to come out with a ‘W,’” Puente said. Was he surprised with result? “Nah.”

His coach, Bryan Sargent, knew Puente’s strength going into the fight. “I was sparring with Chris, and his opponent was built like I am. So, I told him to fight him like he was fighting me.”

“I had to quit with him. I had to yell, ‘Stop! Stop!’ Luckily, he did with me,” Sargent said. “I told him to make this guy quit like I did.”

“I think that’s why Chris didn’t get fight-of-the night, because his match finished early and Stamm’s went all three rounds.”

Blancarte said he wasn’t surprised with Stamm’s and Puente’s success in their debuts. “Once our fighters go and fight, we

leave a lasting memory. We set the tone, as USA boxing coaches.

“First thing is to put them in there. We make sure they’re trained well and conditioned well,” he said.

Warrior MMA’s participation in the regional boxing season normally begins in March, with the last fights of the year in November.

Located at 2655 Lake Earl Dr., Warrior MMA also offers a boxing conditioning program. The boxing program is on Tuesday and Thursday nights from 6:30-8:30.

deadly weapon, hit and run, and using or under the influence of a controlled substance.

Anderson was booked in the Crescent City Jail and held on \$75,000 bail.

“It was a pretty unusual pursuit,” Wilson said. “Most people don’t try to flee in motorhomes.

“He was driving pretty recklessly. That’s why we backed off the initial pursuit,” said Wilson. “But once he hit the spike strips, it was mostly a slower pursuit through the city.”

Investigators identified the female victim encountered in Oregon as Jessica Lynn Cannon, 34. Her address was not listed in the Oregon State Police report, although it did say she was the owner of the RV.

er, she wanted Crescent City to feel alive again. So in 2015, she created a small get-together for women only called Wine and Whine Wednesday, and invited other local business owners to attend.

They met once a month - and the same women kept returning. All shared a similar goal for the downtown.

"We just chatted and talked and daydreamed about what downtown could be and what we were missing, and life and all of those things, and then we decided to have another (meeting) the next month," Gavin-Tygart said.

But she didn't want just to talk about downtown. She wanted to do something about it. So Gavin-Tygart began working on making the group a nonprofit organization.

"We got approved (as a nonprofit) in four months, so we were off and running," she said. "It was scary, because it meant we were on to something and that we had work to do"

The first thing they did was ask the City Council for the Wednesday downtown farmer's market, which was in danger of having no host. Then they came up with the idea of First Friday celebrations, inviting vendors and local businesses to participate in a block party of sorts on the first Friday of each month.

"We all have very, very different personalities and backgrounds, but we're all so committed to downtown and this mission," Gavin-Tygart said.

Tourists and residents alike can stroll through the streets of downtown Crescent City, stop into the businesses that have stayed open later, and visit booths of handmade clothing, homemade desserts, and

locally brewed beer. Local artists, authors and teachers host booths to promote their work.

"That's the whole idea about community spirit, isn't it? Everybody should pitch in and try to make things easier for everyone else. Particularly if it's for the betterment of the entire community," said Doug Plack.

"It's nice to see more and more businesses involved in (First Fridays). This is the way it should be. I like to see it expanded."

Companies without a storefront appreciate the opportunity to participate in both the First Friday events and the Wednesday downtown farmers market. "We've done really good here," said Joe Pearcey, an owner of the Sticks and Scones treats booth.

First Fridays also serve as a fundraiser for the Divas, an all-volunteer group. The funds go towards projects to enhance the downtown. Last Friday, the money was earmarked for public restrooms to be installed downtown by the end of the year.

Ideally, Gavin-Tygart said, she'd like to see more restaurants downtown. If there were more food options, more

visitors would come and then proceed to shop in the local shops.

Her passion for downtown Crescent City is unabated after four years. "We want to see downtown survive because in many towns, they're not. So that was our number-one (goal)," Gavin-Tygart said. "I just think it's really important that we look outside of the box and think about things that can happen to make Crescent City successful."

provided children with resources to prepare for school and to gain a love for literacy.

It has not been in operation since 2017, but now is back this month.

“Really, what it was designed for was to introduce children for love for reading introduce how to properly facilitate literacy circle time, and then it goes beyond that,” said Executive director of Del Norte Child Care Council Melodee Mitchell.

Mitchell still remembers when the bus first came down the streets of Crescent City when she was a brand new employee. She and former executive director of First 5 Del Norte Patty Vernelson stood outside and watched with anticipation as it pulled up.

“I mean, it was like this book mobile, this mobile literacy library was coming to Del Norte County. It was so unique there wasn’t anything like that here,” Mitchell said.

A small cohort wrote the grant to bring the Wonder Bus to Del Norte County in 2001. The grant paid for the bus purchase, the inside renovation, and sixth months of operation. After that first six months it took the whole community to keep the bus in action.

The bus had contributing partners throughout the community who donated funds to keep the bus running, including the library, Del Norte Child Care Council and the City of Crescent City. Throughout the years it changed ownership from the library to the First 5 Del Norte, while Del Norte Child Care Council ran the programming on the bus.

It served the community well for 16 years, bringing a library to smaller towns all over Del Norte County that did not have a library building, but two years ago, they did not know if the bus would run again.

“When the decision for this to possibly be taken off the road or to change... it just brought me to tears. I was like we have to keep this bus on the road,” Mitchell said.

First 5 employees did not think they could keep the bus in operation with its constant need for repairs. Mitchell, Vernelson, current First 5 executive director Angela Glore, among others, created a subcommittee that met for 18 months to decide the future of the Wonder Bus.

In that time, the bus ownership transferred to Mitchell and the Del Norte County Child Care Council, since the programming already came from the council. Mitchell worked diligently to find additional sources of funding and new partners to invest in the future of the bus.

The bus could not run on its own. It takes commitment from local companies such as the Del Norte County Office of Education, Mor-Jon Inc. and Wild Rivers Community Foundation among others are investing in its success.

“The unique thing about the wonder bus is that it really is a community collaboration,” Mitchell said.

With much help, the bus is in working condition and receiving a brand new paint job. The details are getting finalized, and it is set to return to operation in the coming weeks.

“All I can say is when it goes back out on the

road and you watch the faces of toddlers, it’s so touching because they’re just thrilled. They’re so excited to see the bus to be on the bus,” said Vernelson. “I mean, kids cry when they leave.”

In this next phase of the bus, it will have two AmeriCorps workers running children’s programs and providing resources for parents and will have regular scheduled stops throughout the county each week. Perhaps the most exciting development is that an anonymous donor has ensured that every child who goes on the bus will leave with a free book, no strings attached.

“I’m just excited I think it’s gonna I think kids are gonna be really thrilled,” Vernelson said.

Families will be able to access many resources to prepare their children for school and will also have the ability to sign up for a library membership card on the bus.

Those who have invested their heart and energy into the bus cannot wait to see it continue operation. They are confident it will continue to bring Del Norte County residents joy and a magical love for learning.

An art show from the heart

DEE-NI'

The Tolowa Dee-Ni' Nation celebrated its "Dee-Ni' Day" in Smith River on Sept. 7. And after 14 years now, the organizers know what works and draws visitors.

"We don't really add anything new, so much as stay with the tried-and-true events," said Andromeda Lopez, an Office of Self Governance Program analyst for the Tolowa Dee-Ni'.

"The key difference this year is beefing up the main attractions."

For example, in the past, "Dee-Ni' Day" provided only samples from its traditional salmon bake. This year, salmon filets were offered for sale as part of a full meal. Lopez said that proved a popular decision. Some 150 servings sold out by noon.

For Frank Ault, on his second year of baking the salmon, the festival's attraction is simple. "Everything is better on a stick," he said.

Veteran cook Armando Lopez returned to prepare the salmon for his 10th year. He said 300 pounds of whole salmon were purchased for the event. His day began at 6 a.m. by preparing the fire pit using red wood, which stays heavy and

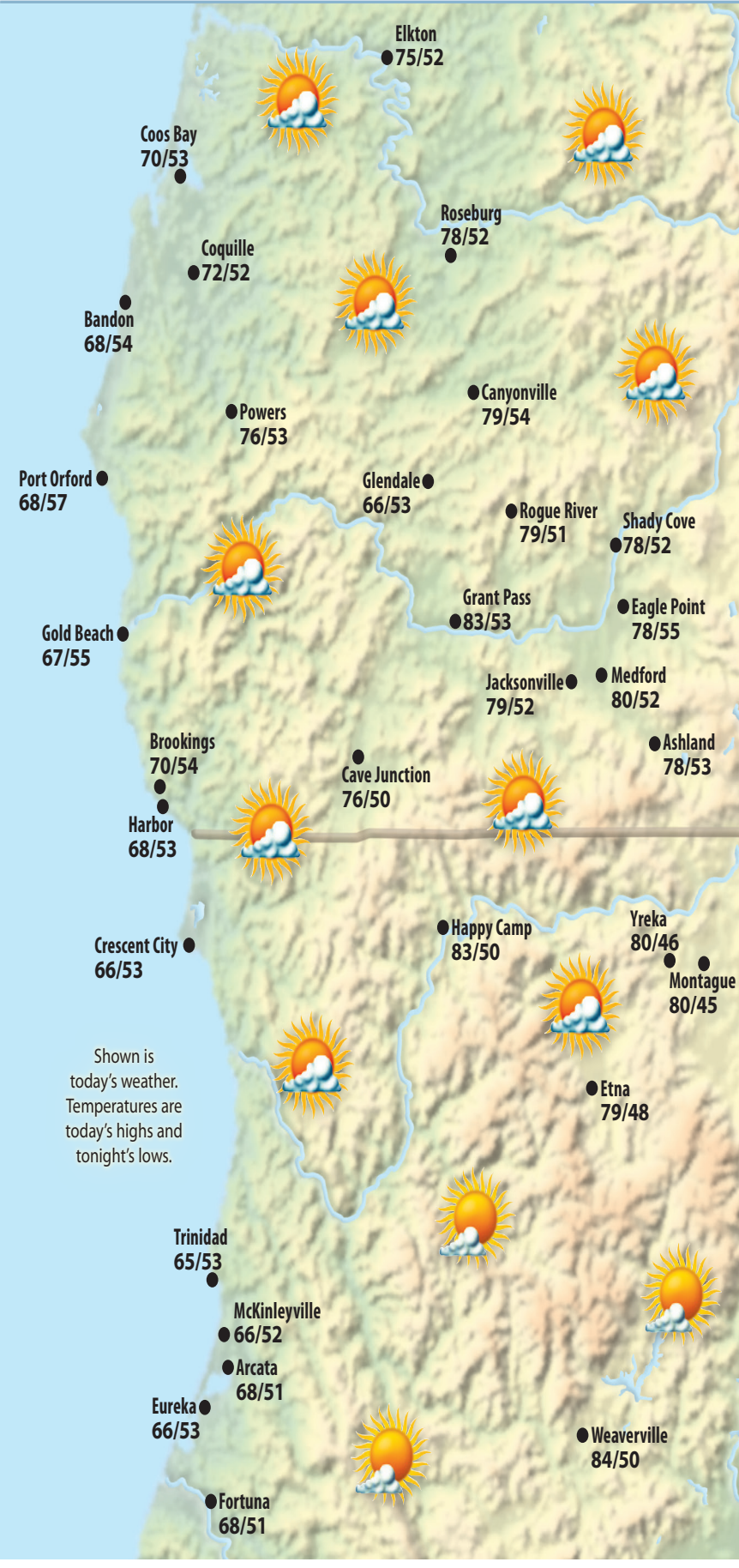

wet and burns longer at a lower temperature, ideal for rotating the salmon in and out.

Two filets are skewered per stick, skin-side to the flames, helping heat the filet enough to adhere to the stick. Although not all of the filets stay attached. "You've always got to lose one or two to the fire," Lopez said. "It's good luck."

The filets are rotated after 20 minutes, again at another 10 minutes, then every three minutes until done, Lopez said.

Attending a fire of her

own was Nieca Wright, baking sand bread. She mixed up simple ingredients of flower, water, salt and baking powder to craft a traditional flat bread. She said the bread isn't actually baked in sand. Rather, it's buried under hot rocks and pebbles heated by flaming wood.

After a few minutes, she uncovers the bread, making a perfect accompaniment to the baked salmon. "Everybody loves sand bread," Wright confided.

Another event seeing a revival was the traditional gambling game Ch'ut-lh-xut, or shell dice game. Cynthia Ford ran the women's gambling tournaments

and explained the rules:

The game involves shaking two sets of concave shells, one large and one small. If a set matches facing up or down, the roller celebrates with a cheer, "Waa-Chuu-Ti," and gets one point and a pick-up stick. The team with all of the sticks, or the most as time expires, wins.

Ford said that about six years ago, the tribe hosted a workshop to reintroduce the game to the next generation. "At the workshop, the women made dice and revived the game. Now, young kids are playing," she said.

She added that the men's version of the game in-

volves playing drums and singing during each toss of the shells.

The traditional events were rounded out by stick games, this year played down on the beach.

"Dee-Ni' Day" included non-traditional Indian events as well, Lopez said, to draw in more community participation. Those included making fresh cider from a press, and a popular horseshoe tournament that attracts eight to 10 teams every year.

Lopez said the event can draw about 200 visitors each year.

It appears your husband is playing mind games with you. And I'm also concerned about how this volatility is affecting your children. If something isn't done about it, it will destroy your marriage.

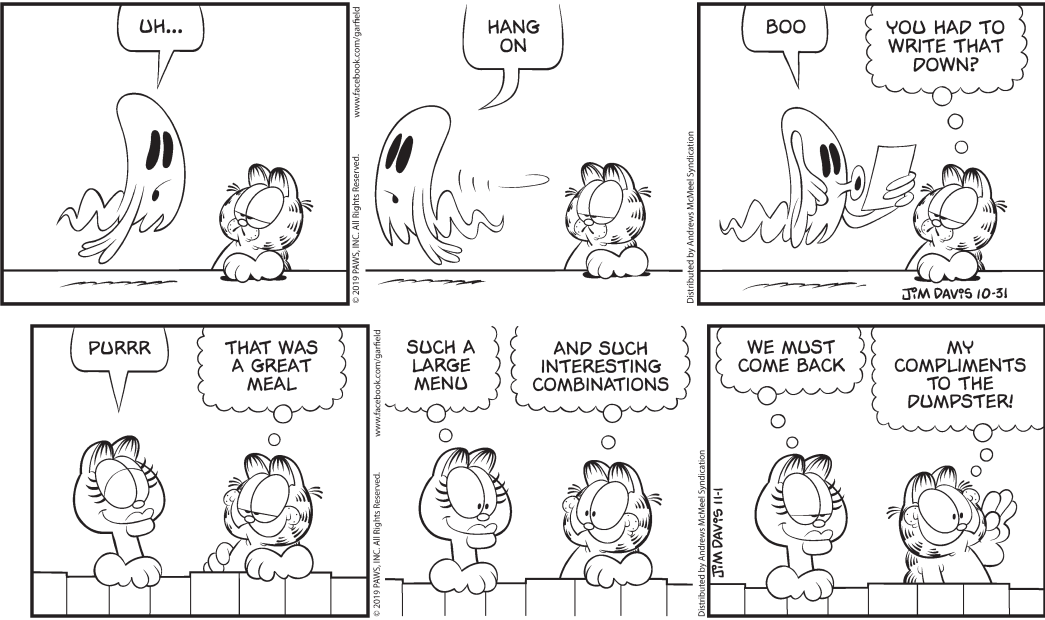
