



# Supervisors Seek Scapegoat in Airport Operations Failures

The Board of Supervisors meandered into muddy waters en route to funding three Airport improvement projects mandated for completion. The Auditor/Controller rushed to remedy the confusion at last week's meeting.

The Border Coast Regional Airport Authority (BCRAA) Is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) which operates the Del Norte Regional Airport. Its members include: two members from the Board of Supervisors, two members from the Crescent City Council, one member from the Brookings City Council, one member from the Curry County Board of Commissioners and one member at-large from the Del Norte County public, one member from the Elk Valley Rancheria and one member from

the Tollowa di-Nee Tribe.

**Here are the projects BCRAA is working on:**

- Runway 18-36 project improvements between \$7-8 million.
- The acquisition of the ARFF safety firetruck, \$385,000 plus \$100,000 in extra equipment.
- Critically needed and mandated fencing, exceeding \$900,000 to keep elk and other animals off the Airport grounds circumnavigating Jack McNamara Field.

Solutions were as clear as mud.

Rather than admit ignorance, and led by Supervisor Chris Howard, the 3rd District supervisor and Border Coast Regional Airport Authority member's (BCRAA), fingers did get point-

# Big Win for Harbor...Ice Plant Re-Opens

The Harbor District August 27 meeting was a mix of celebration and sobering reality. After a year of uncertainty, the Harbor's ice plant has come back to life, with Ocean Gold Seafoods stepping in to restart operations.

Instead of relying on a taxpayer bailout, Harbor staff pursued a market-based solution. Harbormaster Mike Rademaker negotiated an agreement requiring the reopening of the ice plant as a condition of awarding a hoist lease, creating a framework to restore the service without taxpayer expense.

Commercial fisherman have long struggled with the headache and expense of trucking ice from other ports. The reopening is a game changer. The plant quickly sold 50 tons in a matter of a few days. Rademaker reports the price remained steady at \$140 per ton, the same rate charged when the plan closed last year.

Commissioner praised the outcome. "This is just great news," said Harbor Chairman Gerhard Weber. Commissioners John Evans and Rick Shepherd concurred.

Black cod and shrimp boats were already taking advantage of the supply.

The expectation is the ice plant will provide a major boost to fishing operations and reduce barriers for smaller vessels that rely on affordable ice.

Rademaker gleamed when he remarked the

accomplishment as "a major win" heading into the crab season.

Tough news also was disclosed following last month's tsunami.

A survey by the Army Corps of Engineers revealed about 20,000 cubic yards of silt deposited in the federal channel, may result in costs estimated about \$3 million. The sobering cost triples the \$1million cost originally projected. Those expenses will be born by Washington, DC but does not bode well for debris spread across the non-federal waters.

Last week, H Dock was successfully refloated. Special appreciation is recognized for Commissioner Shepherd for the use of his vessel in re-attaching H Dock.

**Lots of new ideas were shared at last month's meeting.**

- Introduction of a simple, low cost system to assist fishermen market their catches to the public.
- On the financial side, staff reported the harbor is on track for a balanced budget.
- Insurance premiums remain vexingly high.
- Tsunami-related damages remain largely unknown until divers inspect all docks.

"It's going to be up and down for while but I'm confident if Commissioners work together, this community asset will not just survive but flourish," said the harbormaster.

# Temporary Closure of Several Streets Extended

Public Demands Action on Illegal Squatting

Supervisors kicked the can down the road when they unanimously voted to extend the temporary closure of portions of several streets plagued by unlawful occupation, blight creation and various other unlawful acts.

The streets, or portions of, are Union St., Broadway St., National Blvd., and Madison Ave, using a combination of gates and K rail.

The previous extension expired August 27, 2025.

The new closure ban hopes to address ongoing illegal dumping and serious, continual criminal and drug activity.

Though mitigation has been virtually non-existent allowing conditions to worsen, nothing has improved, irking the public's outrage and demand for action.

The California Vehicle Code (CVC) authorizes local jurisdictions to temporally close high-

ways when certain conditions are met and a public hearing is held. Those conditions are:

- Serious and continual criminal activity exists.
- The highway is not designated as a through highway or arterial street.
- Vehicular or pedestrian traffic contributes to the criminal activity.

The closure will not substantially, adversely affect traffic flow, public safety or surrounding neighbors, and operations of emergency vehicles.

With the passage of this resolution, Community Development (CDD) will be allocated \$50,000 toward Code Enforcement. The County is presently seeking a third Code Enforcement Officer.

Over the next 18 months, the County's emergency shelter is expected to be completed and the shelter hopes to address housing needs for those illegally occupying these properties impacted by illegal squatters.

## Supervisor Howard says He Didn’t Know, Blames Airport Director

During a recent Board of Supervisors meeting, August 26th, the public was greeted with yet another financial failure on the part of our government-run local airport. The Border Coast Regional Airport Authority (BCRAA), cannot pay its bills.

Seems, at least according to our county representative, Supervisor Howard, the airport’s recently departed director failed to keep the BCRAA board members apprised of its inability to pay for the portion of a recently-completed project on one of the airport’s runways. The BCRAA has now come hat in hand to ask the county for a line of credit to complete three of the airport’s primary list of major improvements required by the Federal Aviation Agency, (FAA), runway resurfacing and lighting, perimeter safety fencing, and the purchase of a new fire fighting vehicle.

The fact the airport is in dire straits financially should be a surprise to no one. The fact the airport has been unable to keep up with FAA requirements also no surprise. The process of paying for those improvements, including the 5% match, has not changed for decades. So how is it Supervisor Howard can claim he didn’t know?

The reality is the BCRAA’s board has blundered the airport into near insolvency over the past decade or more with a series of stupid decisions. An airport terminal before addressing issues with commercial air traffic, chasing more than half of the revenue from the airport to other nearby airports. Travelers who utilized Del Norte County’s Jack MacNamara Airport on a regular basis decamped to Medford or Arcata to find destinations more suitable for domestic or international travel in San Francisco or Los Angeles.

Clearly the BCRAA board fascinated by the prospect of the new 20-million-dollar airport terminal forgot to take into consideration the loss of Sky West, affiliated with United and the three flights a day, two to San Francisco and one to Sacramento. Four succeeding air carriers later, none managing much success as passenger numbers plummeted, never reaching 10,000 for the past decade. The loss of revenue considerable. Inability for some time to pay for basic operations, and the idea the cost of a major project with payment up front before reimbursement is supposed to be a surprise to the BCRAA’s board?

It goes without exception, the geniuses on the BCRAA board should look in the mirror before casting blame on the recently departed airport director, who inherited the financial mess from lazy short-sighted decisions made by the board years before. Supervisor Howard, an apology is in order!

Unfortunately, the airport’s problems have only just begun. With no improved income producing resolution for the airport, its future looks pretty bleak. Other imperative very expensive infrastructure projects are on the horizon. The other runway needs resurfacing and lighting, \$8 million, the two taxiways resurfaced, \$5 million each, a new fuel farm, cost unknown but likely in the millions, then the six-year-old terminal is falling apart. Litigation to recover the ongoing costs of maintaining the crumbling terminal, inability of the airport to cover operational cost, and no way to pay for upfront new project costs as well as cover the 5% match for each project is clearly beyond the airports current ability to fund.

Even if the regional partners of the BCRAA were to be asked for financial assistance it is unlikely to be sufficient

to cover the airports needs for the long term or come in sufficient amounts. The solution for the airport’s problems came and went a decade ago and is unlikely to penetrate the finger pointing shifting of responsibility of board members of the Chris Howard, Darrin Short mode.

Problems with various boards throughout the county and their abilities not up to understanding what needs to be accomplished have led to an abundance of poor decision making. The BCRAA is not alone. We as a county must do better when it comes to electing our leaders. The loss of the services of an airport may not appear to affect the entire county but it most certainly does. Until the current BCRAA board members “get over” this distasteful finger wagging the airport’s situation will not improve. A line of credit extended to the airport is only a temporary and limited fix, unlikely to change anything.

The board could attempt to find a way to lengthen the runway to accommodate a regional carrier if possible and restore previously attained enplanement levels. More income to fund infrastructure projects. What a concept.

## Setting the Record Straight on Airport Finances

At the August 26 meeting of the Del Norte County Board of Supervisors, several comments were made about the Border Coast Regional Airport Authority (BCRAA) and my role as Airport Director. Some remarks placed blame for the current cash flow issues solely on me. I write not to argue, but to clarify the facts for the community.

Inherited Projects and Conditions

When I became Director in November 2021, several major projects were already underway. My predecessor secured the Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) vehicle grant, and the rehabilitation of Runway 18-36 was already in design with grants for both preliminary and final phases. My job was to complete design and apply for construction funding. I also secured the 5% local match—about \$500,000—through joint contributions from all BCRAA members.

Unlike my predecessor, I did not benefit from COVID-era CARES Act funding or fully funded federal grants. All projects during my tenure required a local match and full upfront payment before reimbursement—a major financial shift.

I also inherited legal issues that, with Board and legal counsel approval, required litigation. While specifics remain confidential under the Brown Act, the costs were not of my making but added significant strain to the budget.

In the last year and a half of my tenure, I was urged to add larger projects to the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP). Though cautious given cash flow limits, I advanced them under Board guidance. My early years had focused on smaller, calculated projects with less impact on the budget, showing that the move toward larger, more expensive projects was a collective decision made with full awareness of financial constraints.

FAA and DOT Funding Realities

FAA and DOT funding is reimbursement-based:

- FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP) reimburses 95% only after invoices are fully paid.
- Alternate Essential Air Service (AEAS) requires the airport to first pay monthly airline invoices of \$250,000–\$350,000, then wait 30–60 days for reimbursement.

Before my tenure, payment and reimbursement could be submitted almost simultaneously. After I began, the DOT required proof that payments had cleared before reimbursement—delaying cash flow. This procedural change, known to the Authority, created new strain.

Such structures create predictable gaps common at small airports. In 2024, “gap funding” was discussed but financing costs kept it from moving forward. County support was raised but never implemented during my tenure. These were systemic challenges, not individual mismanagement.

Clarifying the Terminal Loan

Confusion also exists around the terminal loan. BCRAA was never obligated to make annual payments unless specific revenues—fuel taxes (diverted by California) or outside contributions—were received. Those never materialized.

Repayment decisions were made by the Board, not the Director. I recommended against using scarce general funds when revenues weren’t available. My predecessor chose differently, but under the agreement, if BCRAA couldn’t pay, the obligation shifted to Del Norte County without putting the Authority in default. The loan agreement was never designed for general fund payments. That safeguard was key to the success of the JPA and the airport.

Oversight and Transparency

Every ACIP project was reviewed and approved by the Board. Budgets were openly submitted and adopted.

We all understood invoices required full payment before reimbursement. What wasn’t foreseen was the scale and timing

of runway construction invoices. Internally, weekly billing was discussed, which would have kept payments manageable. Instead, after my departure, the contractor submitted large multi-million-dollar invoices at once, creating the cash flow crisis.

I accept responsibility for not anticipating this, but it was a shared oversight between myself, staff, and the Board. Cash shortages were regularly discussed with the Auditor-Controller and were a known part of operating under a reimbursement model.

Investing in People and Mandates

As Director, I focused on federally mandated projects and staff retention. High turnover costs made investment in employees critical. Safety-related infrastructure—fencing, runway work—was non-negotiable for compliance.

Misplaced Blame

It is inaccurate to claim today’s financial issues result from one person. These challenges are structural, tied to federal models and the high costs of operating a rural airport with limited reserves.

Yes, miscalculations occurred with invoice timing. I acknowledge my part, but the problem was not caused by one individual.

The Path Forward

Whatever entity governs it, the airport must meet federal safety standards. The key question is how to fund it sustainably.

I believe the Joint Powers Authority (JPA) remains the best model, ensuring regional engagement and shared responsibility. But Del Norte County, as the airport’s legal owner, must increase its contribution.

The County currently provides \$271,000 annually—an amount set in 2007. Adjusted for inflation, this should be about \$447,000 in 2025. But inflation alone doesn’t capture true cost increases: higher wages, consulting fees, and compliance demands. Updating support would

stabilize operations.

With adequate support, the airport can function as an independent enterprise fund while keeping JPA members engaged. Without it, operations risk falling to bare-minimum maintenance under full County control—a scenario Del Norte cannot afford given its already tight financial constraints.

Even with higher contributions, the County would still spend less under the JPA than if it ran the airport alone. Independent operation would force the County to absorb all expenses—consulting, maintenance, fuel, staffing, and safety projects—without cost-sharing. The JPA reduces that burden, secures federal reimbursements, and spreads costs regionally.

For a small airport with limited administrative staff, strong consultant support is essential. Firms like Lochner build staff assistance into ACIP projects, ensuring year-round help without unexpected invoices. These costs are justified over the five-year consultant period, as they provide the planning expertise and workload relief necessary to keep projects aligned with the airport’s vision and mission. When it came time to secure new five-year consultant services, I ensured a firm was selected that could deliver the needed support without additional overhead costs—a change that will be a major benefit to the Authority.

Final Thoughts

During my tenure, we advanced critical projects, secured local matches, and retained staff—without the federal relief earlier leadership enjoyed.

Blame does not solve structural issues. Honest dialogue, long-term vision, and realistic funding will. That must be the focus—not scapegoating those who took on a role with many built-in challenges to preserve and expand air service for a region hungry for connectivity. I wish nothing but success for the Authority, the region, and the new Director.

ed looking for a scapegoat and Howard found his scapegoat: former Board Coast Regional Airport Authority Director Ryan Cooley, who earned successful employee evaluations each year over his many years tenure with Del Norte.

Auditor Clint Schaad bee lined from his office to Board Chambers and brought clarity to the struggling supervisors who could not seem to find the verbiage to draft a motion to provide short term funding to pay invoices due to strained cash flow.

In a very unprofessional manner, Howard was quick to remind the audience and fellow colleague Supervisors that Cooley was conditionally hired to assume a new airport operations position for Humboldt County. Howard again found his pointing finger advising colleagues Cooley had been dismissed from this new position a mere six weeks into his new position by a consensus of Humboldt County Supervisors who felt he "...was not a good fit," according to Humboldt CAO Elishia Hayes.

Also not reported was the annual \$276,000 paid by the County to BCRAA, since 2007. This payment remained static for decades and not based at any time on the inflationary index. Though not mandated, Cooley made at least two \$100,000 loan payments back to the County.

The Triplicate has contacted each Humboldt supervisor for what appears to look like a bait and switch, hire and fire, by Humboldt supervisors.

To date, no Humboldt supervisor has responded.

Though BCRAA County members Howard and Darrin Short discussed at length over several meetings since 2024, neither Howard nor Short shared their understanding of the precarious cash flow issue in paying these mandated invoices with other supervisors, including Valerie Starkey who exclaimed she was learning about the cash flow conundrum for the first time.

The evidence however backs up Cooley over Howard, Short and Starkey.

According to Ryan Cooley, the previous airport director failed to bring financial concerns to BCRAA or the BOS.

## Claim 1:

Fact: The record shows that financial matters- including the fund balance history, loan obligations and runway rehabilitation contributions- were repeatedly placed before the BCRAA for approval and oversight

- July 3, 2024 the Board explicitly received an update on the BCRAA fund balance over the last five years.

- March 7, 2024 the Board approved advertisement and project documents for the Runway 18-36 rehabilitation and staff presented updates on financial obligations tied to the terminal loan.

- January 3, 2024 the Board approved transmitting the 2025-2029 ACIP to the FAA, a clear record of long-term capital and financing planning

These items were approved in open session by the JPA commissioners, including Howard himself, when present. At no point were these updates hidden from BCRAA members.

## Claim 2.

"The Commission wasn't aware of the runway rehabilitation funding need.

Fact: The Board took action formal multiple actions to designate and allocate funds for runway 18-36.

- June 6, 2024. BCRAA approved creation of dedicated fund balance lines for JPA contributions for the 18-36 project.

- July 3, 2024, the Board approved transferring \$204,000 in JPA contributions into Runway 18-36 designated account

- August 1, 2024. The Board approved another contribution- \$38,500 from Curry County for Runway 18-36.

- September 5, 2024. The Board approved the Engineering Services for 18-36, Phase III Bidding and Construction Services.

These disclosures were NOT minor. They were Resolutions and votes for financial transfers, grant applications and contracts, all on Public Agendas and voted on by the Commis-

sioners.

## Claim 3.

"The Board could have sought outside financing if it had been shopped properly.

Fact: BCRAA member / Supervisor Howard ignores that the commissioners themselves had shared oversight authority and that decisions on financing required Board direction and approvals which were never blocked by the Airport Director.

The most recent ACIP and grant applications were reviewed and approved by the BCRAA Board in February, March and August 2024, respectively.

In Howard's roll as a county supervisor and BCRAA commissioner, it gave him direct access to this information. If he believed alternative financing was necessary, it was his responsibility to raise and pursue that as a commissioner. Howard failed to report this to fellow supervisors.

The failure to bring these discussions to the Board of Supervisors lies directly with Howard and Commissioner Darrin Short, not the Airport Director.

## Claim 4.

"The Previous Director left no cash in the bank."

Fact: Financial updates on the balance were explicitly reported to the BCRAA Board

- The July 3 Agenda specifically included, "Receive update on BCRAA fund balance over the past five years.

- These updates were part of regular financial reporting. Any concerns over dwindling balances should have been acted upon by commissioners at that time. Additionally, comparing the current financial situation to Randy Hooper's tenure is misleading.

1) Federal CARES Act funds artificially inflated balances during Randy Hooper's tenure. Those emergency relief funds were no longer available under new FAA grant guidelines.

2) None of the grants applied for under the current administration- including the Runway 18-36 Rehabilitation ( Pre-Design and Design phases, both requiring 5 percent

match) and the AARF truck acquisition- required large scale local debt drawdown. Instead, the matching funds were budgeted transparently and approved in open session.

3) Under the Hooper-managed tenure, BCRAA drew down Terminal Loan debt proceeds directly into the budget. It was these BCRAA funds payments that were used to pay down terminal loan itself. This maneuver effectively meant that no revenues from the pledged sources outlined in the Terminal Loan agreement such as JPA contributions or State aviation fuel tax reallocations were used for repayment; instead the General BCRAA operating budget was tapped to service that debt, directly affecting BCRAA budget.

Furthermore, during Cooley's first two years as director, he was directed by the BCRAA commission to make a full Loan payment (year one) and at least a partial payment (year two).

## Claim five:

Account and Oversight; Howard himself admits, "It's also the issue of the commissioners, that they do not have oversight on this and I'm (Howard) going to take some fault for that, too."

- That is the core truth. The Airport Director placed financial updates, ACIP approvals, grant requests, fund balance reports and vendor contracts to the BCRAA Board. Commissioner Howard was part of that approval process.

Culpability rests clearing with Howard and Short.

On yet another matter for the last several years, former Supervisor David Finigan sat as the chairman as the at-large member, the public member of BCRAA. By-laws clearly state the at-large member may not serve as chairperson.

The question must be asked what commissioner Finigan knew about finances and cash flow issues on mandated FAA guidelines. Finigan's silence is deafening on mismanagement of the Border Coast Regional Airport Authority.

## Conclusion:

Supervisor Howard's statement is mischaracterization of the record.



- The Airport Director brought forward all major financial updates, ACIP approvals and vendor obligations to the BCRAA Board.
- The Commissioners including Howard had direct oversight and votin authority.
- If there matters were not reported to the super-

visors, that failure rests with Supervisors Howard and Short, not the Airport Director.

The evidence showed this was showed this was shared oversight, transparently managed and documented in public session- not a "massive oversight" by one individual.

# Frito-Lay truck crash-lands at Smith River, driver escapes with minor injuries

GASQUET, Calif. — Drivers traveling along U.S. 199 between Hiouchi and Gasquet should expect delays on Thursday as crews continue investigation work following a crash involving a Frito-Lay delivery truck.

Police said the crash occurred on Wednesday when the truck landed face up on the bank of the Smith River. Authorities reported the driver suffered only minor injuries.

All lanes were reopened as of 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, but intermittent closures with delays of up to 20 minutes were expected throughout Thursday between 10 a.m. and

2 p.m. for investigation. Caltrans said crews would also be performing emergency tree work in the area.

Drivers were urged to plan extra travel time and exercise caution through the work zone.

One year after winning an historic first-ever conference championship in girls soccer, the Del Norte Warriors are hungry to do it again.

This year’s roster features a core group of influ-

ential returning starters, as well as a young contingent of players who benefited tremendously from playing at the JV level a year ago.

In fact, some of the sophomores have been so impressive, they have jumped into the starting varsity lineup and are having an immediate impact.

Among the key returning players whom Eckart expects big things out of are senior defender Teexeeshe Scott and dynamic midfielders Hollyn Wakefield and Aurora Mitchell.

Mitchell was an all-league selection a year ago, while Wakefield was an all-league honorable mention, and both players have hit the ground running this fall.

“They work really well together,” Eckart said of the two team captains.

One of the most impressive performers early in the new season has been junior Avery Ritter, a third team captain who has taken over in goal after the graduation of all-league goalie Deja Payne.

“Avery Ritter is filling the big shoes of Deja Payne,” the coach said of the 5-foot-9 shot-stopper. “She’s been working very hard, she’s very coachable and she’s got the height. Avery Ritter is bringing it for sure.”

In front of her are three starting sophomores in defense, alongside the experienced Scott.

After getting some valuable game time as freshmen JVs a year ago, the talented and hardworking trio of Alex Eckart, Deanna Montanez and Calia Deater all are playing well and look set to anchor the team defense for the next few years.

“Because of all the work they put in last year, they’ve been able to step right in,” the head coach said.

The hard-working trio are among the seven sophomores on the 15-player roster.

Also back from last year is all-league selection

Elisabeth Lopez also netted early in the new season in an impressive 1-0 victory against Fortuna and will play left midfield this fall, with attacking

midfielder Jaden Bennett rounding out a solid Del Norte midfield.

“She has matured and has gotten stronger,” Shawn Eckart said of Bennett. “She’s got a cannon.”

New to the team this year is assistant coach Melaine Alvarado, a former Del Norte player who also played in college.

“She’s brought a lot to the team and she works really well with these girls,” the head coach said. “I think anybody would be

stoked to have her.”

As for the team goals this season, the Warriors are not shying away from expectations, and after their breakthrough championship in 2024 they’re eager to make it two straight league titles.

“That’s the plan. They really want it,” Shawn Eckart said. “And I know the girls are looking forward to the season, and I’m looking forward to the season.”
