Region not out of wildfire danger

While the fire danger to Gasquet and the surrounding region has reduced, officials stress the community is not out of the woods yet to the ongoing hazard.

At a special meeting Tuesday, Sept. 15, the Del Norte County of Supervisors declared a local emergency. Also, at the request of Public Health Officer Dr. Warren Rehwaldt, they issued a proclamation declaring a local health emergency due to the Slater and Red Salmon Complex fires.

“We included the Red Salmon Complex on the theory that it might continue to migrate into and across our borders and affect the Klamath watershed and homes and roadways, whatever

might be in its path,” Rehwaldt said at the Tuesday meeting. “By making it part of the proclamation, we hope to access funding for remediation should the fire reach us and cause more damage.”

County Administrative Officer Jay Sarina told the supervisors that the primary issue regarding the Slater Fire is damage to road infrastructure on Oregon Mountain Road north of Gasquet.

Sarina said that while a county staff damage assessment was sent to the State of California, a more thorough analysis would need to be conducted. He added the board’s resolution would be sent to state officials to be included in any declarations they would make.

“We would then become eli-

gible if there is a federal declaration. Funding could be made available through the federal government and the State of California,” Sarina explained.

On Sept. 8, the Slater Fire started near Happy Camp and grew to more than 131,000 acres and is 10 percent contained as of Wednesday morning, Sept. 16. The Devil Fire was detected on Sept. 9 just east in the Seiad Valley area and has since grown to about 4,429 acres and is 0 percent contained.

Because the Slater Fire burned into an area near Oregon Mountain Road and Knopki Creek, Gasquet residents were evacuated to Crescent City Sept. 9. They were allowed to return the next day.

Council  
supports  
assessment  
hike

Already hoping voters approve its own proposed sale tax increase, the Crescent City Council unanimously voted Aug. 7 to support the Crescent Fire Protection District’s proposed increase on property assessments.

The Crescent Fire Protection District (CFPD) Board of Directors mailed ballots to its constituents the first week of September, seeking to replace a 2006 property assessment that sunsets in 2021.

The CFPD is seeking the rate hike to help it implement a hybrid fire department using paid staff and volunteers.

According to the CFPD, an annual rate of \$74 would be assigned to single-family homes within the fire protection district for services. The proposed rate would be on top of \$98 annually assessed to single-family homes in 1987.

The measure would also establish a seven-member citizens oversight committee comprised of property owners within the fire protection district.

City Manager Eric Wier explained four properties associated with the measure.

Animal evacuation shelter is ready

Evacuating with short notice is a nightmare at best. But what do you do when your extended family consists of horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, llamas, chickens or rabbits? It might be time to call Ruth Dixon at Curry County 4-H at the OSU Extension, located at the Event Center in Gold Beach.

Last week Dixon and 10 volunteers began work to make an evacuation shelter possible at the Curry County fair arena. The crew set up stalls, pens and animal crates in preparation to accept as many as 20 horses; 20 cattle; 100 sheep, goats, llamas and alpacas in combination; and 100 poultry and rabbits combined. They do not plan on taking in dogs and cats, which can be housed at local pet shelters, but that could change. In addition

to offering shelter for evacuated animals, Dixon can help owners arrange for transport.

Dixon says she’s benefitted greatly from her past experience during the 2017 Chetco Bar Fire when she set up a similar evacuation center. “Everyone will want to know why we set up before any shelter is actually needed,”

she said. “We are very prepared and proactive now because we’ve learned from the past. Us being prepared puts us at the top of the list for places to evacuate livestock.”

She cites advance preparation and additional training as the key for a smoother operation this time if the shelter is

needed. In addition to being the Curry County 4-H Educational Program assistant, she is an Extension Disaster Education Network (EDEN) delegate, My Youth Preparedness (My PI) coordinator in Oregon, and Gold Beach Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) director.

Ever since the Chetco fires started in 2017, Dixon says she’s been working on making the animal evacuation process better. On the morning of Sept. 9, she started contacting everyone needed for approvals to set up the shelter. The Fair Board chairman Chris Brose granted permission first, along with Event Center manager Caitlyn Coleman.

Next she needed a waiver from the state veterinarian to bring horses and other livestock across state lines. The closest fire currently is just over the California border in Gasquet. The

record more  
virus cases

Additional active and confirmed cases have been reported in both Del Norte and Curry counties this week.

The Del Norte County Public Health Branch reported 7 new positive cases of COVID-19 since Sept. 10. Six have been identified to be a close contact to a known case of COVID-19, and one was identified to be travel-related. All are self-isolating at home.

County Public Health Officer Dr. Warren Rehwaldt said due to the steady trickle of cases, Del Norte County is “skating on the edge” in terms of a tier change in the state’s Blueprint for a Safer Economy.

“But as of today, (Sept. 16) we are still in the Tier 3 level, orange category, and nothing has to close, or change operation at the moment,” Rehwaldt said. “Our next round of testing and data reporting may change this, and we will plead our case to the state, given the fact that so little else has

Contour retained for air services out  
of Del Norte County Regional Airport

Contour Airlines will continue to be the carrier of choice for round trip travel between Crescent City and Oakland.

The U.S. Department of Transportation approved Border Coast Regional Airport Authority’s (BCRAA) application for the continuation of service through an Alternate Essential Air Service (AEAS) grant.

Del Norte County District 2

Supervisor Lori Cowan, who sits on the BCRAA board, said at the Supervisors’ Sept. 8 meeting things were getting dicey with Contour Airlines, because the current grant’s expiration date was nearing.

“They had stopped taking reservations because the contracts hadn’t been signed,” Cowan said. “Everything is moving forward and that’s good news for our community.”

On Sept. 11, Representatives Jared Huffman, from Califor-

nia’s Second District, and Peter DeFazio, from Oregon’s Fourth District and Chair of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, shared the announcement.

“As is often the case, sometimes the lowest-cost alternative is not the best option for the people we serve,” Huffman said. “This decision allows communities to continue to benefit from the most reliable service they have enjoyed, and will provide four years of certainty to the

communities and the carrier, allowing for a long-term relationship to develop and grow.”

“The Border Coast Regional Airport Authority is an essential economic driver for southwest Oregon and provides, quite literally, essential air service for many in the region,” DeFazio added. “Continuing passenger service will ensure the communities of Del Norte County, California, and Curry County, Oregon, have a viable air service

Council discussion heats over fire ban

A discussion of a 40-year-old beach fire ordinance got heated Sept. 7 between City Council members, with some fearing an infringement on personal liberties and others arguing for the greater good of Crescent City residents' safety. It took nearly two hours of back and forth arguments before the City Council reached a unanimous vote to update the ordinance that prohibits beach fires between Front and 6th streets. Mayor Blake Inscore and Councilor Alex Fallman favored extending the ban to include the area south of Front Street to the end of Lighthouse Way and north of 6th Street to Preston Island along

Pebble Beach Drive. Councilor Isaiah Wright also called for installing fire rings near the access trail to Battery Point. Crescent City Municipal Code 12.20.030 states that individuals may only start fires in city-provided rings on the beach between Front and 6th streets. However there are no fire rings in that stretch. Currently the city only has four fire rings along Howe Drive near Beachfront Park. Mayor Pro Tem Heidi Kime and Councilor Jason Greenough felt better enforcing the current ordinance with signs that more clearly outline the rules of beach fires was a better way to address the issue than extending a ban. "We're not enforcing an ordinance that's been in effect since 1980,"

Kime said. "Why don't we start enforcing it and see how things roll out?" The municipal code prohibits abandoning fires on public beaches until it's completely out and assesses a \$300 fine per offense. Fire Chief Bill Gillespie explained to the City Council that beach fires have been an ongoing problem. To make his point, he dug up the reports from June 1 through the end of Labor Day. He said Crescent City Fire & Rescue responded to 32 calls for beach fires that had gotten out of control. About 10 of those were during the July 4 holiday, with eight calls occurring between Front and 6th streets and another 14 calls in other parts of the city. Many of those were between Front Street and Battery Point Lighthouse, Gillespie said.

# Traffic stop nets haul of seized contraband

At about 1 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 10, Officer Alex Pearson attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle for a broken tail lamp.

The driver of the vehicle failed to yield to the traffic stop for several blocks, and then he exited the vehicle while it was still rolling forward in the 1000 block of K Street. The driver then fled the scene and down the embankment towards The Club Fitness Center.

Pearson was able to secure the vehicle along with the passenger of the vehicle, before any damage was done to the other vehicles parked on the street.

“Although we were able to identify the driver of the vehicle as Rosco Reidel, we were unable to locate him in the area,” Police Chief Richard Griffin wrote on Facebook. “We will be seeking a warrant for his arrest based upon the items located in the vehicle.”

Those items included close to two ounces of heroin, several hypodermic needles loaded with suspected heroin, Suboxone strips, and replica firearms.

The case is still under investigation and will be forwarded to the District Attorney’s Office for review.

# Phase 2 school reopening pushed back a week

The Del Norte Unified School District (DNUSD) has moved Phase 2 of reopening back by a week due to a delay in receiving critically needed supplies to make the transition.

In a video to the community posted Sept. 11, Superintendent Jeff Harris outlined the hurdles still facing the school district to meet its reopening goals.

He said in August, the Board of Trustees

approved a gradual return to in-person learning that would have moved DNUSD into Phase 2 Sept. 14. “Phase 2 consists of continued distance learning for all students with groups not to exceed 14 students returning for in-person instruction and/or support,” Harris explained. “Students included in these first groups to return are those receiving intensive special education services and those students most at-risk, including foster youth, homeless youth, English

learners, high school students who are significantly credit deficient and students with no internet access.”

Harris said to safely and effectively move into Phase 2, the district needed to have personal protective equipment, disinfecting supplies and family screening tools in place. While the district has most of the PPE it needs to begin working in person with students, the Facilities and Maintenance department still has not received critical supplies, including

disinfecting spray and disinfecting wipes for every classroom that were ordered in April and May. He added the regional fires and road closures are further compounding difficulties receiving those supplies.

In addition, Harris said the school district has yet to receive an app families would use to screen their child at home prior to sending them to school.

“Unfortunately, we have had difficulty in working with the company providing the

app. It was originally supposed to be available on Monday, Aug. 31, but we are now told that it will most likely be closer to Sept. 18,” Harris said.

Despite pushing back the Phase 2 reopening to Sept. 21, Harris said the administration’s goal remains to open Phase 3 by Oct 5. This would begin the two days a week of in person learning at 50% capacity.

Over the next week, Harris said families will be contacted to set up small groups and

to provide information regarding transportation, cohort times and safety protocols for Phase 2.

A mailer will be sent home with information regarding universal precautions and how to safely re-enter school.

“I’d like to thank everyone for their patience and cooperation as our staff continues to overcome challenges and obstacles and strives to ensure that each child receives the best education possible in the current situation,” Harris added.

# DNUSD accepts donation of 200 Chromebooks

The Del Norte Unified School District received a donation of 200 Chromebooks from Frontier Communications. The Chromebooks will be issued to students who lack devices at home so they may participate in distance learning.

“We are so grateful to Frontier Communications and the California Emerging Technology Fund (CETF) for providing our children and families with 200 devices during these unprecedented times,” said Superintendent Jeff Harris. “A number of students and families in Del Norte County do not have access to the internet or devices in the home. As our country and county responds to the COVID-19 pandemic, this means that families are unable to access work, attend school, or acquire basic necessities in their home. The digital divide is a national issue, and it is very often the case that plagues our nation. The issues are further magnified in small rural communities like Del Norte county.

“In Del Norte, our students are often last in line for support and relief when compared to the rest of California. The fact that there are organizations like Frontier and the California

Emerging Technology Fund that are finding new and innovative ways to make a real difference in our small community, is something that we will never forget,” Harris added.

This Device Distribution Project is the result of a Memorandum of Understanding that Frontier Communications entered into with CETF in 2015 when Frontier bought the wireline network from Verizon.

“We are pleased to be working with CETF to distribute 200 Chromebooks in Del Norte County, and a total of 5,000 Chromebooks to families with K-12 students in 17 school districts located in Frontier service areas, and an additional 350 families living on Tribal Lands with children in public schools in those areas,” said Charlie Born, Frontier Communications Government Affairs Manager.

Parents will own the Chromebook and be encouraged to have their children use it to participate in classroom instruction as requested by the school, enable home distance learning and increase parent engagement with their school and public services. The District will be able to count on these devices for students in the classroom, even though the family owns the device.

CETF President and

CEO Sunne Wright McPeak said the coordinated effort with Frontier and school districts includes following best practices for distributing and managing devices and supporting basic digital literacy training for parents receiving the Chromebooks.

“This collaboration will help pivot to the future to effectively incorporate the added technology as a learning tool to enhance distance teaching and

learning with deep parent engagement to continue to support academic opportunities,” McPeak added.

Although the Chromebooks are being distributed to students in households in Frontier service areas, families receiving the devices may choose, but are not required, to sign up for Frontier Fundamental Internet, at \$19.99 a month, or another affordable offer. The participating school districts will provide information about family eligibility for all affordable home Internet offers available at their address.

About California Emerging Technology Fund

The mission of CETF is to close the Digital Divide in California by institutionalizing digital inclusion, including expanding telehealth and distance learning opportunities. The overall goal is to reach 98% of California residences with broadband infrastructure and to achieve 90% home broadband adoption by 2022. ## Guest Editorial: Climate Change

As we deal with the disruption of our lives by the COVID-19 pandemic, we’re also now watching so much of Oregon, Washington, and California burn on an unprecedented scale. Records keep being broken across the west (130° Death Valley, 121° Los Angeles) as well as dramatic temperature swings with half a foot of snow a day after 100° temperatures near Denver. Tropical storms become category 4 hurricanes in a day, while dry lightning storms ignite hundreds of wildfires in one calamitous evening.

Increases in extreme weather events was a key projection of human-induced climate change by Exxon’s scientists in their 1977 analysis of the effects of increasing carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. Since the late 1800s,

we’ve known the physics behind global warming — increases in greenhouse gases (GHGs) such as carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide capture heat to produce a warm planet. There is nothing new about the causes of the strange weather events we’re seeing. It’s just that we are now seeing those events happening at a scale we can no longer ignore. In fact, the changes are happening more quickly than projected and they will continue to worsen until we do something.

We’re now faced with three options: 1) ignore the science and evidence and keep doing what we’ve always done, 2) take immediate actions to eliminate the cause of the problems, 3) mitigate the effects of the changing climate. Loss of life,

health, property, and our current way of life are too dear to accept the first option. Eliminating the cause (2) is critical to avoid the worst effects of climate change. However, we also must mitigate the new conditions (3).

Rather than debating about the causes of the new climatic conditions, we need to decide how to deal with these new conditions, both in the short term and long term. That effort will require everyone who could be affected by these extreme weather events, both young and old, to join in the discussions. Can the free market make the necessary changes quickly enough or must they be mandated by government? How can the energy companies (oil, gas, coal) help make the change or is there no place for them? How do

we equitably manage the costs (direct and indirect) without yet again putting the burden on those least able to afford them.

However, even in this crisis, there are huge opportunities. There are new jobs in renewable energy production, storage, and distribution; sustainable

food production; energy efficiency; advanced infrastructure and more. There will be many opportunities for new businesses, and training for these 21st century jobs will be critical. However, this bright future demands a cooperative, collective effort by everyone interested

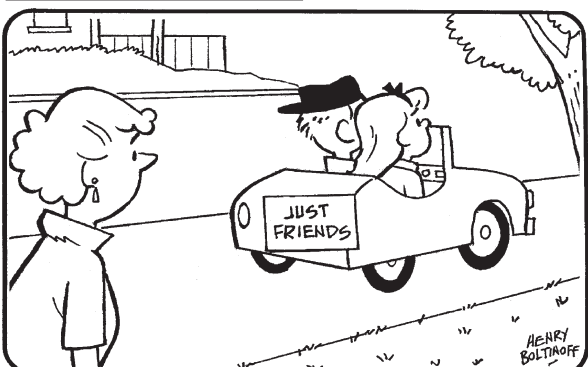

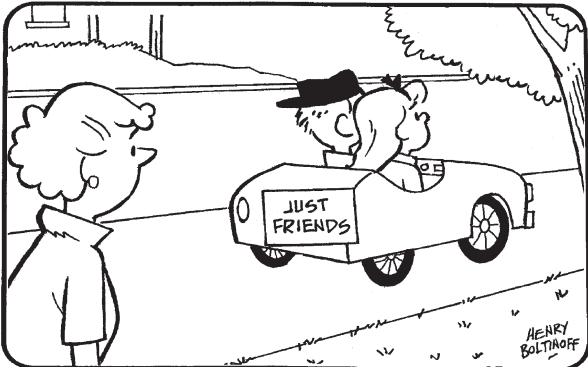

Anglers meet Lower Klamath River adult fall salmon quota

Anglers have met the Lower Klamath River adult fall Chinook salmon quota below the Highway 96 Bridge near Weitchpec for the 2020 season based upon California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) projections. This triggers the closure of the adult Chinook salmon fishery on the main stem of the Klamath River from the Highway 96 Bridge to the mouth of the Klamath River at the Pacific Ocean. The fishery at the mouth of the Klamath was closed as of Tuesday, Sept. 8 and will remain closed to all fishing for the rest of the calendar year. The rest of the lower main stem of the Klamath River below the Highway 96 Bridge at Weitchpec will remain open to the harvest of jack (2-year-old) Chinook

salmon (less than or equal to 23 inches). All adult Chinook salmon caught must be immediately released and reported on the angler's report card. Anglers may still fish for adult Chinook salmon in other reaches of the Klamath Basin, including the main stem of the Klamath River above Weitchpec and the entire Trinity River until the closure of those fisheries. Anglers may monitor the quota status of open and closed sections of the Klamath and Trinity rivers by calling the information hotline at (800) 564-6479. For more information regarding Klamath River fishing regulations, consult the 2020-21 California Freshwater and Supplemental Sport Fishing Regulations at wildlife.ca.gov/regulations.

Closures extended

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has extended closures on 49 properties (bit.ly/3c3Npqc) that lie within or immediately adjacent to U.S. Forest Service (USFS) boundaries through Monday, Sept. 21. The closures were put into place on Sept. 12 due to unprecedented and historic fire conditions. All closures are CDFW wildlife areas or ecological reserves, and they cover many parts of the state. They were closed following the USFS announcement of the temporary closure of all national forests in California (www.fs.usda.gov/main/rs/home). Fire danger is extreme in California currently.

Hunters and outdoor enthusiasts are strongly encouraged to check for closures before leaving on any recreational trip. Click on the following links to follow up-to-date closures:

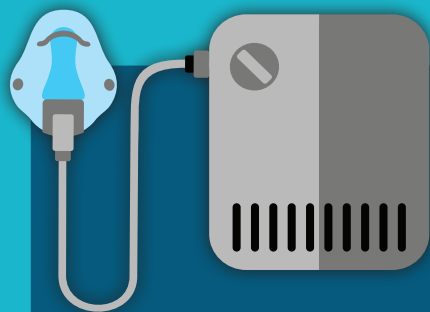

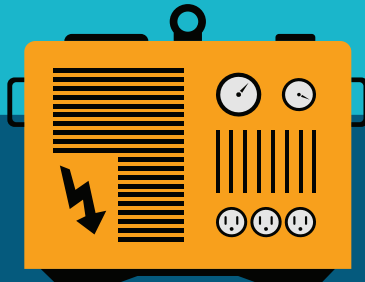

ated with the city's water system, but are located outside its boundaries, would also fall under the proposed property assessment hike.

Wier said if property owners within the fire protection district approve the proposed assessment in October, the city would pay \$325.60 annually for the four water system properties.

These properties include Wonder Stump Road and Railroad Avenue booster stations, a 1.5 million gallon water storage tank on Amador Street and a 4 million gallon water storage tank on Washington Boulevard.

Wier said the proposed assessment would cost the city \$81.40 per property

per year.

The proposed property tax assessment comes to Crescent City voters a month before they consider Measure S — a proposed 1 percent sales tax increase to help the city pay for its portion of the hybrid fire department plan, address Police Department staffing issues, pay for road repairs and pay to keep the Fred Endert Municipal Pool open.

The CFPD's master plan to install a hybrid fire department would cost a total of \$662,000 — a \$307,000 cost to Crescent City and \$355,000 for the Fire Protection District's portion.

Fire Chief Bill Gillespie told the City Council the hybrid department would create a "sleeper program" where three paid captains would oversee a crew of volunteers on call for 24-

hour shifts. He added that if the 2006 assessment isn't replaced, when it expires the district would be left with just two to three years of operational capital.

"Right now, we're just in the month of September and we're at well over 60 calls for service and it's only the eighth," Gillespie said. "In August we responded to 209 calls for service and 219 calls in July between the city and the district. We're well on the path to eclipse 2,000 calls for service again this year."

Gillespie said government properties hadn't been assessed for property taxes in the past, adding the Board of Directors decided to include government entities in the proposed assessment reasoning that they receive the same benefits as other property owners.

"They realized there was a whole host of properties you would think fell under an assessment — restaurants on the waterfront, industrial locations along the waterfront, a number of businesses that were exempted because they were owned by a government agency," he said. "In the past, we have had responses to a number of previously or currently exempted facilities along the waterfront, in the harbor district and including some of the properties that are listed tonight for consideration."

The voting period for the CFPD's proposed property tax assessment ends Oct. 12.

The district will hold a public hearing that evening and use a third party to tally the votes and report the results to the Board of Directors, Gillespie said.

changed in the county, if that becomes necessary."

### Curry County

Curry County Public Health reported two new positive cases of COVID-19 this past week with one each on Sept. 10 and 12. option, which is why I am pleased that the Department of Transportation has approved this important grant at our urging."

In April, both the Del Norte County Board of Supervisors and the

Crescent City Council sent Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao letters in support of Contour, as recommended by the Border Coast Regional Airport Authority. The Authority also received support from Curry County Board of Commissioners, the City of Brookings, the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation and the Elk Valley Rancheria. In

May Huffman and DeFazio followed suit, writing their support for the grant.

Under this ruling, USDOT provides a \$14.6 million grant over four years to provide between seven to 10 flights per week between Crescent City and Oakland. The new grant takes effect Oct. 1, replacing the one sunset- ing at the end of Septem-

ber, and runs through Sept. 30, 2024.

The USDOT chose Contour over another proposal from Boutique Air which was seeking to offer 24 weekly flights service from Del Norte County to Portland, Oregon under the AEAS program.

According to the USDOT, the AEAS program is a subsidy it provides el-

igible communities to pay for airline service to a large or medium-hub airport. The program subsidizes 60 communities in Alaska and 115 communities in the other continental states that wouldn't otherwise receive scheduled air service.

The Tennessee-based carrier Contour Airlines has provided non-stop service between Crescent City

and Oakland in its twin-air, 30-seat Embraer ERJ-135 aircraft, since April 2018 through the AEAS Program. Contour replaced PenAir, which ceased twice daily flights between Crescent City and Portland in December 2017.

According to the Del Norte Office of Emergency Services, evacuation levels have since been lowered.

Gasquet and Big Flat residents are currently at a Level 1 "be ready" evacuation order.

Residents between Pioneer Road and the Oregon state line are under Level 2 "be set" evacuation orders.

Hiouchi is no longer under an evacuation warning.

Fire officials announced Wednesday morning near Gasquet, firelines are holding along Knopki Road, despite limited available resources there. Firefighters are also working to scout control lines along Monkey Ridge and Oregon Mountain Road to prevent the fire's spread into communities southwest of the fire.

Meanwhile Highway 199 remains closed heading northeast out of Gasquet and due to complications to the cleanup effort from the Slater Fire, officials do not have an estimate when the route will reopen.

"We're working closely with the Oregon Department of Transportation, and once it is safe enough to do so, we'll open 199 together," said Myles Cochrane, Caltrans Public Information Officer.

Cochrane said Caltrans

had plans to mobilize and remove hazardous trees from 199 roadway. However, conditions got worse with poor visibility and quality Tuesday afternoon.

"The plan is early Wednesday we'll periodically go in and check conditions," Cochrane said. "If they improve enough, we'll remove trees along the highway, in the roadway, on the shoulder. As soon as we hear there'll be a reopening, even a 3 or 4 hour window, we'll post it immediately on Facebook and Twitter."

Del Norte Office of Emergency Services Public Information Officer Bill Steven said looking at the latest fire maps via [tripcheck.com](http://tripcheck.com), it's easy to assume everything within the outlined fire areas have burned. He said they have not, adding hazardous conditions continue especially near the Collier Tunnel Rest Area.

"There's a sloping hill heading up to the tunnel,

and fire people are worried the fire has the potential to come back up the canyon and hit 199," Steven explained.

He added the Highway 199 closure is troubling for Del Norte residents who use the route to for medical appointments in Josephine and Jackson counties in Oregon.

"I talked to a couple people who were disappointed at having to make the run to Bandon and over to I-5 and I spoke to at least one person who had to fly out this week on business. Between doctors appointments and air travel, it's caused quite an issue," Steven said.

He added people are having to go north on 101 and cut over at Bandon to Interstate 5 to Roseburg, or drive south to Arcata and cut over on 299. Either route, Steven said, comes to about six hours.

In a bit of good news, Wednesday was the first day the North Coast

Unified Air Quality Management District (NCUQAQMD) issued no air advisory for Del Norte County.

According to the NCUQAQMD, the air in Crescent City is good, with periods of moderate conditions. In Gasquet, the air is classified as unhealthy for sensitive groups with periods of unhealthy for all groups. And in Klamath, the air quality is listed as overall good, with periods of moderate to unhealthy for sensitive groups.

The NCUQAQMD recommends sensitive populations to stay indoors and avoid prolonged activity. All others should limit prolonged or heavy activity and time spent outdoors. Even healthy adults can be affected by smoke. Seek medical help if you have symptoms that worsen or become severe.

They recommend the following general precautions to protect your health during a smoke event:

- Minimize or stop outdoor activities, especially exercise.
- Stay indoors with windows and doors closed as much as possible.
- Do not run fans that bring smoky outdoor air inside — examples include swamp coolers, whole-house fans, and fresh air ventilation systems.
- Run your air-conditioner only if it does not bring smoke in from the outdoors. Change the standard air conditioner filter to a medium or high efficiency filter. If available, use the "re-circulate" or "recycle" setting on the unit.
- Do not smoke, fry food, or do other things that will create indoor air pollution.

Steven said residents have been asking the Office of Emergency Services how they can help and get involved if there are further evacuation orders.

"The Red Cross spent about \$11,000 on hotel rooms for evacuees that Wednesday night," Steven said. "The best thing you can donate to the Red Cross is cash. Not thousands or even hundreds, they'd be happy if you threw \$10 their way."

He added this is a good time to reevaluate safety precautions taken in your own homes, as outlined at [www.preparedelnorte.com](http://www.preparedelnorte.com), from preparing a "defensible space" around your home in case of an encroaching wildfire to making sure you have a go bag ready if an evacuation is called.

# Yurok Agricultural expands food sovereignty

The Yurok Agricultural Corporation has purchased 26-acres of land that will be used to develop a culturally relevant food sovereignty program on the Yurok Reservation.

Previously owned by the Weitchpec Nursery, YAC officials said the property is an ideal location to build the much-needed food program, which will serve residents on and near the reservation.

“Weitchpec Nursery was the premier supplier of flower and vegetable starts in the Humboldt County region for many decades. When the owners retired the community lost jobs and revenue from that business,” said Toby Vanlandingham, President of the YAC. “The Yurok Agricultural Corporation has an opportunity to once again bring that business

back into the community to stimulate economic growth, create decent paying jobs, and to assist residents with becoming self-sustaining by growing their own food.”

The purchase was timely as it occurred during the current COVID-19 pandemic.

“COVID has heightened the importance in rural communities of micro agriculture and food sovereignty,” said Madison Green, Secretary of the Board. “The purpose of the Yurok Agricultural Corporation is to develop agricultural economic resources and to maximize revenue derived from such resources on behalf of the Tribe and its members, this project falls directly in line with our core mission as a company and will benefit our people for decades to

come.”

YAC Vice President Edward “Horse” Aubrey said the nursery will be dedicated to providing a quality choice for people looking for plant starts and garden supplies, as well as creating a farmers marketplace and an outlet to local area stores with quality vegetables at affordable prices.

“I’ve been a staunch supporter of Yurok people maintaining true sovereignty by growing their own medicine and food, so when Toby brought this idea to the table it was a no-brainer — power to the people,” Aubrey said.

The new program will also focus on educating and assisting Yurok reservation residents in all aspects of food sovereignty. Since the entire Yurok reservation was declared

a food desert by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in 2017, a multitude of studies have been done on the area and a small number of grants have been awarded to build a healthy, sustainable and culturally centered food system. In some areas off the reservation there has been success, but on the Yurok Reservation there has been no solid foundation laid to sustain a program into the future.

“We’re still in a food desert and have been since colonization basically,” Vanlandingham said. “I have been in agriculture my entire life, in order to really bring about change on the reservation we need a program that is not grant funded and has the resources to keep the program going. I was running the Kenek We-roy commu-

nity garden up until I was elected to Tribal council, then life got busy. Now that I am the president of the agricultural corp I have the ability to build a system that the community needs, based off of the community needs, and not worry about finding a grant for that.”

“Now I am not saying we will stop pursuing grant dollars, but outside funds will not be the defining factor in the success of this program,” Vanlandingham added.

With a tentative opening date of March 2021, the Yurok Agricultural Corporation will bring the dream of the community to reality and be the supplier of locally sourced non-GMO, high quality vegetables and vegetable starts. The nursery will also offer organic seeds

and a variety of potted fruit trees that are suited to the local climate. Weitchpec Nursery will serve both residential customers and area retail stores. There will also be a variety of garden accessories such as potting soils, safe fertilizers and garden tools available. In addition, gardening how-to’s and community workshops to further educate residents on the benefits of growing food will also be provided to the community.

The Yurok Agricultural Corporation is a Tribal entity that is organized, chartered and wholly owned by the Yurok Tribe. The YAC was created to develop agricultural economic resources in an orderly manner and to maximize revenue derived from such resources on behalf of the Tribe and its members.

waiver allows livestock to travel into Oregon without required vaccinations.

Also required in these times of COVID-19, she needed to get an “event” permit to carry on the group’s activities through OSU Extension’s guidelines. Dixon says the project isn’t all just work, but also rewarding and sometimes memorably fun. The last time they operated the shelter, the volunteers placed pallets to sleep on next to where the pigs were housed. “You would never know that pigs [passed gas] and belched so much without that experience,” she laughed.

Once animals are checked into the evacuation center, only volunteers and trained staff are allowed to interact with the animals and provide care. It reduces the stress on the animals, Dixon explained, because they become anxious about being abandoned all over again after seeing their owners. The strict policy also eliminates the possibility of animals being stolen or harmed.

If anyone would like to

make a donation, Dixon says that Curry County 4-H has an account at Gold Beach Lumber that people can add funds to, or they can contact her directly (contact info below). She asks that people not make

any direct donations of food at this time since they do not know what will be needed. Also, make sure to contact her if you need to bring any animals so they can receive them, fill out paperwork and set up care

volunteers. “I learned in 2017 that I didn’t need to be there 24/7,” she said.

“Thank you to everyone that came out to help us be prepared for potential livestock evacuations,” Dixon said. “As many local facil-

ities are filling up fast, we acted quickly to ensure a back-up option was ready and available for those in need. I also want to thank Jeremy Dumire, of Curry County Emergency Management and Caitlyn

Coleman, Event Center on the Beach Director and the Curry County Fair Board for all of their hard work.”

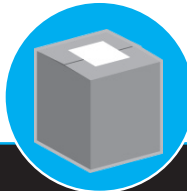

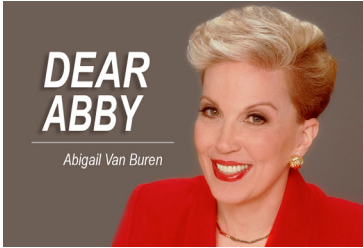


NEWLY SOBER MOM

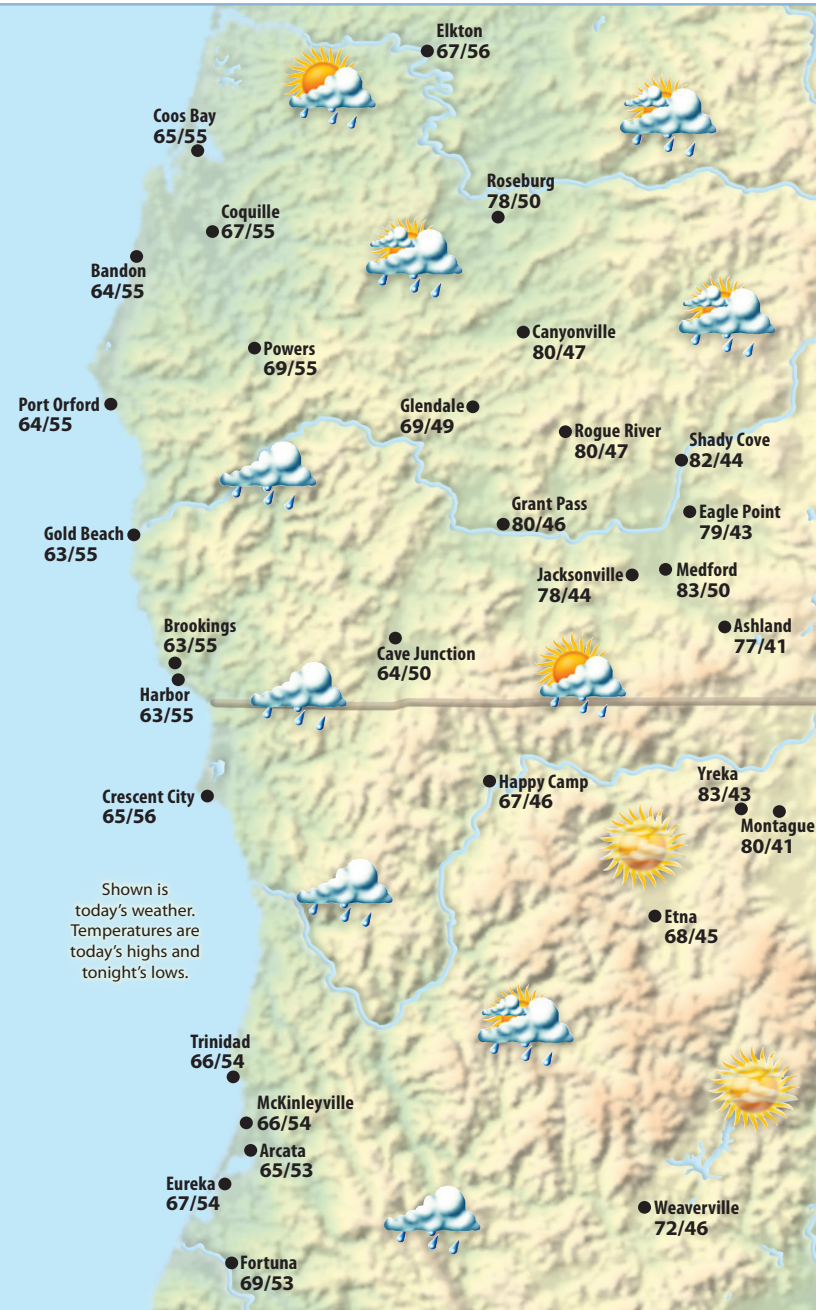
