ELIGIBILITY

Educational grants are open to all individuals who meet the following criteria, regardless of educational status:

Have been a New Hampshire resident for at least two years

Plan to attend a post-secondary education program

By June 2022, have proof of acceptance and/or enrollment in the post-secondary program within one year of the award

Applicants must submit an essay, letter of recommendation, and transcript to be considered for the award (see details in box to left)

This award is not based on financial need or grade point average, but rather on the applicant's vision of journalistic integrity
