FY 2021 AGREEMENT

Agreement made between the City of Manchester, Police Department. 405 Valley Street, Manchester, NH 03103, a municipal corporation of the State of New Hampshire, herein referred to as the "Police Department" AND Manchester School Administration Unit # 37, 20 Hecker Street, Manchester, NH 03102 herein referred to as the "School District". The date of this agreement is July 14, 2020.

For the considerations set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:


1. The Police Department will provide nine (9) School Resource Officers to the School District. An Extra Detail officer will also be scheduled for 4 hours during normal school days at Central and West High Schools.
2. Charge backs for these services in Fiscal Year 2021 shall not exceed \$725,711 without prior approval of the School District.
3. The School District shall reimburse the Police Department upon receipt of an invoice from the Police Department which will be delivered monthly to the School District. The invoice shall calculate salaries and benefits of the SRO's based on their current wages and benefits for four (4) officers, the first year rate for four (4) officers and one (1) Reserve Officer. The Police Department will not bill the School District for any overtime.
4. The Manchester Police Department will assign officers to act as School Resource Officers who are responsible for the three public high schools, the Manchester School of Technology, and the four middle schools.
5. These officers will remain under the direct command of the Manchester Police Department. They will make themselves available to their schools when school is in session and help to solve any problems these schools may need their assistance with.
6. These officers will also make themselves available for activities and committees associated with their school. Positive interaction between these officers and students is encouraged on a daily basis. These officers are expected to spend the majority of their time in the schools and investigate cases related to their students and schools.
7. The employment rights for the officers assigned as School Resource Officers shall not be abridged by the Manchester School District.
8. All equipment belonging to the Manchester Police Department and the School Resource Officers will remain under the control of the police department and its employees. Conversely, all facilities and equipment provided by the Manchester School District shall remain under the control of the school district.
9. Any legal contingencies that may arise will be handled by the City Solicitors Office.
10. The School Resource Officers shall be evaluated on their performance in accordance with the MPD Standard Operating Procedure, "Performance Evaluations", with input from personnel of the school department where officers are assigned.
11. If necessary, this agreement may be reviewed at the request of either party, to implement revisions or other modifications.

12. The agreement will be renewed annually, based on the fiscal year of July through June, and will be in effect prior to the start of the new school year. Either party may terminate the services described in this agreement upon providing proper notice to the other party.

This agreement shall be binding on the assigns and successors of the parties.
