

# NIGHT OUT?

# The Nash, Liliac Club are state's newest casinos

In addition to gaming, casinos also offer creative dining and bars, live entertainment and huge screens to watch sports.

When The Brook casino opened in Seabrook, its first big special event was an appearance by Boston Red Sox great Tim Wakefield. "He would not leave until he signed every last autograph," Brook CEO Andre Carrier recalled. Carrier's father was coming out of a double whammy of COVID and pneumonia, and Wakefield shot a special video salute for him. It meant a lot to the senior Carrier, his son mused: "We lost him 12 months later."

"Creating memories," Carrier said, "is my job."

It's not your grandmother's casino, or even your mother's. More than a dozen charitable gaming houses in New Hampshire focus on a great night out for adults, with or without a single toss of the dice.

### The Brook

A form of gaming has existed at 319 New Zealand Road, Seabrook, dating back to the last century, according to Carrier. The options included greyhound racing and historic horse racing. The dog racing ended in 2009. The facility officially became The Brook in 2020, closed for the pandemic and opened again in May 2020. "We missed the Kentucky Derby but opened again for the Belmont," Carrier said.

The Brook offers 48 table games, including poker; seven bars and restaurants; and 660 slot machines. The restaurants include Nine Drag-

ons, an homage to the Kowloon in Saugus, Mass., and created along with Kowloon owner Bobby Wong. The Nine Dragons has its own event listing under "Forbidden City," he said, and invokes the ambience of the 1970s Kowloon.

There's also live entertainment. The facility has hosted Dueling Pianos, Kenny Chesney, and will welcome Rob Schneider back for a third performance. They continue hosting sports figures. "We just had Pedro Martinez," Carrier said. And an Elvis impersonator is booked for late spring.

Carrier has a friend in Methuen, Mass., whom he's known for 30 years. The man hadn't been to the Brook, and Carrier kept inviting him. "I don't gamble," the old friend would say. And Carrier remembered responding, "You don't have to. Do you want to watch the Celtics? It's more fun with other people." The facility also has a 60-foot-high TV screen, he pointed out.

Carrier was raised in the North Country and has been to Story Land and Santa's Village, both as a child and with his own children. He admits to loving New Hampshire's kiddie attractions but is pleased to offer an alternative. "It's a different way for adults to have a night out, as adults," he said.

### The Nash

CEO Eric Althaus reeled off the numbers for the Nash Casino: 1,046 electronic gaming machines, 28 table games, 19 poker tables. But if a customer gets bored with gaming, there are also restaurants and a golf simulator in the facility next door to Nashua's Pheasant Lane Mall.

The restaurants include a casual cafe, The Woodlands Cafe, serving breakfast, lunch and dinner; the Asian-themed Lucky Lantern; a sports bar on both levels; and the company's formal restaurant, The Proper Chophouse, with crystal, silver and cloth napkins. The Chophouse includes a main dining room, a private dining room, and a lounge. The sports bar has television screens, but there's also a giant screen on the "video wall," he said, adding, "It's the Celtics tonight. We'll be jam-packed. Then there's the Masters for golf (at the time of this interview)."

The casino was busy on a Friday morning in April, with a group of women trying their luck at the slots.

Jamie Schultz of Chicago killed time while visiting relatives. And a retired couple, Donna and Jim, worked side-by-side slots. It's their third trip to the Nash, Donna said, and she gave the casino high marks. She also likes it because it's close by, she said.

"It's something for us old people to do for entertainment," she said, adding that they visit casinos frequently. "You name it, we've been there."

According to Althaus, the Nash has added 600 jobs to the Nashua area and is poised to give \$1.5 million to local charities. The company also owns the Lucky Moose Casino in Nashua.

### The Lilac Club

For Eric Barbaro, CEO of G2

Gaming, a branch of Granite State Gaming and Hospitality, it's all about respecting the local history. When his company purchased the Lilac Mall at 7 Milton Road, Rochester, they made sure to honor its past and the locals who shopped there. "We looked at how we could pay homage to what was there," Barbaro recalled. This included an installation honoring the former Spinelli Cinemas and, at the spot where the K-Mart used to be, there are mannequins embedded in the ceiling design, according to him.

Like Carrier, Barbaro points out that "you don't have to be a gamer" to enjoy the Lilac Club. "You can enjoy a great meal, a great cocktail" at the facility's Lucky Oak

Restaurant, he said. There's a bar that seats 37 people, with no slots in the immediate vicinity.

But Lilac Club also feeds the need for luck, with an array of table games, 200-plus gaming machines, and a 12-table poker room. It also offers a Players' Card, with automatic discounts for regular customers.

"We want the tourists to feel welcome, but every day we serve the locals," Barbaro said.

The company also owns the Beach Club Casino at Hampton Beach and is licensed for a third facility in Littleton.

### **Charitable Gaming**

New Hampshire only licenses casinos if they operate under the

state's charitable gaming laws, which requires them to donate a portion of daily proceeds to a nonprofit. Carrier's Seabrook facility supports Angel Flight, providing quick medical transportation; Make A Wish; and Meals on Wheels, among other charities. He's especially proud to be associated with the Krempels Brain Injury Center. "I routinely write checks for up to \$200,000," he said.


According to Barbaro, commercial gaming across the country almost always gives back to the community. But in places like Las Vegas, the owner decides how much they want to donate. It's more structured in New Hampshire, with

a mandate that casinos give 10 percent of their profits back to the state and 35 percent to charitable organizations.

Though the Lilac Club only opened in March, Barbaro has already given \$58,000 to Rochester Rotary and \$58,000 to the Rochester Main Street Program, he said.

Barbaro added that the Lilac Club has added 130 jobs to Rochester. While local people didn't have extensive experience in the casino business, he was willing to "train and develop them into the role. They don't have to go into the same trade their father did."

# What happens in Vegas ... may not happen here

Gambling has had a murky image in the past, with organized crime, quickie weddings and strippers. Barbaro isn't having any of the bad press. He grew up in Las Vegas, graduated from high school there, and has seen the positive im-

pact on his city. The industry provides jobs and the owners often give back to the community. "Is there a negative impact? Probably, but you have that with every industry."

Barbaro said even Vegas sends a message to those at risk of addiction, with brochures on problem gambling stacked up in front of the cages. "We are sending a strong message of awareness," he said. He also pointed out that in the matter of crime, "our surveillance system is better than the police."

Carrier agreed. While his clients are adults and make their own decisions, "The systems and people should be in place to prevent problem gambling," he said.


Barbaro described today's casinos as a fun answer to the question, "What do you want to do tonight?" "A great casino answers that question for everyone," he said.

"This," Carrier said, "is New Hampshire's night out."



# Get adventurous

- Northern Waters Outfitters Take a whitewater rafting trip down the Androscoggin River in Errol. Families and first-timers will love it: class II rapids with some class III at high water levels for a great mix of adventure and enjoyment. You will most definitely get wet! Located in Errol, visit beoutside.com.
- **The Cog Railway** The Cog travels to the 6,288-foot summit of Mt. Washington. Narrators provide details about the railway's history and Mt. Washington's weather and terrain along your journey. The three-hour round trip includes a one-hour layover at the summit, where in clear weather you can see five states, the ocean and southern Quebec. Located at the base of Mt.
