CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

Sergeant Brandon Penzkover, La Crosse County Sheriff's Department, being first duly sworn on oath says that on information and belief:

Count 1: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, attempted to cause the death of D.T., with intent to kill that person or another, contrary to sec. 940.01(1)(a), 939.50(3)(a), 939.32, 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., a Class B Felony, and upon conviction may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not to exceed sixty (60) years.

And further, invoking the provisions of sec. 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., because the defendant committed this offense while using a dangerous weapon, the maximum term of imprisonment for the felony may be increased by not more than 5 years.

Count 2: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, attempted to cause the death of J.W., with intent to kill that person or another, contrary to sec. 940.01(1)(a), 939.50(3)(a), 939.32, 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., a Class B Felony, and upon conviction may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not to exceed sixty (60) years.

And further, invoking the provisions of sec. 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., because the defendant committed this offense while using a dangerous weapon, the maximum term of imprisonment for the felony may be increased by not more than 5 years.

Count 3: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, attempted to cause the death of L.B., with intent to kill that person or another, contrary to sec. 940.01(1)(a), 939.50(3)(a), 939.32, 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., a Class B Felony, and upon conviction may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not to exceed sixty (60) years.

And further, invoking the provisions of sec. 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., because the defendant committed this offense while using a dangerous weapon, the maximum term of imprisonment for the felony may be increased by not more than 5 years.

Count 4: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, attempted to cause the death of D.C., with intent to kill that person or another, contrary to sec. 940.01(1)(a), 939.50(3)(a), 939.32, 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., a Class B Felony, and upon conviction may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not to exceed sixty (60) years.

Count 5: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

And further, invoking the provisions of sec. 939.63(1)(b) Wis. Stats., because the defendant committed this offense while using a dangerous weapon, the maximum term of imprisonment for the felony may be increased by not more than 5 years.

Count 6: ATTEMPT FIRST DEGREE INTENTIONAL HOMICIDE, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

Count 7: SUBSTANTIAL BATTERY, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, did cause substantial bodily harm to A.C., by an act done

with intent to cause bodily harm to that person, contrary to sec. 940.19(2), 939.50(3)(i), 939.63(1)(c) Wis. Stats., a Class I Felony, and upon conviction may be fined not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), or imprisoned not more than three (3) years and six (6) months, or both.

And further, invoking the provisions of sec. 939.63(1)(c) Wis. Stats., because the defendant committed this offense while using a dangerous weapon, the maximum term of imprisonment for the underlying crime may be increased by not more than four (4) years.

Count 8: SUBSTANTIAL BATTERY, USE OF A DANGEROUS WEAPON

Count 27: POSSESSION OF A FIREARM BY OUTSTATE FELON

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, June 17, 2023, at 116 3rd St. South, in the City of La Crosse, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, did possess a firearm, having been convicted of a crime elsewhere that would be a felony if committed in this state, contrary to sec. 941.29(1m)(b), 939.50(3)(g) Wis. Stats., a Class G Felony, and upon conviction may be fined not more than Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or imprisoned not more than ten (10) years, or both.

and prays that the defendant be dealt with according to law; that the basis for complainant's charge of such offense is:

FACTUAL BASIS:

Your affiant, pulling from various La Crosse Police Department Officers' reports, determined:

Victims D.T., J.W., L.B., D.C., I.S., and D.Y. (counts 1-6) are all identified as attempted homicide victims as the group the defendant was shooting at in front of Polito's Pizzeria at 116 3rd St. S. at approximately 1:59:38 a.m. on January 17, 2023.

Victims C.A., K.S., K.W., C.D., H.N., T.H., G.E., H.F. P.H., E.H., E.J., D.J., S.L., N.L. and A.W. are people who were either outside Polito's in the area of the targeted group or inside Polito's at the time of the hearing. None of this group are currently known to have had any interactions with the defendant which may have led him to target them. (counts 7-26)

Victims D.T. and J.W. from the targeted group, and victims C.D., K.S., K.W., A.C, and H.N (bystanders) all suffered gunshot wounds. Information about the severity of these injuries is still being gathered.

Charged may be upgraded, downgraded, added or removed as additional investigation takes place and additional reports are received.

SUMMARY:

This is an Investigative Bureau report pertaining to video surveillance from Downtown Project Blue Light Cameras, La Crosse County Law Enforcement Center, Politos Pizza (116 3rd St S), Press Break (118 3rd St S), and Shooters Bar (120 3rd St S).

I reviewed video from numerous locations, including downtown Project Blue Light cameras, Politos Pizza, Press Break, Shooters Bar, the La Crosse County Health and Human Services building, and the La Crosse County Law Enforcement Center, and observed the following:

-Camera 21 – La Crosse Center Ramp 3rd & Pearl North View:

1:47:10 AM – Grant was standing on the sidewalk outside the La Crosse Bierhaus, 128 3rd St S, and appeared to be talking to patrons inside the bar. Four male subjects walk past Grant and interact with him. Grant turns and follows the four subjects northbound to the area in front of Press Break. Two of the four subjects were later identified as I.S. and L.B., Jr.

1:49:42 AM – Grant continues to talk to the four subjects in front of Press Break, then takes his sweatshirt off and throws it on the sidewalk.

1:50:25 AM – Three additional subjects join the original four subjects. The three subjects were later identified as D.C., D.Y., and J.W..

1:51:23 AM – Grant and L.B. Jr. enter Press Break.

1:53:52 AM – Grant exits Press Break, walks southbound, then turns back toward D.C., who followed Grant out of Press Break. D.C. approaches Grant and tries to punch him in the face with his right hand. Grant dodges the swing. D.C. then tries to strike Grant with his left hand, but Grant blocks it. Following the confrontation, Grant runs southeast across 3rd Street. The other subjects congregated on the sidewalk in front of Politos Pizza.

-Using various cameras in the Downtown area, Grant was observed running east on Pearl Street to 4th Street, south on 4th Street to Jay Street, then east on Jay Street toward 5th Avenue.

1:55:25 AM - Grant was last seen on *Camera 39 – 4th St & Jay Market Square Ramp* running east on the 400 Block of Jay Street.

1:59:09 AM - Grant's vehicle was observed traveling west on Jay Street, from 5th Avenue. The vehicle continues west on Jay Street to 3rd Street, where it turned north, heading the wrong way on 3rd Street.

1:59:26 AM - The license plate reader at 3rd/Jay Streets captured Grant's vehicle turning northbound on 3rd Street.

1:59:38 AM – Grant's vehicle is observed northbound on 3rd Street, directly in front of Politos Pizza, on *Camera 36 – Big Al's 360 – Camera – 02*, when the glass on the front door of Politos is shattered from gunfire. The driver of Grant's vehicle appears to be using his left hand to drive the vehicle, while his right hand is firing a handgun out the driver's window toward Politos. At the time of the shooting, D.C., I.S., D.Y., J.W., and L.B. are seen standing in front of Politos. D.T. is standing underneath the camera at the time of the shooting and is not visible; However, he runs southbound after the shooting and lies down on the sidewalk.

D.T. and J.W. are both struck by gunfire, and both subjects lied down on the sidewalk after the shooting. D.C., I.S., L.B., and the unidentified man wearing the yellow hoodie ran southbound after the shooting. D.Y. stayed with J.W..

1:59:40 AM – Camera "*GNW01-GR GARAGE ENT*", located at the entrance to the La Crosse County Jail Sallyport entrance, shows two women walking northbound on the sidewalk. Both women look to the south then begin to run northbound.

1:59:56 AM – The same camera captures Grant's vehicle traveling northbound on 3rd Street at a high rate of speed. The vehicle then turns into the north lot of the Law Enforcement Center. A short time later, the same two women are seen running southbound from the north lot of the LEC.

2:00:01 AM – Camera "*INE05-N PARKING LOT*", located on the north side of the Law Enforcement Center, shows Grant's vehicle pull into the north lot of the LEC at a high rate of speed from 3rd Street. The vehicle parks, haphazardly, in a parking space near the middle of the parking lot, facing east.

2:00:24 AM – The same camera shows a male subject exit the driver's seat of Grant's vehicle and run northbound through the alley between Dee's Muffler Shop and the County Garage. The subject was wearing black pants, white shoes, white t-shirt, and black sweatshirt, similar to the clothing Grant was wearing just prior to the shooting.

2:00:32 AM – Grant appears to throw something up in the air as he ran between Dee's and the County Garage. It should be noted, a handgun was later recovered on the roof of Dee's Muffler Shop. See Officer Dan Ulrich's report for additional information pertaining to the recovery of the firearm.

2:00:42 AM – Camera "Police West Gate 360 – Camera – 03", located on the west gate of the La Crosse Police Department Back Ramp, at 4th St/Badger St, shows Grant on the Northwest corner of 4th/Badger St, walking north on the west sidewalk of 4th Street N. Grant takes off his black sweatshirt as he runs east across 4th Street and throws the sweatshirt over the fence into the secured police parking lot, or "Back Ramp". Grant begins to run north, then turns to the south and runs across 4th Street toward Dee's Muffler Shop.

2:01:27 AM – Camera "Police West Gate 360 – Camera – 01", located at the same location, but facing southwest, captures Grant running south along the front of Dee's Muffler Shop.

2:01:44 AM – Camera "*INE05-N PARKING LOT*" captures Grant running from the front of Dee's back toward his vehicle. The headlights of the vehicle are still on at that time.

2:02:20 AM – Grant walks northbound from the vehicle, then stops and appears to lock the vehicle with the key fob as the headlights turn off at that time. He walks northbound through the alley between Dee's

and the County Garage. A police squad drives southbound on 3rd Street, with emergency lights activated, and Grant appears to hide in the alley. It should be noted, there were several snow plows stored in the alley where Grant was hiding and a white bedazzled belt, similar to the belt worn by Grant prior to the shooting, was found inside one of the snow plows. Grant continued to hide while several squad cars and an ambulance passed by on 3rd Street.

2:04:14 AM – Grant comes out of hiding and walks northbound through the alley to Badger Street.

2:04:33 AM - Camera “Police West Gate 360 – Camera – 03” shows Grant walking northbound on 4th Street, from Badger Street, cross eastbound across 4th Street, and continue walking northbound to the north lot of city hall.

2:05:10 AM – Grant is observed walking northeast through the north parking lot of City Hall.

2:06:12 AM – Grant is observed crossing La Crosse Street and is last seen walking north through the grass to the west of the Chamber of Commerce building, 601 7th St N.

8:08:58 AM – Grant is observed on camera located at the La Crosse Health and Human Services building, 300 4th St N, walking northbound on the west sidewalk of the 300 block of 6th St N, just prior to his arrest.

All video from the Downtown Project Blue Light Cameras were bookmarked and saved to Axon Evidence. Video from the Law Enforcement Center and the La Crosse County Health and Human Services Building was also saved to Axon Evidence.

EVIDENCE:

The black sweatshirt Grant threw over the fence into the secured La Crosse Police “Back Ramp” squad parking area was collected and placed into evidence at the police department.

POLITOS VIDEO SURVEILLANCE:

After speaking with the owner of Politos Pizza, Samuel Polito, it was learned there was no way to review pre-recorded video on their surveillance system. Polito released the entire DVR camera system to the Police Department in an attempt to retrieve video from the system. At this writing, it is not known whether or not the video can be recovered.

DISPOSITION:

This is an Investigative Bureau report pertaining to video surveillance of the downtown shooting, including a confrontation between the alleged shooter, Grant, and the alleged targets, prior to the shooting. Additional follow-up is needed to attempt to retrieve recorded video surveillance from the DVR from Politos Pizza.

End of report.

Reports of Officers Cotto, Roden, Raddant, Rosenow show consistent 9mm Sig Luger shells and shell casings were recovered from in front of Polito’s, in front of the Antique Center (north of Polito’s on 3rd St.), in front of Animal House (one block north of Polito’s on 3rd St., and from inside the gun thrown by the defendant onto the roof of Dee’s Auto shop.

Report of Inv. Rosenow (photographs omitted):

NARRATIVE:

Initial Observation

I was contacted at 2:27am by Lt. Brandl of the La Crosse Police Department and requested I assist with a shooting investigation that just took place in the area of 100 3rdStreet South. I was advised multiple people were struck by bullets however no subjects were deceased. No immediate suspect was known.

Arrival

Upon my arrival, the scene was taped off and multiple Officers were maintaining scene security with Sgt. Plenge in command. I was advised that several spent shell casings were found in the street and that traffic cones were being used to identify their locations. I was briefed that at least six individuals were struck by bullets and at least three of them were believed to be inside Polito's Pizza.

I did observe a significant amount of blood in more than half of the west sidewalk in the 100 block of S. 3rdStreet. Multiple articles of clothing from shoes to shirts and hats were strewn about. Most with evidence of blood on them. I was also advised the suspect vehicle was a black Cadillac Sedan that was traveling n/b in the 100 block of 3rdStreet south despite this roadway being a one-way specifically for s/b traffic. The driver of the vehicle was suspected of firing multiple rounds towards bystanders both outside Press Break and Politos Pizza and inside both places.

Scene Processed

I took overall pictures of the scene with the traffic cones in place to designate spent casings. I then marked items of evidentiary value with evidence numbers and took additional photos. There was a total of five spent shall casings that were located in about the middle of 100 3rdStreet South. There were labeled with evidence cones 1-5. Each of the spent shall casings appeared to be the same – SIG 9mm Luger+9. **Please see photo on next page.

One fragmented bullet was located in the street which was marked as #6 by an evidence cone. There was a red 2007 Buick Lucerne parked in front of the Antique Center and Politos Pizza. This vehicle had a bullet entrance hole on the driver's side upper door. I could not find where the bullet traveled to after striking the door and suspected it may still be in the door. There was a second bullet that struck the C-Pillar on the driver's side. This bullet traveled thru the vehicle and thru the rear passenger side window. Several areas of blood were scene throughout the area between the Antique Center on the north end of south 3rdStreet to south of Shooter's Bar which his on the southern end of 3rdStreet South. Several articles of clothing including shirts, shoes, flip flops and baseball hats were located.

Polito's Pizza had their entrance door completely shot out and the window directly to right of the entrance door was busted with two clear and distinct bullet holes that went thru the glass. Bullet fragments were found inside Polito's Pizza along with blood in several different areas inside. Please see photos below of the front entrance of Polito's Pizza.

View from inside Polito's Pizza.

In front of Press Break, there was a significant amount of pooled blood on the sidewalk, in two separate areas along with clothing near each of these areas.

Inside Polito's Pizza more evidence was photographed and collected. There were several areas within the Pizza place that had blood. Three of the areas, which were all different were all swabbed for DNA. Two fragmented / mushroomed rounds were found inside Polito's, on the floor directly in front of the glass covered ordering area and another round in the employee entrance area near the ovens. Please see the below photos as they are labeled in the photos as numbers 27 and 30.

Another fired round was observed to have gone thru an upper window part of the Antique Center. Officer Raddant and this writer did make contact with a respondent for the business to look for additional evidence however a spent bullet could not be located inside the store at this time.

All items believed to be of evidentiary value were collected and placed into evidence. A full evidence report was completed.

Suspect vehicle located

While processing the scene, dispatch advised the suspect vehicle had been located in the parking lot for the Law Enforcement Center. Officers responded and did locate a black Cadillac Sedan that was later confirmed to be the suspect vehicle. The vehicle was found to have MN plates HXN773. This was registered to a male subject identified as DeAndrew Seneca Grant (10/12/1991).

Suspect tracked

Video surveillance was available which showed the areas where the lone individual in the vehicle had both walked and ran. Please see additional officers / investigator's reports on this information. At approximately 8:14am, Officers did locate DeAndrew Seneca Grant walking in the area of the La Crosse Juvenile Detention Center and was quickly and safely taken into custody. DeAndrew was found to be wearing the same identical clothing he was wearing after exiting his Cadillac, post shooting, and after throwing his black sweatshirt over a City Hall wall and it landing in the secure parking area for police – City Hall. (Please see other police reports advising of this.)

Suspect Interview

DeAndrew was transported to the La Crosse PD and escorted into an interview room. He was provided a water. I advised DeAndrew he was at the Police Station after having been put in handcuffs as he wasn't free to leave. I advised him he was involved in an incident downtown where people got hurt. He refused to answer any questions at this time.

Firearm located

Officers assisting with the search of the areas that DeAndrew was believed to have ran and after Officers reviewed surveillance footage, it was believed DeAndrew threw an item onto the roof of Dee's Muffler. Upon checking this, officers did locate a 9mm firearm with magazine. This item was later turned over to me for processing. The firearm was a stainless steel over black 9mm Smith & Wesson handgun. There was a total of four live rounds. Please see Officer D. Ulrich's specific information as to where the firearm was located and where the rounds were. I did notice that all four of the live rounds DID MATCH the spent shell casings of the 9mm rounds found at the scene of the shooting. All of the rounds both live and spent were 9mm Ruger+P SIG brand. The firearm, magazine and rounds were placed into evidence.

DNA Warrant

I did apply for and was granted a warrant for his DNA. I took two buccal swabs from DeAndrew while he was still at the Police Department. Both of these were labeled and placed into evidence.

Disposition

After making contact with Det. Sgt. Fitzgerald who was able to confirm there was at least six victims were shot as a result of DeAndrew's actions, he was transported to the La Crosse County Jail and charged with SIX counts of Attempted – 1stDegree Reckless Homicide. It was also suspected that this shooting was in retaliation to an argument that occurred minutes before the shooting occurred. Please see other Officer's reports for information as it relates to that incident.

The report of Officer Wiste catalogues some of the injuries to victims:

C.D.: Gunshot wound in front left lower leg

K.W.: Gunshot wound in left hamstring

K.S.: Gunshot wound in left bicep, abrasion on left hand

J.W.: Gunshot wound in right back shoulder, gunshot grazed on right side of head

A.C.: Gunshot wound in right bicep and right abdomen

H.N.: Gunshot graze on left chest, multiple abrasions on left arm and left side of face from broken glass.

D.T.: Gunshot wound to thigh and hand, other injuries unknown at this time.

Narrative from Ofc. Wiste's report:

SUMMARY:

On Saturday, June 17th, 2023, at approximately 2:00 AM, I (Officer Wiste) responded to a shots fired call at Polito's Pizza located at 109 3rdStreet North, La Crosse, WI 54601. Upon arrival, I canvassed the immediate area for any additional victims. I did not find any additional victims. I then interviewed six victims at Gundersen Hospital.

NARRATIVE:

INTIAL OBSERVATION:

On Saturday, June 17th, 2023, at approximately 2:00 AM, I (Officer Wiste) was arresting another subject from case 10-23-28455 in front of John's Bar 109 3rdStreet North, La Crosse, WI 54601. At the previously mentioned time, I heard multiple gunshots coming approximately 1-2 blocks south of my location. At that time I loaded up the arrestee in the back of my squad and transported him to the La Crosse County Jail.

RETURN TO 3RDSTREET:

After clearing from jail at approximately 2:11 AM, I arrived in front of Polito's Pizza located at 116 3rdSt South, La Crosse, WI 54601. Upon arrival I was assigned by Sgt Plenge to canvass the immediate area for additional victims. After canvassing the area, I did not locate any additional victims.

INTERVIEW OF VICTIMS AT GUNDERSEN HOSPITAL:

After completing my assignment on 3rdStreet, I was tasked with interviewing victims at Gundersen Hospital.

INTERVIEW OF C.D.:

I interviewed C.D. (verbally identified, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 16. According to C.D., she was in the booth on the south closest to the door. C.D. was seated facing the street when she heard gunshots. C.D. then felt her leg get hit. She looked down, confirmed she was hit, and got under the booth. C.D. then hopped her way over to the counter and hid in a booth south of the counter. After she got to the booth, two females put napkins on her leg.

C.D. said she saw a Hispanic male shot in the leg hopping to the back of Polito's before returning to the front of the store. C.D. said she also saw one white male shot in the arm that was sitting in the second booth from the front on the north side. C.D. rated her pain a 7-8 on a 0-10 pain scale with 0 being no pain and 10 the most pain. C.D. did not consent to being shot or being shot at. C.D. said she would be willing to testify for the state.

C.D.'s injuries were a gunshot wound in front left lower leg. Her injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. C.D. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

INTERVIEW OF K.W.:

I interviewed K.W. (identified via WI Driver's License, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 13. According to K.W., him and his friend K.S. were selecting their pizzas at the counter when he heard what he thought were fireworks. K.W. then felt something warm on his leg. K.W. initially thought someone had lit of a firework in the restaurant. K.W. then found blood on his hand and saw people laying on the ground. At that time, he realized he was shot. K.W. ran to the back of the restaurant to make sure no one else was shot before running to the front of the store to check on others.

K.W. said he heard from a heavier white male with a red beard wearing an Animal House shirt that a black Cadillac driving the wrong way on 3rdStreet was responsible for the shooting. K.W. rated his pain a 4 or 5 out of 10. Lastly, K.W. said he would be willing to testify for the state.

K.W.'s injuries were a gunshot wound in left hamstring. His injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. K.W. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

INTERVIEW OF K.S.:

I interviewed K.S. (verbally identified, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 34. According to K.S., he was selecting his pizza at the counter with his friend Kiatone. At that time, he heard "bangs" which he thought was fireworks. K.S. grabbed his arm and realized he was hit by a bullet. K.S. then sprinted towards the bathroom where he grabbed napkins for his arm. When K.S. exited the bathroom, he observed bullet holes in the glass along with additional broken glass before exiting out the front. K.S.

said due to his and K.W.'s injuries not being as severe compared to others coupled with a long ambulance wait time, he rode with K.W. in K.W.'s grandma's car to Gundersen.

K.S. said he heard from an unknown person the suspect vehicle was a blacked-out F-150. However, K.S. said his friends told him it was a blacked-out Cadillac. K.S. rated the pain a 6 or 7 out of 10. K.S. did not consent to being shot or shot at. K.S. said he does not know anyone that would want to shoot him. K.S. said he would be willing to testify for the state.

K.S. injuries were a gunshot wound in left bicep, abrasion on left hand. His injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. K.S. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

INTERVIEW OF J.W.:

I interviewed J.W. (verbally identified, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 27. According to J.W., he saw people arguing outside of Press Break (118 3rdStreet South, La Crosse, WI 54601) approximately 5-10 minutes before shots were fired. J.W. claims he was 20-30 feet away from the group of people arguing. J.W. said the person he suspects that did the shooting was "shooed" off by the group of people. The suspect then fled east on Pearl Street past Qdoba Mexican Eats (127 3rdStreet South). J.W. said he heard someone in the crowd that was arguing mention something about getting a gun, but he doesn't know who said it. J.W. informed me he does not know anyone in the group. J.W. described the suspect as a black male wearing a black jacket and black pants. J.W. believes the suspect was approximately 6'1" in height, mid 20s, with unknown facial hair. Lastly, J.W. did not know who the other person was that was fighting.

Later on, J.W. goes to Press Break for food when he hears shots. J.W. begins to run until he feels himself get hit in the back and then the head which causes him to fall to the ground. J.W. rated his pain a 9.5 out of 10. He did not consent to getting shot or shot at. J.W. said he would not be willing to testify for the state.

J.W.'s injuries were a gunshot wound in right back shoulder and a gunshot graze on right side of his head. His injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. J.W. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

INTERVIEW OF A.C.:

I interviewed A.C. (verbally identified, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 26. According to A.C., he was at the register of Polito's at the time of the shooting. A.C.'s right side was facing the street at the time. A.C. heard gunshots, then glass breaking, and yelling before he realized what was occurring. He then ran out the backdoor of Polito's into the alley. At that time, he found a bullet in his shirt. A.C. then began to self-check himself for wounds. He then realized he was shot in the right abdomen and right arm. A.C. turned south towards Pearl Street and turned north on 3rdStreet until he found a police officer. He turned the bullet he found in his shirt over to the police officer (this officer does not know at this time which police officer received the bullet). A.C. would later be transported to the hospital via ambulance.

A.C. informed me when he was in the alleyway behind Polito's, a tan older Buick with a young white male driver checked on him. A.C. rated his pain a 7 out of 10. He did not consent to anyone shooting him or shooting at him. A.C. said he would be willing to testify for the state.

A.C.'s injuries were a gunshot wound in the right bicep and right abdomen. His injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. A.C. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

INTERVIEW OF H.N.:

I interview H.N. (verbally identified, verified via WI DOT records) in emergency room 9. According to H.N., he saw a "whole group" of people go into Press Break. H.N. also saw two males fighting outside of Press Break. One of the males dodged a punch and then ran away from the fight east on Pearl Street past Qdoba Mexican Eats. H.N. does not remember what he was wearing. He thought the suspect was approximately 6'0", medium build, in his 20s. H.N. believes he heard one of the males in the fight say, "You really going to try to fight me right now." H.N. believes the male that did not run away in the fight was approximately 6'2", medium build, in his 20s, and stayed outside of Press Break for the entirety of the incident.

H.N. was standing outside of Polito's when he heard gunshots. The moment he heard a gunshot he fell to the ground because he felt something hit his face which he believes was glass from the car directly in front of him. H.N.'s friends immediately began to treat him for his injuries before he was transported to the hospital via ambulance. H.N. stated he saw a white car, possibly a Rav4, late 2000s, early 2010s going south on 3rd Street at the time of the shooting. He could not see the driver and does not know if this vehicle was involved in the shooting or not. H.N. rated his pain a 6 out of 10 and he did not consent to getting shot or being shot at. H.N. said he would be willing to testify for the state.

H.N.'s injuries were a gunshot graze on his left chest, multiple abrasions on his left arm and left side of his face from broken glass. His injuries were photographed using squad 34's phone camera. H.N. was provided a crime victim's rights form.

MEDICAL RELEASE FORMS:

All six victims I interviewed signed medical release forms. A copy was retained by me and another copy was retained by Gundersen Hospital's emergency room's social worker.

FOLLOW UP NEEDED:

I was unable to speak with two victims at the hospital. T.H. had minor injuries and was released from the hospital before I could interview him. The other person I could not interview was Dwayne Thomas Jr who was in surgery.

DISPOSITION:

I spoke with six victims and canvassed the incident area for additional injuries. Photos of injuries were uploaded to evidence.com. Follow up is anticipated.
