In 1991, **People Against Violent Crime** (PAVC) initiated the first Tree of Angels in Austin, Texas. The evening recognized that the Holiday Season is a particular difficult time for crime victims and their families. This special evening honored surviving victims and victims' families by making it possible for loved ones to bring an Angel Ornament to place on a special Tree, known to most individuals as a Christmas Tree. The Tree of Angels is a reverent forum for the community to remember, include and support crime victims who are a part of our lives and the community as a whole. The Tree is a symbol of tragedy, but more than that, the Tree symbolizes Hope and Triumph. The Hope that someday another name will not have to be placed on any Tree and the Triumph of the human spirit. Above all, the Tree of Angels is an expression of love.

In March 2000, the Tree of Angels was officially registered by PAVC with the United States Office of Patents and Trademarks to provide crime victims ownership with their very own special event the first week in December. The Tree of Angels has been recognized by Governor Greg Abbott with a Proclamation, "Tree of Angels Week" in Texas.
