MESSAGE FROM CHIEF OF POLICE WILFREDO CAMPOS

I am pleased to present our agency's fifth Year-End Report, which includes analysis of crime data and details about our initiatives and accomplishments throughout 2024.

Over the course of the past year, we have seen continued progress and further reductions in crime in our community - including an **11%** reduction in shooting incidents, a **6%** reduction in shooting victims, and a **21%** reduction in overall Part 1 crimes. While there was an increase in murders compared with the year prior, our investigations found that this increase can be attributed to domestic-related and other isolated incidents, rather than the type of group-involved violence that has driven numbers higher in years past. Additionally, I am proud to share that our investigators have already made arrests in more than a dozen of these cases, as well as an additional 10 murders that took place in prior years. Still, we are committed to bringing about further reductions, and more details about this data and our efforts are included throughout this report.

The past year is also one of accomplishment, with the launch in March of our Partners in Care co-responder program and our new Wellness Program to support active and retired police officers and civilian staff. These initiatives are in addition to our continued engagement with the community through our monthly Community Resource Fairs, weekly Community Outreach Walks and our Community Engagement Unit. We also saw the graduation of two Wilmington Police Academy classes, and continued success increasing the diversity of our police department.

I could not be more proud of the dedication and commitment of each of our police officers and civilian employees, and look forward to building on our progress in 2025. Thank you, also, to members of our community who work hand-in-hand with our police officers to improve safety and quality of life in each of our neighborhoods!



OUR LAYERED CRIME STRATEGIES

In recent years, the Wilmington Police Department has fundamentally transformed its approach to public safety, with the adoption of proven, evidence-based crime reduction strategies and the embrace of the latest technological tools. The department's core strategies include:

- **Community Policing**, with each and every member of the agency serving as a community policing officer;
- **CompStat Methodology**, applying business management principles to policing to ensure greater levels of focus and accountability;
- **District Integrity**, assigning the same officers to the same neighborhood each time they report for duty;
- **Intelligence-Led Policing**, leveraging the department's Real Time Crime Center to help gather and disseminate intelligence to all personnel;
- **Group Violence Intervention**, blending local, state and federal law enforcement efforts and social service provision into a holistic crime prevention strategy;
- The integration of **NIBIN firearm and ballistic tracing and analysis** and the launch of an embedded Crime Gun Intelligence Center in partnership with the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF);
- **Enhanced GunStat**, including embedded prosecutors with the United States Attorney's Office and the Delaware Department of Justice, who meet several times each month to review every gun arrest and determine whether federal or state prosecution can result in stronger penalties for those responsible for gun violence and firearm crimes in Wilmington;
- **Law Enforcement Partnerships**, involving our local, state, regional and federal partners, which are strengthened through regular information sharing and weekly intelligence meetings to help share information and coordinate our collective response to crime and violence that transcends our jurisdictional boundaries; and
- **Community Partnerships**, which involve social service, public health and community service entities that can connect our residents to resources, as well as our **Partners in Care Co-Responder Program**, which pairs trained mental health clinicians with police officers.

Each of these core strategies has played a role in some of the successes we have seen over the past several years.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS



As we look back on the year 2024, we are proud of some key accomplishments made by the dedicated members of our agency:

- We have continued to carry out our core crime strategies, which have brought about historic crime reductions in Wilmington. These have delivered continued reductions in overall Part 1 crimes, as well as shooting incidents and shooting victims
- In March, we launched our Partners in Care co-responder program, which includes a case manager and two trained mental health clinicians, who respond as a team to calls for service involving mental health, substance abuse and other crisis situations
- In July, we announced the launch of our new WPD Wellness Program, with the goal of supporting the overall health and wellness of active and retired police officers and civilian employees, as well as their families
- We have continued our focus on community policing and engagement through our Community Engagement Unit, as well as monthly Community Resource Fairs, weekly Community Outreach Walks and our monthly Coffee with a Cop events
- We have continued our engagement with youth through our Learn to Ride program and our summer Youth Public Safety Academy, which we host in conjunction with the Wilmington Fire Department
- We have completed a number of significant improvements to our police headquarters facility, including critical HVAC repairs as well as safety, lighting, signage and other aesthetic improvements to the exterior of our building and campus
- We have continued to recruit police officers, despite nationwide challenges facing law enforcement agencies, and graduated two classes from the Wilmington Police Academy in 2024

YEAR-END CRIME STATISTICS



Included with this report is a **Year-End 2024 CompStat report**, which captures preliminary data regarding reported offenses in Wilmington for the entire year. While final, official crime statistics for every jurisdiction are issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation through its Uniform Crime Reporting Program, that data is often not available until the fall of the following year. With this in mind, our agency publishes CompStat reports on our website on a weekly basis, with the objective of sharing the data that drives our operations and providing the public with details on reported crimes in Wilmington. Members of the public can also access crime data updated daily by visiting **CrimeMapping.com**. Preliminary year-end 2024 statistics reveal the following general findings:

- **Murders** – Wilmington experienced an increase in murders in 2024 – with 24 incidents compared with 14 in 2023; of those 24 incidents, 17 murders were by gunfire while 2 were the result of stabbings and 5 were the result of assaults or strangulation. This represents a significant increase in the number of non-shooting related murders and an increase in isolated incidents prompting these crimes.
- **Shooting incidents** – Last year, Wilmington saw a decrease in shooting incidents – with 81 incidents compared with 91 in 2023. This represents the third lowest number of shooting incidents in the past 20 years (there were 72 incidents in 2018 and 76 incidents in 2005).
- Similar to what we found in 2023, in 2024 our investigators observed a continued trend of increased isolated incidents leading to shootings and murders, and a sustained reduction in group-related violence. When accounting for all shooting incidents and murders in 2024:
 - 28% of incidents could be described as ‘isolated incidents’, with 5 being domestic-related and 20 being related to altercations or other isolated causes
 - 7% of incidents are believed to have been related to narcotics or robberies
 - 23% of incidents are believed to have been related to group violence
 - The motive in connection with the remaining 42% of incidents remains under investigation

- **Overall crime** – Last year, there was a 21% reduction in overall Part 1 crimes (which include murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, felony theft and auto theft). There were also reductions in most individual Part 1 crime categories, including auto thefts – reversing a trend in past years of increased auto theft incidents stemming from a national trend. Notably, the total number of Part 1 crimes reported in 2024 reflects a 29% reduction when compared with 2017.
- **Reductions in misdemeanor thefts** – Year-end 2024 data reveal a continued reduction in misdemeanor thefts (including package thefts and thefts from vehicles), with an 11% reduction compared with 2023 - and sustained reductions over the past seven years.

Gun Arrests

The chart below captures the number of gun arrests made by our agency in 2024, along with comparisons with year-end totals for the prior six years. Our officers made an increased number of gun arrests in 2024 compared with the year prior, reflecting the continued, unrelenting efforts of our patrol officers and investigators to hold gun offenders accountable and to remove illegal firearms from our community. These efforts have undoubtedly contributed to the reduction in shooting incidents that our agency reported in 2024.

YEAR-END DATA



Over the past several years, our department has adopted new technology and has begun to better leverage data to guide operational decisions and the allocation of resources, whether related to crime trends or general management. Below, we include preliminary year-end metrics – with comparisons dating back to 2018 – capturing various aspects of our service to the City of Wilmington.

Calls for Service and Community Engagement

This captures the total number of calls for service logged each year, from 2018 through 2024. The second row indicates the combined number of directed patrols (foot patrols) logged by officers and community meetings attended by our police officers.

Clearance Rate for Murder Investigations

Each year, the WPD Criminal Investigations Division records the clearance rate for murder investigations, which is calculated in keeping with the Federal Bureau of Investigation’s Uniform Crime Reporting program and in the same manner as agencies across the country. This rate has typically transcended national averages. The rate for 2024 includes arrests in connection with 23 murders - including 13 that occurred in 2024 and 10 from prior years, in large part through the efforts of our Cold Case Unit.

Victim Services Unit and Youth Response Unit outreach

The WPD Victim Services Unit and Youth Response Unit are civilian teams dedicated to supporting victims of violent crime. They offer a broad range of services, including crisis intervention, emotional support, information, and referrals. Victim Services professionals are available 24/7 to respond to crime scenes and assist victims in navigating the criminal justice system. Specialized services are also provided for victims of domestic violence and Spanish-speaking individuals.

The Youth Response Unit operates as a partnership between the Wilmington Police Department, the Delaware Division of Prevention and Behavioral Health Services, and A Seed of Hope Counseling. This team of clinicians offers free, voluntary trauma assessments and short-term counseling for children and families impacted by traumatic events, whether as victims or witnesses.

It is worth noting that, in recent years and since the implementation of our department's Body-Worn Camera program, video footage has been a valuable tool for investigators who are following up on complaints that are filed.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



The Wilmington Police Department is proud of its continued focus on community engagement over the course of the past year.

Community Engagement Unit

In January 2023, we launched our Community Engagement Unit, which includes 9 police officers - 1 for each of our 9 policing districts - and 2 supervisors. Throughout 2024, members of this team continued to work in their assigned areas each day to interact with residents, troubleshoot neighborhood concerns and build on our engagement efforts throughout our community.

Coffee with a Cop

Each month throughout 2024, WPD officers visited a different coffee shop in Wilmington to spend a morning interacting with residents and visitors as they pick up their morning coffee and bakery treats. We also publicize locations - which are spread throughout the city - and have enjoyed seeing regulars stopping by to talk with officers, ask questions and share safety concerns or issues in their neighborhoods.

Youth Public Safety Academy

In 2024, we once again organized our popular summer enrichment and education program for youth - our annual Youth Public Safety Academy. Formerly our Youth Police Academy, this program was expanded in 2023 to include the Wilmington Fire Department. We had another successful program in 2024, and provided youth with a hands-on introduction to future career opportunities in public service and public safety.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH



Throughout 2024, the Wilmington Police Department continued its core initiatives to support our community.

Community Resource Fairs

Building on the department's prior, once-annual National Night Out, our agency organized three Community Resource Fairs in September 2022. After an outpouring of interest from our partner organizations and the community, we expanded this to be a monthly initiative that has continued throughout 2023 and 2024 - with 24 fairs held since 2022, and as many as 45 social service, public health, government and nonprofit community service partners coming together to extend resources to our community each month.

Programs in 2024 were held at the Police Athletic League of Wilmington, the William "Hicks" Anderson Community Center, the MSK Community Center and city parks located throughout Wilmington. You can learn more and view our 2025 schedule at **WilmingtonDE.gov/ResourceFairs**.

Community Outreach Walks

Since October 2022, Wilmington Police officers have come together with social service and public health partners every Thursday for a one-hour outreach walk. Each week, a location is chosen by WPD sector captains or our community partners, with an eye towards walking in areas where residents could benefit from a variety of resources - as well as areas affected by crime and violence. Our core partners include the Community Partner Support Unit Impact Team based at the Winder Laird Porter State Service Center; the Porter Center Public Health Clinic; the DHSS NCC Mobile Health Unit; Delaware Community Response Teams; the Delaware Department of Services for Children, Youth and their Families; the WPD Youth Response Unit; Westside Family Healthcare; and the Henrietta Johnson Medical Center.

PARTNERS IN CARE CO-RESPONDERS



Under the leadership of Chief Campos, another key focus for our department in 2024 was the launch of our Partners in Care Co-Responder Program through a partnership with ChristianaCare. Following months of research and engagement with partners operating similar models in other communities, we launched this pilot program with a case manager and two trained mental health clinicians who partner with police officers and respond as a team to calls for service.

In less than a full year of operation, we have already seen this program succeed in gaining trust and recognition throughout our community, and in connecting members of the community with critical support in times of crisis. Our committed team has provided assistance during acute crisis situations, and has conducted follow-up and helped to link those in need with resources including referrals for mental health treatment, addiction support and healthcare services; referrals to other social service providers; details about emergency shelter options; and referrals to our WPD Victim Services Unit and Youth Response Unit.

In 2024, **a total of 315 individuals received services** from our Partners in Care team, including 108 new clients in the fourth quarter alone. We encourage you to learn more about our program, and explore our quarterly progress reports, at **WilmingtonDE.gov/PartnersInCare**.



This program is funded in part through the Delaware Criminal Justice Council by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Program.

POLICE OFFICER WELLNESS



Another priority of Chief Campos has been to increase our focus on resources geared towards supporting the health and wellness of our police officers and civilian employees.

For several years, our agency has organized a **Critical Incident Stress Management - Peer Support Team**, which includes sworn and civilian members of our department who complete rigorous training to serve on a team that provides confidential support to members of our department who experience trauma or stress. Our team provides mandatory debriefings following critical incidents, and is available around the clock to support members of our agency. Additionally, in 2023, WPD welcomed **Barry - our Trauma and Wellness Dog** - to our staff. Barry is attached to our Critical Incident Stress Management - Peer Support Team, and is also available to assist our Victim Services Unit and Youth Response Unit to support crime victims and those affected by trauma and violence.

In July 2024, we announced **the launch of a WPD Wellness Program**, which includes six police officers who have been working to identify health and wellness needs and interests, and to identify programs, training and resources to support our current and retired employees. In conjunction with their efforts, we launched a mobile wellness application that provides access to information, resources and referrals to treatment providers to support a wide range of personal and professional challenges that our sworn and civilian employees might encounter.



RECRUITMENT SNAPSHOT



Throughout the past year, the WPD Human Resources Division – under the leadership of Major Anthony Bowers and Captain Andrea Janvier – has worked each day to recruit future police officers.

We are proud of everything that our team has been able to accomplish in 2024, including:

- Completing the 102nd Wilmington Police Academy, which included 7 recruits who graduated on January 5
- Completing the application and selection processes for the 103rd Wilmington Police Academy, which began in July and graduated on December 13. This process drew 77 applicants, and 80% of the recruit class - which consisted of 5 men - are minority recruits, continuing our efforts to make our department more diverse
- Launching the application and selection process for the 104th Wilmington Police Academy, which is due to begin in February 2025. This process saw an increased number of applicants, with a total of 96 individuals submitting applications to join our agency
- Continuing to find new ways to get the word out about our recruiting efforts and hiring processes, and increasing engagement among members of our WPD Recruitment Team with applicants throughout the lengthy selection process



LOOKING FORWARD 2025 OBJECTIVES



As we enter 2025, the Wilmington Police Department continues to work towards further improving departmental operations, and expanding our efforts to support our community, with the following core objectives:

- **Continuing to build on our progress over the past several years in reducing crime and improving public safety** in Wilmington; we have seen sustained reductions in violence related to groups and gangs, and look forward to building on these reductions through the continued implementation of our crime strategies like Group Violence Intervention, as well as through the tireless efforts of our police officers and investigators.
- **Continuing to grow our Partners in Care Co-Responder Program;** launched as a pilot initiative in 2024, this program has already made an impact in our community, and we look forward to seeing this great work continue, and to exploring ways to expand our team in the future.
- **Continuing to support our community** through our monthly Community Resource Fairs; weekly Community Outreach Walks; and monthly Coffee with a Cop programs, as well as the work of our Community Engagement Unit and each of our units and teams.
- Exploring **additional resources and tools** to support the health and wellness of our police officers, as well as all of our employees, through our newly established Wellness Program.
- Continuing our efforts to **recruit future Wilmington Police officers.**

We look forward to working towards achieving these objectives!
