Aquilla Delaware (New Castle)	Funding will be used to provide treatment, housing and support services including job training and long-term employment placement to individuals in recovery.	\$450,000
ARS (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the operation of ARS' opioid wound care clinic	\$100,000
Attack Addiction (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) Statewide	Funding will be used to support a state-wide media initiative focused on delivering messages to high-risk population. Messages will include opioid prevention and education, how to link to support services and where to visit to access in person services.	\$300,000
Brandywine Counseling (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support the operation of the Center's wound clinic specialized to treat injection wound sites including advanced wounds resulting from Xylazine use.	\$390,000
Christiana Care (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support an expansion of the hospital's social work unit. This expansion will support discharge planning for individuals in active addiction to outpatient treatment.	\$100,000
Claymont CTC (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support CTC's expansion of comprehensive support services to help clients overcome social determinant barriers increasing compliance with treatment.	\$375,000
Claymont Renaissance (New Castle)	Funding will be used to offer residents and 2 identified target neighborhoods enhanced access to treatment and harm reduction through outreach by certified peers and support specialist.	\$150,000
CMS (New Castle)	Funding will be used to repurpose CMS' vacant facility in New Castle Delaware to create a resource hub to address various social determinants of health needs within the local community for individuals with opioid use disorder.	\$187,000
Code Purple Kent (Kent)	Funding will be used to expand the success of code purple into Kent County. Code purple operates three (3) group homes and offers support to individuals and families experiencing homelessness, escaping domestic violence and transitioning from incarceration.	\$500,000
Conexio (Kent)	Funding will be used to support an organizational expansion through the opening and operation of a Wellness and recovery access program, trauma informed, recovery-	\$400,000

Congo Tarir Project (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the establishment of a resource hub in an opportunity zone in Wilmington. The resource hub will be focused on youth and their families by providing opioid misuse education and prevention information. The hub will also offer anti-opioid and other drug interventions in an environment that provides alternative activities known to prevent and decrease opioid use disorder in high-risk communities.	\$475,000
CORAS (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to expand CORAS' MOU participants program (known as <i>ON-RAMP</i>). The program operates throughout the state of Delaware and is designed 2 functions as a safety net to keep individuals engaged and in compliance with their recovery plans.	\$450,000
Delaware Center Justice (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support the CJC 's transitional reentry services program. The program is designed to maintain continuity of care for high-need, high-risk reentrants experiencing opioid use disorder, including those with chronic health needs.	\$400,000
Delaware Center Justice – Reentry Supports (Statewide)	Funding will be used to address the challenges created by the opioid crisis by providing financial assistance to support the recovery of individuals reentering the community. The assistance will focus on the provision of the Social Determinants of Health	\$400,000
Delaware Chiropractic Society (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support provider education and outreach regarding chiropractic and pain management options as it relates to the opioid crisis. The funding will be used for print and social media campaign to help educate individuals with chronic pain of the dangers of opioid use and how to seek alternative solutions to pain management.	\$35,589
Delaware Division of Substance Use and Mental Health (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support recovery scholarships that include access to resources and the social determinants of health categories which may include: housing, transportation, food security, education and job training.	\$600,000
Delaware Health Equity Coalition (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the expansion and operation of a clinic within an underserved area in Wilmington. The clinic will provide supports to individuals with Opioid Use Disorder, while also serving as a training site for clinical professionals who provide services with individual with Opioid Use Disorder.	\$450,000

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Delaware Restaurant Association (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to create and implement a recovery friendly workplace initiative within Delaware 's restaurant community. The initiative will support individuals in the restaurant industry, a population that research shows to have high opioid use disorder rates. The initiative will also support Delaware restaurant owners by helping to keep their employees in recovery through supports and referrals to treatment when necessary.	\$100,000
Delaware State University (DSU) (New Castle and Kent)	Funding will be used to support DSU's Primary Prevention and Resilience Promotion Program. The program will serve between 50-100 high school students 9th through 12th grade. The students will be engaged twice a week in peer led educational opportunities structured to create an anti-opioid peer force throughout the high school community.	\$100,000
Food Bank (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to reduce food insecurity among people in recovery from Opioid Use Disorder. The assistance will be provided through the Food Bank's healthy pantry center and mobile pantry programs.	\$63,642
Guadenzia (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support a women's program that includes accommodations for seven (7) female heads of households with opioid use disorder who are completing residential treatment.	\$200,000
IMAC - Interdenominational Ministry Action Council (New Castle)	Funds will be used to support the council 's activities focused on outreach and prevention education in underserved areas regarding the dangers of opioid misuse. The council will also educate individuals regarding the benefits of carrying naloxone and provide training in the administration of the reversal agent. The target population will focus on those who have the least access to services including those at the federal poverty level and those reentering the community from incarceration.	\$200,000
LEEP (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support a Pathways to Employment program for individuals who are in recovery or at high risk for opioid use disorder. The program monitors each participant for opioid and other drug use and functions as a referral agency as well as a support system to prevent those in the program from relapse or initial use. Participants	\$400,000

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Limen House (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support a recovery Resource Center (drop-in Center) for individuals who struggle with Opioid Use Disorders. The drop-in center will be instrumental in keeping individuals in recovery by offering various support services in real time.	\$300,000
Next Step Foundation LLC (New Castle)	Funding will be used to provide transportation services, awareness campaigns, education and prevention programming and access to alternative pain management providers and connecting clients to additional resources that will improve their overall Wellness and maintain recovery.	\$100,000
Our Youth (New Castle)	Funding will be used to establish housing in an underserved area in Wilmington. The project will consist of four (4) townhomes that will be committed for a minimum of 10 years to use for individuals transitioning out of inpatient recovery. Placement in the homes will be guided by state agencies and licensed and state licensed treatment organizations.	\$450,000
Phoenix Family (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the organization's ongoing efforts related to the social determinants of health, including job training, educational opportunities, clothing closets, food resources and another support services to help individuals with Opioid Use Disorder remain in recovery.	\$100,000
Psychotherapeutic PSI (Kent)	Funding will be used to support the creation of an opiate ambassador program to serve Kent County. This program will include assistance to first responders, school staff and classrooms, PTA community groups, church groups, women 's and men's groups, after school and daycare providers and other community groups and families.	\$450,000
Richard J. Caron Foundation (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding to be used to support education and training to increase awareness of the opioid epidemic. The target population will be adults 65 and older within a state of Delaware. The project will have accompanying research to study examined knowledge attitudes behaviors and adherence to prescription medication especially surrounding opioids for older adults in Delaware.	\$100,000
Roberto Clemente Baseball (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the organization and providing opioid use prevention and education to youth within its Wilmington community. This long-standing program provides alternatives to drugs and opioids by offering healthy options for kids to engage in while learning about the dangers of drug and opioid use.	\$100,000

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Rodney Street Tennis and Tutoring Association (New Castle)	Funding will be used to support the Tennis and Tutoring Association's drug prevention program. The program empowers youth ages 5 to 18 to make informed decisions regarding drug and opioid use through a comprehensive curriculum. The program combines the power of sports-based youth development programs and evidence-based programs that build resilience and life skills by promoting healthy alternatives to drug use.	\$100,000
Seaford – Laurel Police Dept (Sussex)	Funding will be used to secure a service dog to assist those who experience an overdose event in person. The service dog will help the individuals on the scene with the trauma associated with overdoses.	\$2,625
SL Unlocks the Light Foundation (New Castle, Kent & Sussex) (Statewide)	Funding will be used to support the expansion of the Program's services from Newark to other areas in the state of Delaware. The program's mission is to educate, assist and support young people navigating mental illness and substance abuse by removing stigmas around depression, anxiety and seeking help. The program proposes adding three (3) program locations, one in each County (New castle, Kent and Sussex).	\$320,000
St. Albert Family Clinic and Services (New Castle and Kent)	Funding will be used to train and educate at least 100 individuals in life skills, enabling them to reintegrate into society and lead productive lives. Through an integrated network and comprehensive approach, the program impacts the opioid crisis by reducing opioid misuse, improving access to treatment, and fostering long-term recovery in the communities surrounding the Smyrna area.	\$100,000
Supporting Kidds (New Castle and Kent)	Funding will be used to support the expansion of a program designed assist families who are experiencing grief from overdoses. The focus will be on the kids who lose their parents from overdoses. While the children are the focus, other members of the family, such as grandparents and surviving partners, are included and engaged in the grief counseling process.	\$300,000
Sussex County Health Coalition (Sussex)	Funding will be used to support Delaware Goes Purple with a "yes I narCan" lifesaving campaign. The campaign is targeted to harm reduction through Narcan distribution with a strong focus on individual households.	\$300,000
The Way Home (Sussex)	Funding will be used to support access to stable and affordable housing for reentrants upon release. The project offers ten (10) beds exclusively for reentrants. The individual participants will receive individualized treatment plans, case management services and peer services, all designed to mitigate against risk factors.	\$181,240
What is your Voice (Sussex)	Funding will be used to expand support services in Sussex County to assist individuals in active addiction and recovery by providing access to necessary wrap around services.	\$250,000
