Any BCHS student who was involved in the incident will be disciplined in accordance to Board Policy and the Bullitt County Public Schools Code of Conduct. There were also several rumors that were started Friday night on social media, none of which were true or verified with local law enforcement.

These few students are in no way a representation of the over 200 students that were dressed up in spirit wear, inside the football complex representing our school and cheering on their classmates. At no point were any of our students inside the football complex unsafe on Friday night. Rest assured we will not tolerate inappropriate behavior from any students.

We will continue to review our security and supervision plan to ensure everyone's safety. To help us maintain a safe, positive, and supportive atmosphere, please have conversations with your students about appropriate behaviors at Bullitt Central athletic events. Thank you to all those students and community members who continue to show up and represent our school in a positive way.
