Call to Order

- Peggy: I just wanted to give a special thanks to the work that goes on behind the scenes; everyone has been putting a lot of work into getting these proposals ready. Great job!

Faculty and Off-Campus Programming - Jared Boland

Music

• Soph Budget

- o 27 Sophs, uniform expense per Soph: \$97.76
- o Met all of the uniform requirements; still waiting for a quote on the sweater.

• Incoming Student Budget

- o 37.1% on merchandise and 56.5% (of total including grant) on programming
- o 3% is miscellaneous, and 3.4% contingent
- Numbers could change as there needs to be some restructuring to get closer to a 50/50 split.

Programming

- o Features: ice cream social, starlight stage coffee house,
- o Q Dr. Bartlett: is there refrigeration for ice cream?
 - ACTION: Jared to double check that there is refrigeration for ice cream at all events that require it.

Faculty Day Programming

- o Breakfast, division meetings, student ensemble performances, scavenger hunt.
- o make sure we have dairy-free and kosher options for all ice-cream events.
- Completed all the recommended Faculty Day programming, and almost all CAS standards
 - Jared to chat with Naomi about how CAS standards relate to their programming

Science

- Theme confirmed, no copyright infringement
- Soph Budget
 - o 84 Sophs, uniform expenses per Soph: \$95.07
 - o meets all policy requirements
- **Incoming Student Budget** 48.1% on merchandise, and 45.7% on programming, 5.85% contingency
- Concern: USB sticks have been included as a programming expense, and are only partially subsidized by council.
 - o Jared: why is it only being partially subsidized by council instead of a gift?

- o The information pertaining to this is on the website
- Q: what about dog tags? Technically, wouldn't giving out dog tags during programmed events be a similar issue?
- Discussion is tabled for now.

Programming

o Features: Tri-Sci Dance, Super Student Talent Show, dodgeball.

• Faculty Day Programming

- o Welcome (Head Soph speech, council presentation), rotation based afternoon
- o Completed all of their recommended programming
- o CAS hit at least 50% in each domain
- Rich: let's re-address O-Pass sales. If council is partially funding extra merchandise, is that justified?
- Peggy: there may be some unused funds, and students are unaware that they are paying for a portion of the USB sticks. Their O-Pass is \$90, whereas USB sticks will only cost \$2.
- Dr. Bartlett: If this is a traditional practice and generally contributes to something useful, I don't consider this an issue.
- Eddy: Clarification of the issue: extra merchandise is given to some students depending
 on their faculty, and because the council grants that make-up additional funding are only
 partial, we cannot necessarily say that all students getting extra merchandise have been
 gifted it.
- Eddy: most budgets can be re-worked to account for the extra merchandise as a gift.
- Papy: I think the USB could be technically classified as programming as it is a resource that relates to specific programming event and it's practical for the students.
- Dr. Bartlett: this has become a slightly consistent practice and does not produce issues, for that reason I find it acceptable. **CONSENSUS**

Soph Budget

- o 88 Sophs, uniform expense per Soph: \$97.26
- o meets all requirements

• Incoming Student Budget

- o 43% on merchandise, 41.4% on programming, 15.6% contingency
- o Quite a large contingency, Jared to resolve.
- ACTION: Jared to reach out and resolve the large contingency in the Social Science Incoming Student Budget.

Huron

- Budget
 - o With grant: Merchandise 18.3%, programming 81.6%
 - o Without grant: Merchandise 53.1%
 - Eddy recommended that they get rid of one merchandise item (water bottle) to bring them closer to the 60/40 split.

 - Residual to the look into Escape Room pricing to make sure we are getting the best deal.

Budget

- Brescia has a large council grant the last 30% of the budget is coming out of the grant fund, not the O-Pass sales.

 Love at King's, Movie Night, OC Sleepover.
 - OC Scavenger Hunt
 - Scavenger Hunt' is permitted.
