## **Publication Schedule**

## Tariq

- \$60,000 in advertising revenue last year to \$34,000 in revenue this year so far
- Prepares the incoming Front Office for a changed publication schedule

# Greaves

- If we had been doing one issue/week in the fall, we would have covered expenses and had \$5,000 in the bank
- This is a move motivated by advertising cost concerns

#### Menard

Are there any obligations based on student fees?

## Nick

- No

## MacAdam

- Do you think you'll see any feedback from advertisers? Will you see further decline?

## Greaves

- I don't think so; we don't see a tonne of advertising pre-booked in
- Most advertisers were only placing an ad once a week right now
- About three classified advertisers who booked for the year; they will need a bit of a refund but that's fine
- Ad revenue has been on a steep decline; we lost three key advertisers

## Amarnath

- Who is twice a week?

## Greaves

- We're the only one that's more than once-a-week in Canada
- Even some newspapers in the United States who were five times a week have been cutting production

#### MacAdam

- Any advertising on digital platforms?

## Greaves

- It has increased; it's a bit of a bright spot this year
- We have explored advertorials, for example, Masonville was a test for this model
- The problem with digital, is it's hard to figure out what to price it at in order to stay competitive

## Amarnath

- What kind of paper would we be able to come out with once a week?

## Tariq

- We're looking into a 16-pager.
- In terms of content production, we're not changing any targets in that regard and still hope to work on a digital daily schedule

## Menard

- Devil's advocate; Why even have a print edition?

## Greaves

- Advertising is one thing but that's not a strong argument these days
- Having a print product sets you apart from just having a digital product; it lends some credibility to the organization

## Tariq

- Print pick-up this year has been phenomenal, we've seen copies in the UCC disappear at good rates
- Students are paying for a student newspaper so there is an obligation to provide one

## Menard

- It's important to have data in place to justify the print product

# Greaves

- Pick-up rate has improved when we've gone down to twice a week
- At first, I thought they were stolen
- Robert has gone to take some out some of the copies in Social Science that are sort of obscured to put them in the UCC

#### Menard

- It's important to train journalists for the future

# Tariq

- The *Gazette* has released its first documentary that was 14-minutes long; it's available on social media
- Projects like this, do take people away from print

## Farfan

- Could the drop in advertising be a result of moving away from 4 times a week?

## Greaves

- I don't think so, usually people would place just one ad a week
- A lot of people are trying to explore experiential advertising like going into the UCC atrium

#### Menard

- The internal cannibalization of advertising; as the *Gazette* advertising goes down, the UCC atrium advertising goes up

## Amarnath

- How many people are still in the office?

## Tariq

- The majority of the work is still done in the office
- The creative sections need the equipment and software that's available in the office
- The writing sections still conduct their interviews and write their stories within the office

## MacAdam

- Create an editorial plan for what a weekly Gazette is going to look like
- What kind of content is going to be in that issue

#### Tariq

- That's the reason I want to do it in January so we can begin to create a plan of action
- It also sets the future front office up for success

## Greaves

- The paper has already began to move toward more long-form in the past year

#### Metlin

In terms of social media numbers, the evidence seems to say that people are reading breaking news stories online rather than in print

# BE IT RESOLVED that the *Gazette* will move down to a once-a-week print publication schedule in January — Passes unanimously

# EIC Report - Mid-Year Report

## Tariq

- It gives a brief look about how first semester has gone
- It will hopefully also give future front offices an idea of how things have gone in the first semester
- 14 features and investigate pieces over the past term
- We've crossed a million views on the website
- We've grown on all social media platforms
- Generally, we have some of the highest Facebook engagement in the country, rivaled by *Ubyssey* but they have 10,000 Facebook likes
- Western TV has integrated well into the *Gazette*, they've grown 70% on Facebook this year and have hit over 60,000 video views
- Graphics has been one of the strongest sections this year
- Merging the photo and video sections into multimedia was not one of the most successful changes but they have been better
- Community section in Opinions have been good

# Manager Report - Greaves

- Mostly focuses in on ad revenue
- Hopefully the move down to once-a-week will help with advertising revenues
- We're hoping that we can compete more competitively with Western News now
- We've revamped our webpages for advertising
- Everything has been going well
- Editorial is giving us our pages in good time now
- We're talking with people in the newsroom now which is good in terms of collaboration

# **Budget Update - Tariq**

- Same that was taken to the *Gazette* working group
- After meeting with the USC, there can be a better picture presented to the committee
- There's still a big staff contingent at the *Gazette* that needs to be considered in order to operate the *Gazette* at its current levels
- Budgets are due Dec. 16

- Are there going to be anymore working group meetings?

# Tariq

- I think we can have one more working group meeting in January before we take it to council

# Election procedure discussion

## Tariq

- One vote per person was moved and created last year
- I thought the method that we had previously with tier voting should be explored again
- Editors and volunteers have very different time commitments and editors are more informed on voting
- Should we consider a hiring process?
- I think having editors have two votes and volunteers have one vote would be beneficial

## MacAdam

- What's changing here?

## Tariq

- Editors and Front Office would get a vote that's weighed by two while volunteers would get one vote

#### Menard

- Last year, it was changed to one vote per person

## Tariq

- Now that the managing editors have been specified to digital and print, there should be more of a vetting process for the positions

## Farfan

- Why should the editor-in-chief be elected whereas the managing editors are not? It's not a democracy, it's a newspaper

## Tariq

- The EIC sets the direction the paper

## MacAdam

- Is the distinction that the EIC sets the strategic vision of the paper?

## Tariq

- I think the tiered vote system can alleviate any concerns

## Menard

- Personally, I'm not a fan of the hiring policy recommendation
- I think it's going to be a challenge for students who are in this position to take on a HR role
- It's been an issue that factions have elevated people in the past
- I do like a democratic approach because I think there is value in forcing people together who may not align in terms of strategic visions
- I don't like overvaluing some people over others; I think the threshold for voting was very low for voting
- I am not necessarily opposed to allowing section editors to have a weighted vote
- The idea of proxy voting can be challenging; if you have two qualified candidates for EIC and someone drops down, they could not have been voted for

## MacAdam

- Have you considered a ranked ballot?
- Maybe it's also worthwhile to have an HR person in the room during the question and answer session who can get a sense of how they would manage people

## Tariq

- There are some issues with the question and answer periods; targeted questions
- Somebody might be a good talker on the day of the election can swing the vote

#### Menard

- I understand the spirit of the motion

# Metlin

- I think there have been cliques and factions in place in the past
- The volunteers are going to be editors next year

#### Lear

- Editors in the office simply have a better idea of what the jobs are

It's just making the educated people in the room have a tiered voting

#### Farfan

- I may be alone in this, but if you want the most qualified person why not hire?

## Metlin

- Many student newspapers elect all of their editors, let alone the management positions

# Tariq

- It's unprecedented to remove a Front Office so we need to figure out how we can ensure that we have quality people

## Menard

- I think we're targeting the symptoms and not the problem in the end
- Maybe the elections are a symptom of poor engagement with volunteers and staff members

#### Farfan

- If we're going to have a democratic system, maybe we should increase the threshold for allowing people to vote?

#### Menard

- I want to make sure we're ensuring that people are going into the election with a good idea of what the positions are
- I am a big proponent of the one vote per person system

## MacAdam

- I agree with the one vote per person system

## Greaves

- I think ramping up the requirement to be able to vote
- Maybe the committee has a ratification process

# Tariq

- Maybe there can be a petition to ensure that candidates who win are alright

## Metlin

- The ranked balloting is something that could be meaningful
- I think we also need to look at the proxy voting

#### Menard

 Maybe we can put the EIC candidates on a ranked ballot to ensure that the potential for them to be candidates in the lower two positions

- I think this something that we should decide before January
- Maybe this is something we can't implement this year

# Tariq

- In October, we had to remove one of our editors for the board
- We ran it by USC HR to ensure that we were going through the process correctly
- It was one of the most difficult things we've had to do all year
- Another person was put on probation as well
- The person who was let go, did go to HR
- We were supported in our decision making process as well
- I'm working with Carla, the HR manager of the USC, on training Front Office members on HR policy and management
- We are also looking into conflict of interest policies to determine who can supervise who
