

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING DISTRICTS FOR THE CITY OF
EVANSVILLE, INDIANA, PURSUANT TO THE 2020 CENSUS

Whereas, the City of Evansville, Indiana ("City") has a population between 34,000 and 599,999 citizens, according to the 2020 census, and is therefore classified as a second-class city for state law purposes under Indiana Code 36-4-1-1;

Whereas, Indiana Code § 36-4-6-3 requires that the legislative body adopt an ordinance during 2022 to divide the City into districts that meet the following requirements:

- (1) The districts must be composed of contiguous territory;
- (2) The districts must be reasonably compact;
- (3) The districts must contain, as nearly as possible, equal population;

Whereas, the Common Council is the legislative body of the City by virtue of state law (Indiana Code § 36-4-6-2);

Whereas, Indiana Code § 36-4-6-3 sets forth that the Common Council shall consist of six (6) members elected from districts and three (3) members elect at large;

Whereas, the City approaches redistricting for the 2023 elections and thereafter utilizing the 2020 decennial census data;

Whereas, the Common Council has, at a public meeting of the Council, provided an opportunity for all members of the Common Council and voters of the City to comment and make suggestions concerning the City's districts in this Ordinance;

Whereas, the Common Council has examined the district boundaries set forth in this Ordinance and finds that the districts (1) are composed of continuous territory; (2) are reasonably compact; (3) contain, as nearly as is possible, equal population; and (4) do not cross precinct boundary lines, except as provided in subsection (c) or (d) of Indiana Code § 36-4-6-3.

Now, there, be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Evansville, Indiana, as follows:

Section 1. District Map. The Common Council divides the City into districts outlined in the attached Exhibit A (the "2022 Evansville District Map – A") and Exhibit B (the "2022 Evansville Redistricting Map Report"), and adopts such map by reference in this Ordinance.

Section 2. Inspection of Map. Two (2) copies of the 2022 Evansville District Map are on file in the office of the City Clerk for public inspection as required by Indiana Code § 36-1-5-4.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall forward a signed copy of this Ordinance to the Circuit Court Clerk of Vanderburgh County and shall request the Clerk to include the copy of this Ordinance in the records of the Vanderburgh County Election Board.

Section 4. All ordinances are repealed which conflict with this ordinance to the extent of that conflict.

Section 5. Should any provision (section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or any other portion) of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, the remaining provision or provisions shall not be affected, if and only if such remaining provisions can, without the invalid provision or provisions, be given the effect intended by the Common Council in adopting this ordinance. To this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

Section 6. As provided by Indiana Code § 36-4-6-14, this Ordinance takes effect when signed by the presiding officer of the Common Council and either approved by the Mayor or passed over the Mayor's veto by the Common Council under Indiana Code § 36-4-6-16.




