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HOW TO ENTER

Read the general Rules and Regulations on page 3.

The Premium Book can only be viewed online at www.allentownfairpa.org.

You may enter as many items as you wish for one fee of \$12. However, see the rules for the appropriate Department(s) for limits within each category. Culinary contests are included in this fee.

Read through the Department categories to find the proper classification of your entry.

The Registration Forms on pages 31-32 MUST be filled out and preferably mailed to the Entry Clerk - Culinary Registration Form on Pages 29-30 - Youth Registration Form on Pages 27-28. Additional Registration Sheets can be downloaded at www.allentownfair.com.

REGISTRATION

Registration by mail closes July 28, 2025. No on-site registration. Send Registration Form and \$12 cash or check made payable to Allentown Fair Entries. In the case of a returned/bad check, a \$12 fee will be charged.

MAIL EARLY - WE ONLY ACCEPT MAIL ENTRIES - NO ONSITE REGISTRATION

You will receive your entry tags by mail **[DO NOT WRITE ON ENTRY TAGS UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED]** to be attached to each article entered, before the article is brought in for competition, and a receipt good for five (5) gate admission passes for the Fair.

Bring your exhibit(s) to Agri~Plex, with the tags attached, on the dates and times listed for each Department. Photographs and paintings must be framed, wired and ready to hang or they will not be accepted. Your receipt will be validated and may then be exchanged for the gate admission passes.

Exhibits must remain on display through Labor Day, Monday, September 1, 2025.

Exhibits must be picked up on Tuesday, September 2 between 8AM and 6PM.

NO FREE RIDE ON TAXES

It still comes as a great surprise to many people when told the Allentown Fairgrounds is not a public park or playground. The land upon which the Allentown Fair is held each year and the structures to display its exhibits are owned by members of the Lehigh County Agricultural Society.

General Rules and Regulations

ENTRIES

All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Allentown Fair.

Fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgment may determine.

Entries made under a fictitious or assumed name will be ineligible for any premium.

No judge will be allowed to exhibit in any department in which he or she is employed as a judge.

No employee of the Allentown Fair will be eligible for any premium in any department in which he or she is employed.

Exhibits, if mailed or shipped, must be sent prepaid in an appropriate envelope to: Allentown Fair, 302 N. 17th St., Allentown, PA 18104.

Members of the Society and their children under age 19 may enter articles free of charge, except in Departments 2, 3, 4, 5, 6.

ALL REGISTRATIONS MUST BE MADE BY MAIL.

Exhibitors in Depts. 8, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 23 who are not members of the Society will be required to pay a registration fee of \$12 in return for which the exhibitor will receive a receipt for 5 gate admission passes to the Fair. **This receipt will be exchanged for the gate passes after the articles have been presented for exhibition to the attendants of the departments and the receipt has been stamped.**

No registration fees will be refunded after registrations are made.

Please refer to the specific instructions under the appropriate Department(s) of each article for the dates exhibits must be in place.

Entry clerks will accept registrations only for those items appearing in the The Allentown Fair Premium List.

All exhibits must have cards attached showing the entry number as recorded in the entry books at the Society's office.

Decisions of the entry clerks are final and the entry clerks have the right to limit the numbers of entries in any department.

All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the Fair.

All grain, fruits, vegetables and flowers must be grown by the exhibitors.

****NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AND NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER MONDAY, JULY 28, 2025****

REGISTRATION BY MAIL

Mail registrations are required and are to be sent to Allentown Fair, 302 N. 17th St., Allentown, PA 18104 and should be clearly marked "ENTRY." Registrations must be received no later than July 28, 2025 in order to be accepted. **Fee must accompany registration.**

CARE OF EXHIBITS

Every care will be taken to protect the articles exhibited, but the Society will not in any way be responsible for ACCIDENTS, LOSS OR DAMAGE BY WATER, FIRE, THEFT, OR OTHER, WHATEVER THE CAUSE OR EXTENT OF THE DAMAGE OR LOSS.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits in Depts. 8,11,12,13,14,15,17,18,19,20, 21 and 23 **MUST REMAIN ON THE GROUNDS** until 8AM ON TUESDAY, SEPT. 2, NO EXCEPTIONS. Exhibits **MUST** be removed on Tuesday, Sept. 2, from 8AM to 6PM. The Society will **NOT** be responsible for any exhibits after 6PM on Tuesday, Sept. 2, 2025.

If exhibits are not picked up at by this time they will be discarded.

FORFEIT OF PREMIUMS

No one will be allowed to interfere with judges. Any person interfering, by letter or otherwise, will be excluded from competition and forfeit all premiums awarded.

PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS

All premiums will be paid to winning exhibitors by check and available during removal of exhibits on Tuesday, Sept. 2.

Any discrepancies must be reported by MAIL to the Fair Office before September 30, 2025. NO EXCEPTIONS. Entry tags must be included in the mailing to correct any errors.

The judges will award premiums only on articles listed in the premium list. The decisions of a judge shall be final.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR EXHIBITS REJECTED FOR NOT CONFORMING WITH FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS.

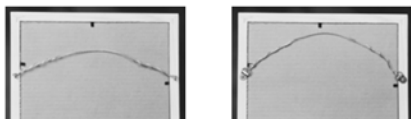
