

Summer Camp Protocols

General Information

- All campers, staff and family members visiting BGA are asked to wash hands, check their temperature beforehand and stay home if temperature is above 100.4°F.
- All campers, staff and family members visiting BGA are asked to stay home if showing any signs of illness.
- Campers, staff, and family members must be symptom free for 14 days before coming to campus.
- Campers must arrive on time for camp due to the highly structured set up. Campers who are late will not be allowed to attend camp that day unless we have formal notification from a parent/guardian at least 24 hours in advance of the expected tardiness.
- Be aware of and disclose any potential contact with affected individuals.
- Wash and sanitize your hands often.
- Do not touch your face, eyes, or mouth with unclean hands.
- Practice physical distancing at all times.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your elbow if you cough or sneeze.
- Locker Rooms will be closed. Students need to arrive ready to participate.
- If a camper is not compliant with physical distancing measures, they will be removed from the camp and spoken to regarding compliance. If this happens a second time, the camper will be asked to leave the camp. A meeting with parents, camp instructor, and the director of camps must take place before the camper will be allowed to return to a BGA Camp.
- Parents and campers will need to complete additional paperwork before the beginning of camp. We will send you an email notification when this document is ready for you to complete.
- In a situation where we have a camper or camp instructor who tests positive for COVID-19 we will send an email to the campers in the affected camp.
- Any camper having to miss camp because of a COVID-19 disruption will be refunded an appropriately prorated amount.

Registration

- All registrations must take place online at least one week before the beginning of camp. Camp Registration will close on at 9 AM one week before the start of camp. Virtual Camp Registrations will close on Friday at 9 AM prior to camp beginning.
- On the Friday before the start of a camp, All campers must complete a COVID-19 Waiver and Compliance Statement.

Summer Camp Protocols

Drop Off

- Campers, staff, and family members must be symptom free for 14 days before coming to campus.
- Camp drop off will take place at the location of the camp. Please make use of the campus map to identify the drop off location.
- The initial health screening will take place at drop off including the taking temperature.
- All campers will be subject to daily temperature tests.
- Anyone dropping off a camper should remain in the car and maintain physical distancing at all times while on campus.
- BGA discourages carpooling to campus. Please limit when possible.
- It is preferred to have one designated parent/guardian execute pick up and drop off.
- Student drop off and pick up will take place at the designated camp location.
- We will send an email a week prior to camp communicating the camp location among other pertinent information and reminders.
- Campers will enter camp through one entry point and exit through a separate area. We will communicate this information before the start of camp.
- Camp Instructors and Counselors will be present at their camp drop off location 30 minutes prior to the start of camp.

During Camp

- All campers must check in at the temperature check in station before participating in any camp activity.
- Coaches will wear masks during all instructional times when they may not be able to properly socially distance from campers.
- We will provide ample hand sanitizer and hand washing opportunities (proper hygiene will be practiced every 15-30 minutes). You can bring your own hand sanitizer as well. Please label the hand sanitizer bottle with the camper's first and last name.
- No more than 9 campers to 1 instructor in a designated camp space.
- Individual bathrooms will be open for use.
- Campers need to bring their own water bottle labeled with their first and last name.
- Campers will be organized by grade level during each camp and lunch to minimize potential contact with a wider cross section of campers.
- Campers and parents are not allowed to congregate on BGA's campus at any time.
- Six foot physical distancing will take place in all camp spaces.

Summer Camp Protocols

Indoor Camps

- BGA camp instructors will wear face masks when instructing campers in a setting where physical distancing may not be possible.
- Six foot physical distancing will take place in all camp spaces.
- No personal belongings will be stored indoors. Personal belongings can be stored outside the facility spaced six feet apart.

Lunch

- Lunch will be served in pre-packaged containers or wrapping. Lunch will be served outside and physical distancing will be required during lunch.
- Campers will be organized by grade level during each camp and lunch to minimize potential contact with a wider cross section of campers.
- Six foot physical distancing will take place in all camp spaces including lunch.

Pick Up

- Campers, staff, and family members must be symptom free for 14 days before coming to campus.
- All campers must be picked up within 10 minutes of the end of camp. If a situation arises where you are not able to pick up within 10 minutes of camp conclusion, please contact Jonas Rodriguez at 615-300-5597 .
- Student drop off and pick up will take place at the designated camp location. We will send an email a week prior to camp communicating the camp location among other pertinent information and reminders.
- BGA discourages carpooling to campus. Please limit when possible. It is preferred to have one designated parent/guardian execute pick up and drop off.
- Campers and parents are not allowed to congregate on BGA's campus at any time.
