



Key Takeaways from Testing

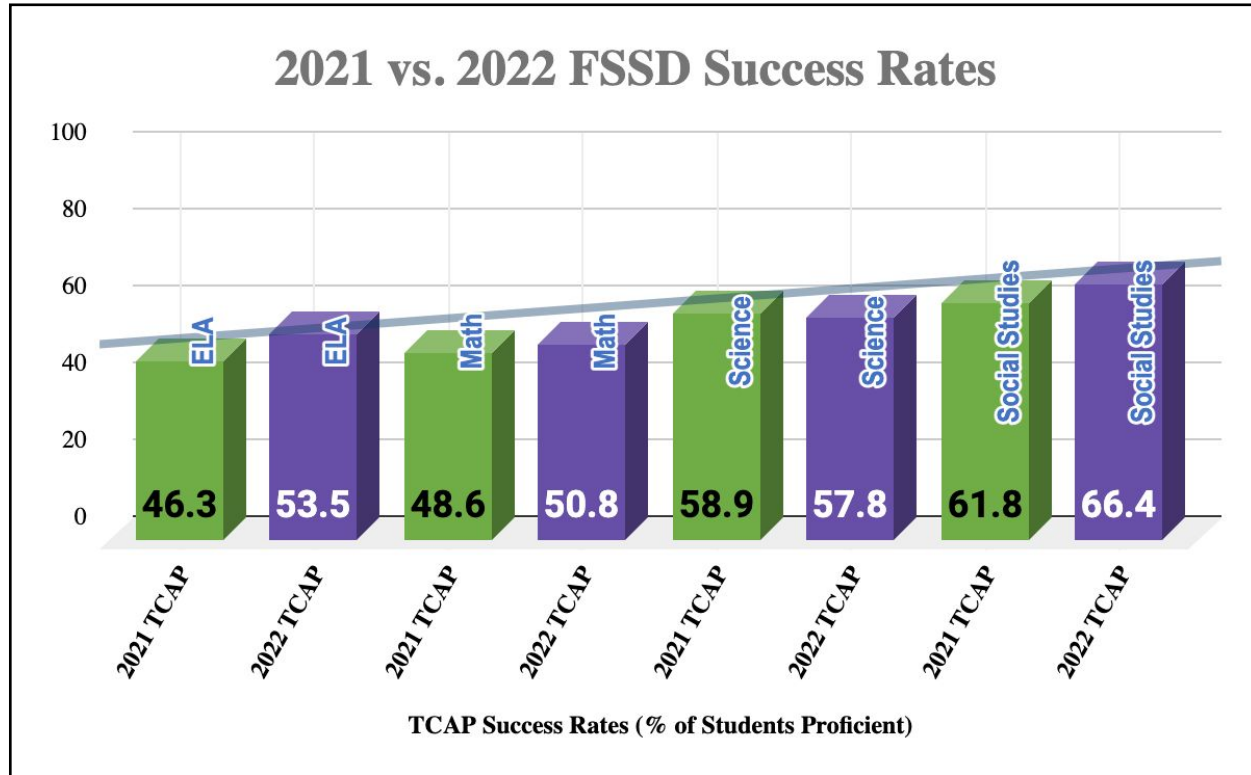
FSSD maintained its long history of outperforming the state in every grade level and subject area. In fact, the district as a whole outperformed the proficiency percentage of the state by double digits in every core content area:

- **English/Language Arts = 17% higher than the state proficiency percentage**
- **Math = 20% higher**
- **Science = 17% higher**
- **Social Studies = 23% higher**



Key Takeaways from Testing

FSSD improved its proficiency percentage in 3 of 4 subject areas from 2021 to 2022, including a 7% increase in Literacy proficiency!



Key Takeaways from Testing - Achievement



- **ELA Met or Exceeded Expectations in ALL grade levels, achieving at even higher levels than pre-pandemic.**
- 4th grade ELA rose 7% over last year, and 21% higher than the state average.
- 7th grade math scores increased from 40% met or exceeded expectations in 2021 to 49%
- Math scores for ALL STUDENTS rose from 51% met or exceeded expectations in 2021 to 53% met or exceeded expectations in 2022.
- **FSSD is among the top 10 of Tennessee districts for achievement across all subject areas.**

Key Takeaways from TVAAS Results - Growth



- All tested grades showed growth met or exceeded expectations in **science** and **social studies**, achieving a Level 3, 4 or 5. Additionally, the FSSD scored a Level 5 overall in BOTH of those subject areas.
- While grades 4 and 5 performed well in math, students in grades 6-8 grew less than expected, in comparison to their peers across the state.



Key Takeaways from TVAAS Results - ELA



- ELA (English Language Arts) across grade levels scored at a Level 3 on TVAAS, showing that our students met expected growth in reading, writing, and grammar.
- 4th grade is the first year for TVAAS results since students have previous data for comparison in determining growth. Our 4th grade ELA was a Level 4, showing better than expected growth.
- 7th grade ELA had the highest growth in ELA, scoring at a Level 5.

Only ELA and Math are included in TVAAS results for school and district accountability for the 2021-22 school year. The FSSD received a Level 1 for the combined ELA and Math growth of our students in comparison.



TVAAS vs. FSSD Individual Student Growth Measures



- **FSSD Achievement Scores are among the Top 10 in the State.**
- TVAAS scores compare FSSD student growth against growth of students across Tennessee with non-comparable achievement rates.
- While TVAAS gives us one measurement point, we know our students are high achievers, so we look for an apples to apples comparison of student growth.
- FSSD administers nationally normed testing each year – aligned to the Tennessee Academic Standards – to provide us with a clear look at how much our students grow from fall to spring, which tells a different story.

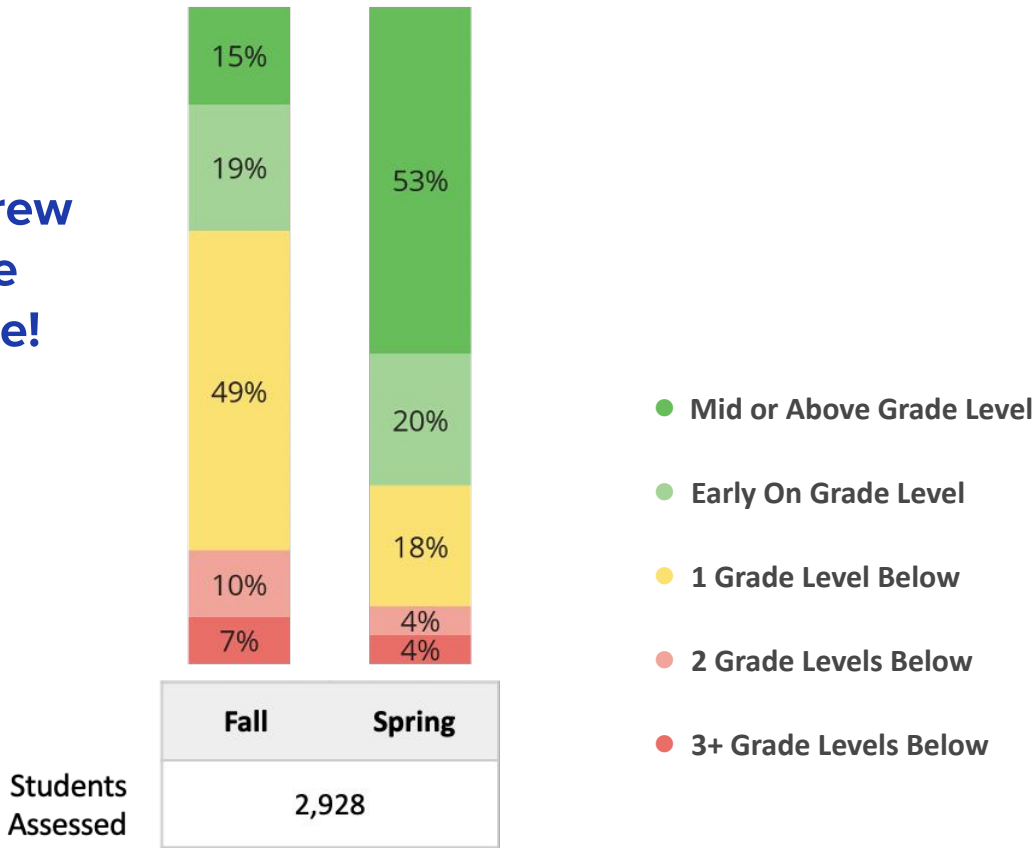


How Have FSSD Students Grown From Fall 2021 to Spring 2022?

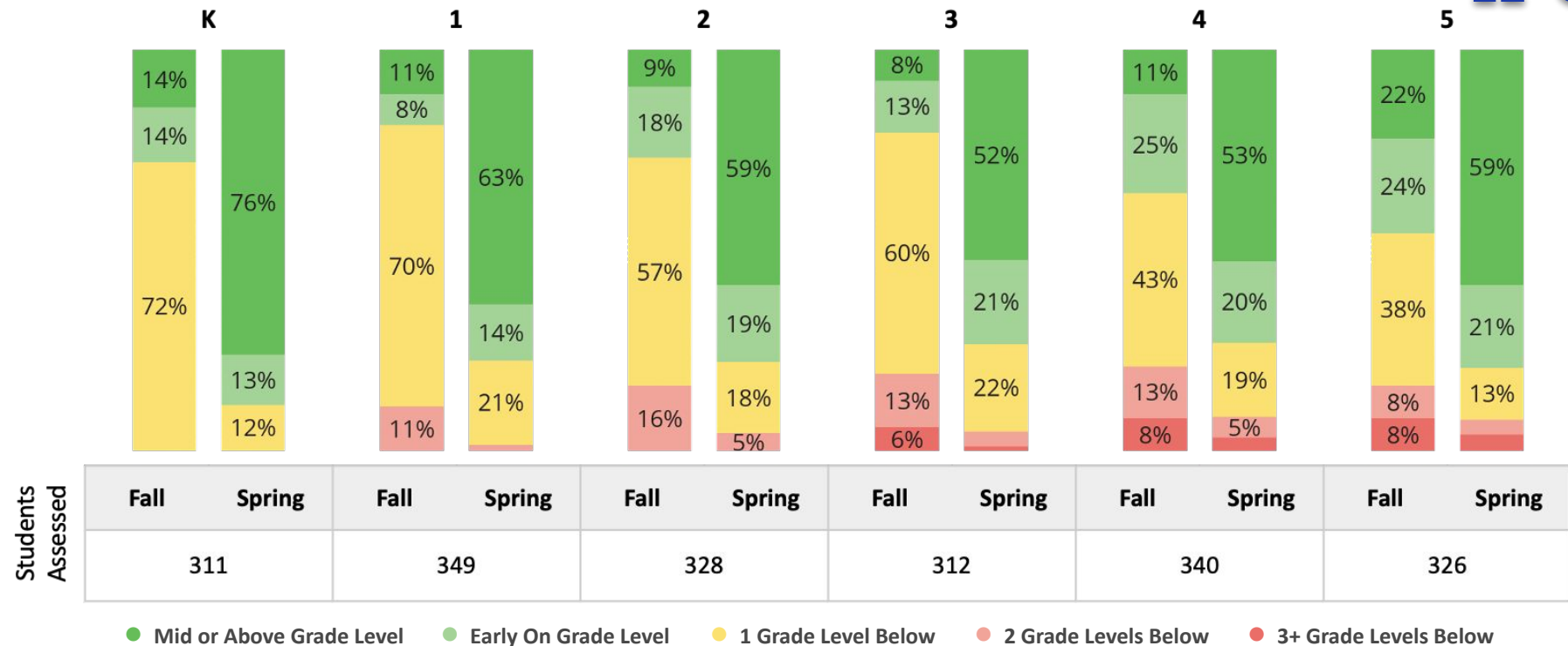

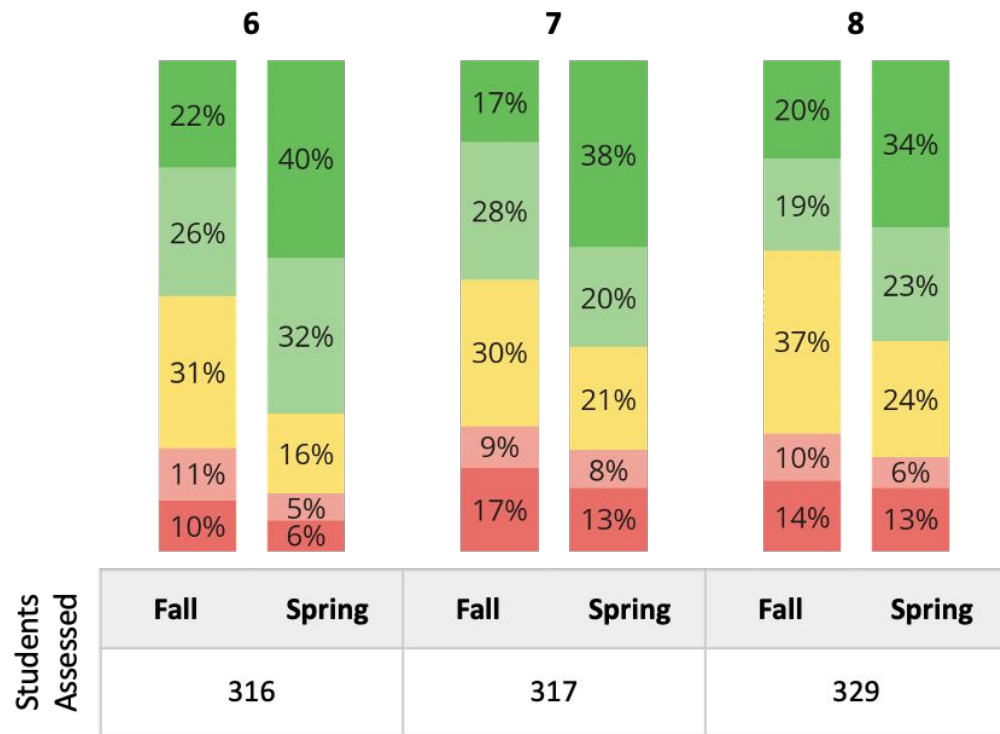
FSSD Growth Fall to Spring By Grade Level, K-5

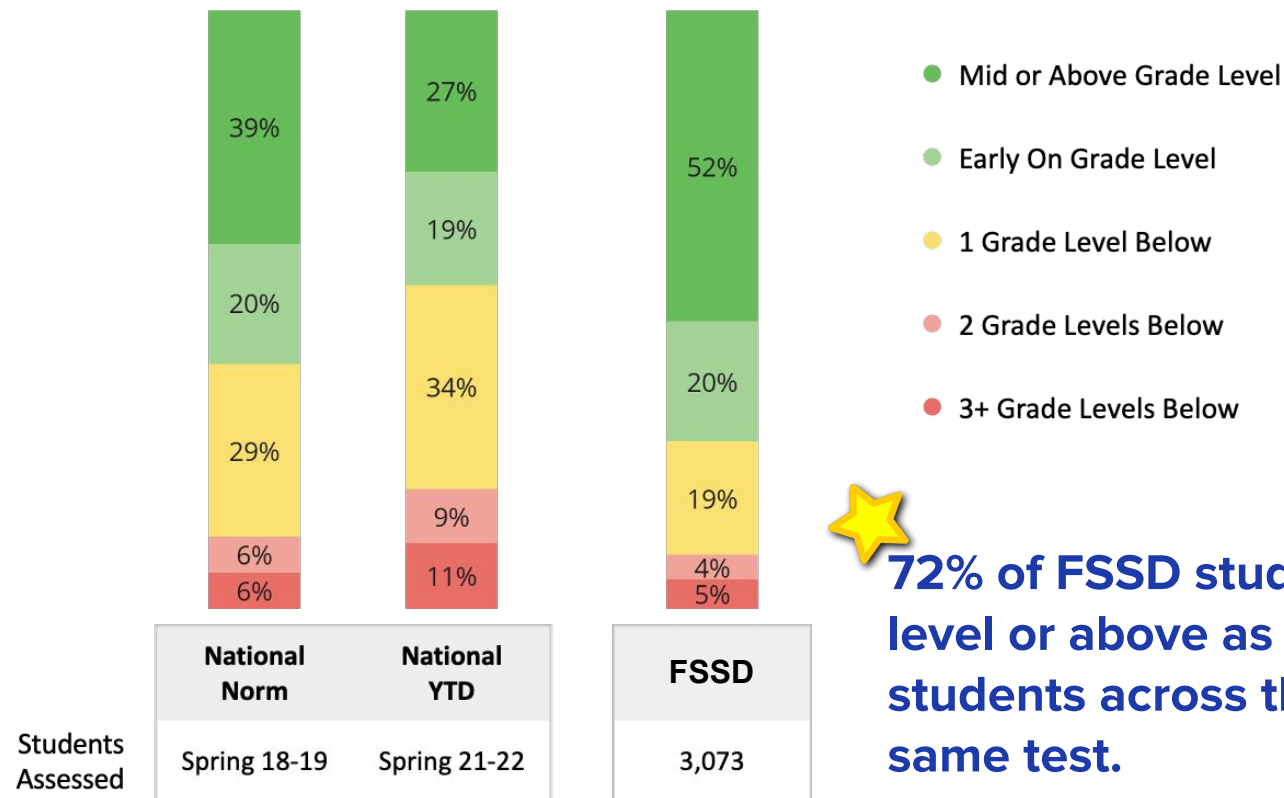

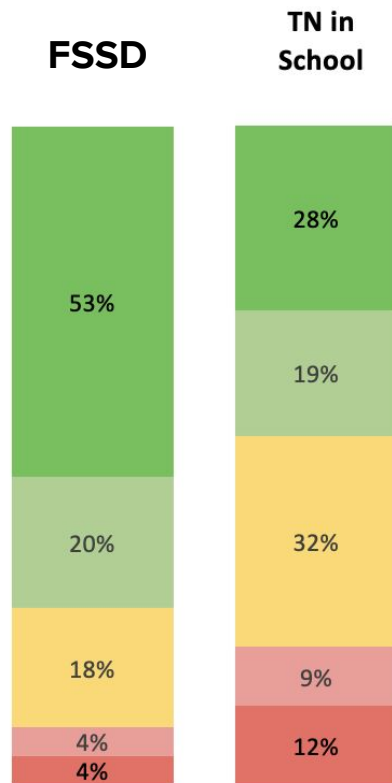
72% of FSSD students were on grade level or above as compared to 46% of students across the country on the same test.

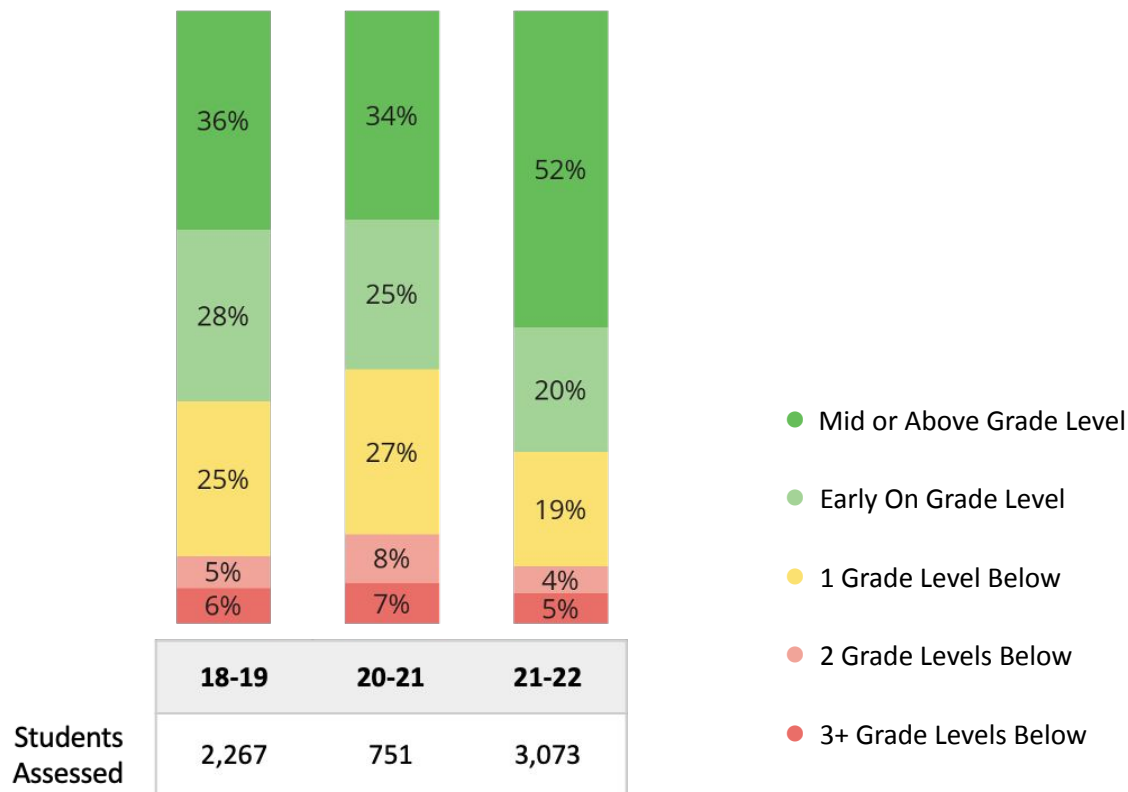

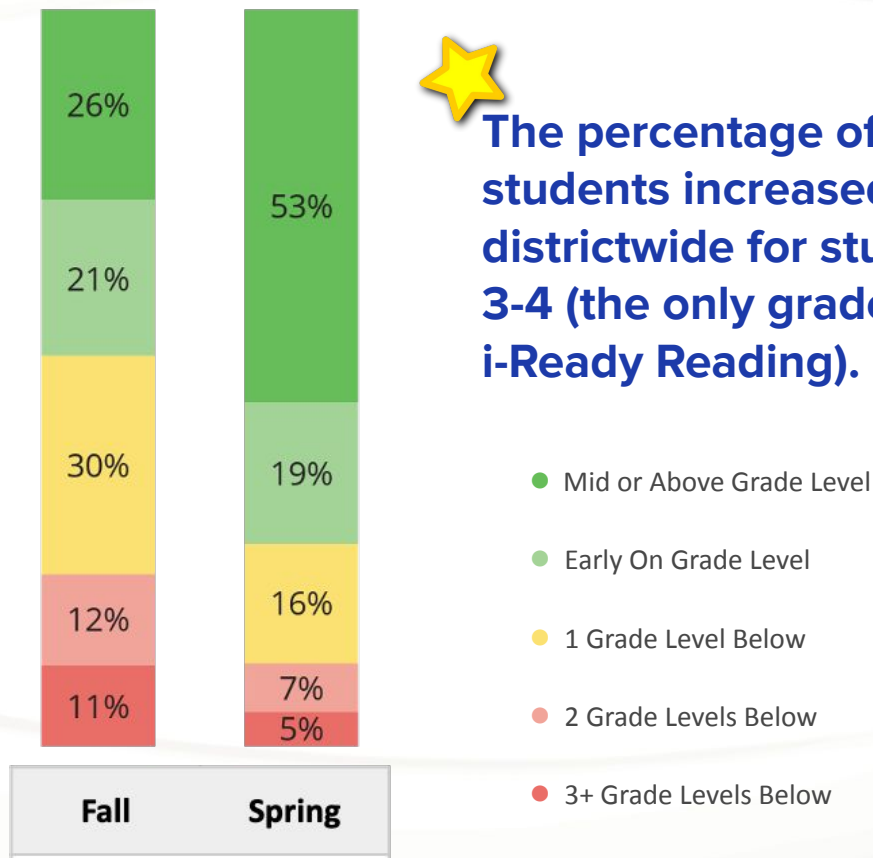


How Have FSSD Students Grown From Fall 2021 to Spring 2022?

Reading 3-4

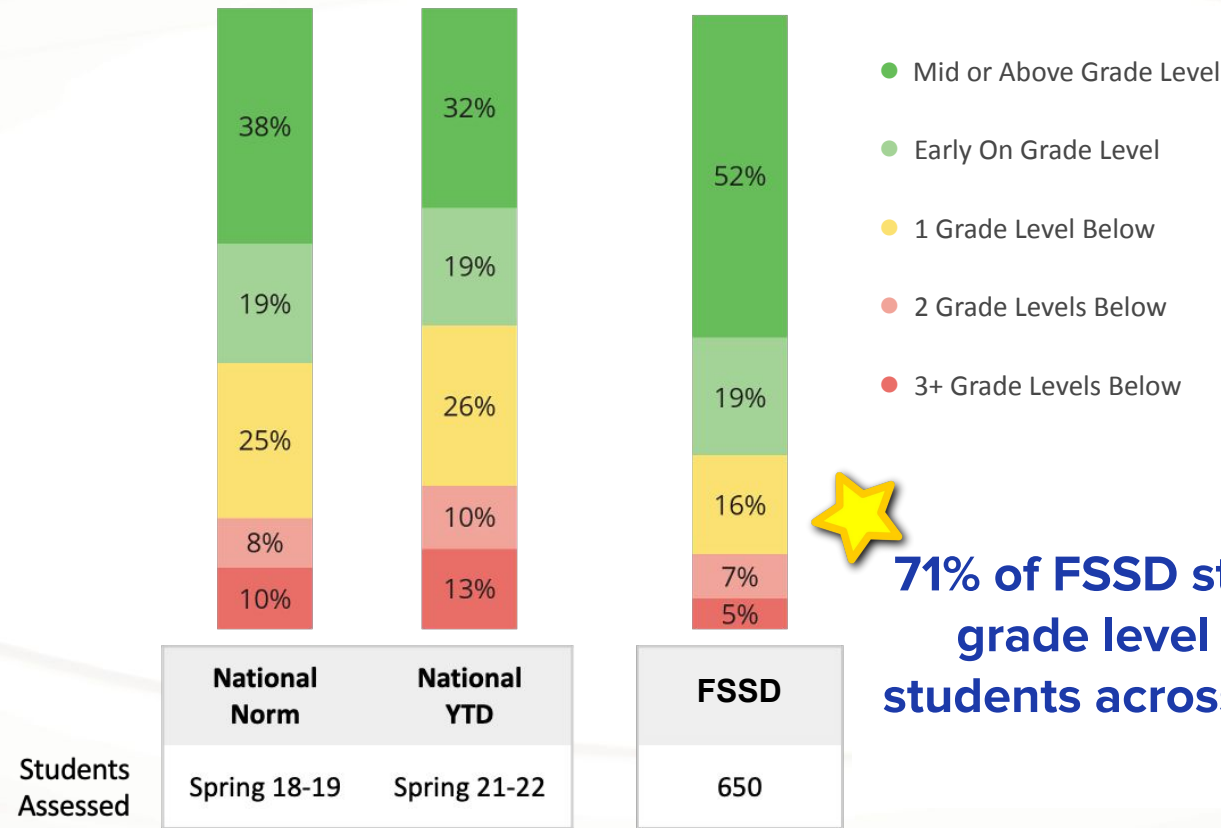


The percentage of proficient students increased 25% in reading districtwide for students in grades 3-4 (the only grades measured by i-Ready Reading).
