Betty Gwaltney Schutte, age 87, of Huntingdon in Clarke County, Virginia, died Monday, April 23, 2018. She was born in Suffolk, Virginia, the daughter of Jesse Johnson and Dean Cox Gwaltney, who lived in Lynchburg, Virginia.

She served on the boards of Powhatan School, Belle Grove Plantation, Blandy Farm, and the Century Club.

Mrs. Schutte lived at Huntingdon, the family farm, for 55 years where she loved to entertain, tend her flowers, care for her family, and share laughter and love with her children and grandchildren. She was a source of inspiration for many and created wonderful memories for all who knew her, always genuinely interested in the lives and passions of others. Despite challenges and hardships, she always focused on the positives in life and the good in people.

A funeral service will be held at First Presbyterian Church in Winchester, Virginia, on Saturday, April 28 at 11:30 a.m., followed by a burial service at Mt. Hebron Cemetery and a gathering of family and friends at Huntingdon.
