MONTHLY SUMMARY

The Tippecanoe County Coroner's Office (TCCOR) intends for this information in this report to be useful to community leaders and the public at large. The data presented within this report represents the deaths occurring within Tippecanoe County, for which the TCCOR has jurisdiction. This data does not represent all deaths that occur within Tippecanoe County, nor does it reflect all deaths of Tippecanoe County residents. The decedent's place of residence or location of incident may be outside of Tippecanoe County.

Our Values:

INTEGRITY. The TCCOR shows integrity through an office culture founded on pride and peer accountability, where members will maintain the highest of ethical standards.

COMPASSIONATE SERVICE. TCCOR employees are committed to building an effective team to service the local community as an advocate for the deceased and their families in times of need and sorrow. Our employees are committed to providing our law enforcement partners with the tools they need to prosecute offenders and protect the community.

The office of the Tippecanoe County Coroner has a dual role: **PUBLIC SAFETY AND PUBLIC HEALTH.**

As a **PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY**, the TCCOR conducts death investigations in an independent manner and without bias. TCCOR investigators, forensic and medicolegal, work with all law enforcement agencies to gather useful information in order to determine an accurate cause and manner of death. The TCCOR investigators also ensure legal positive identification of decedents and notification of legal next-of-kin as soon as reasonably possible.

As a **PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY**, the TCCOR provides information on the state of health of Tippecanoe County residents and alert the appropriate agencies of deaths that may present an immediate threat to its population. The TCCOR conducts epidemiological research and partners with multiple agencies to detect, investigate, and notify novel illnesses to better predict trends and support the at-risk populations.

MONTHLY OVERVIEW OF CASES REPORTED AND INVESTIGATED

In February of 2026, **68 total deaths** were reported to the TCCOR. The TCCOR accepted, under its jurisdiction, **31 deaths for further investigation** this month alone. Since the beginning of 2026, the TCCOR has had **145 total deaths reported to our office**. Of those total reported deaths, the TCCOR has accepted jurisdiction on **72 deaths for further investigation**.

TCCOR February Caseload

Accepted Cases – The TCCOR has accepted, under its jurisdiction, **31 deaths for further investigation**.

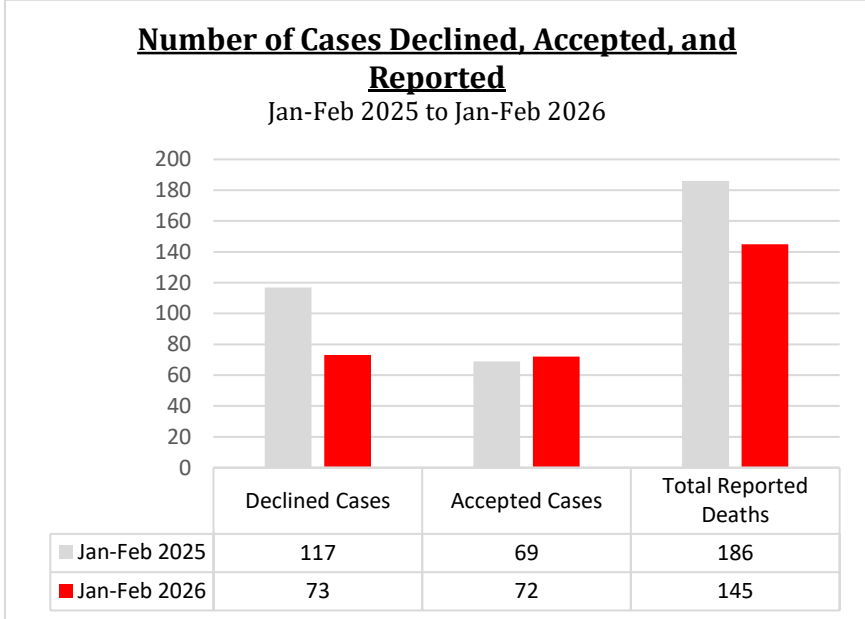
Declined Cases – The TCCOR declined jurisdiction of **37 deaths**.

Autopsies/External Exams – Of the 31 deaths accepted for further investigation, **17 were autopsied** to assist in determining the cause and manner of death.

The total number of deaths reported has **decreased by 22%** compared to the same time last year.

The total number of cases where jurisdiction was declined has **decreased by 38%** compared to the same time last year.

The total number of cases accepted for further investigation has **increased by 4%** compared to the same time last year.

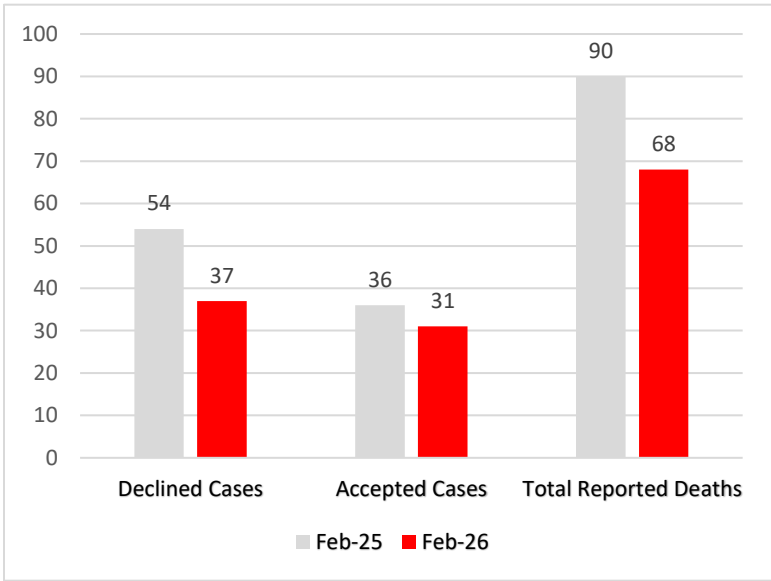
There was a **19% decrease** in autopsies in February of 2026 compared to February of 2025.

Comparison of Deaths for February 2025 vs. February 2026

There is a **24% decrease** in total reported deaths to the TCCOR in February 2026 compared to February 2025.

There is a **14% decrease** accepted cases for further investigation in February 2026 compared to February 2025.

There is an **31% decrease** in declined cases in February 2026 compared to February 2025.

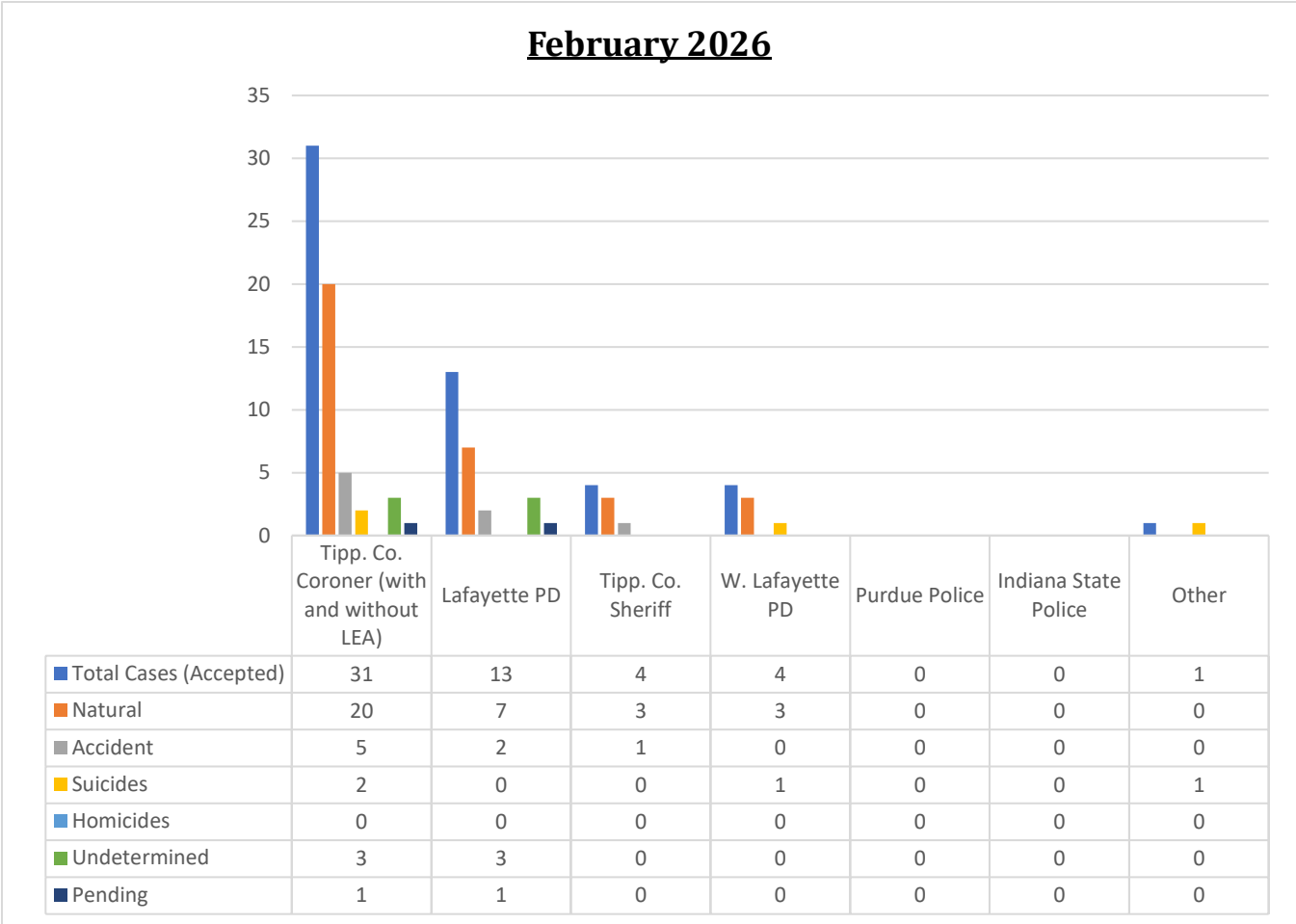


Monthly Invoice Comparison



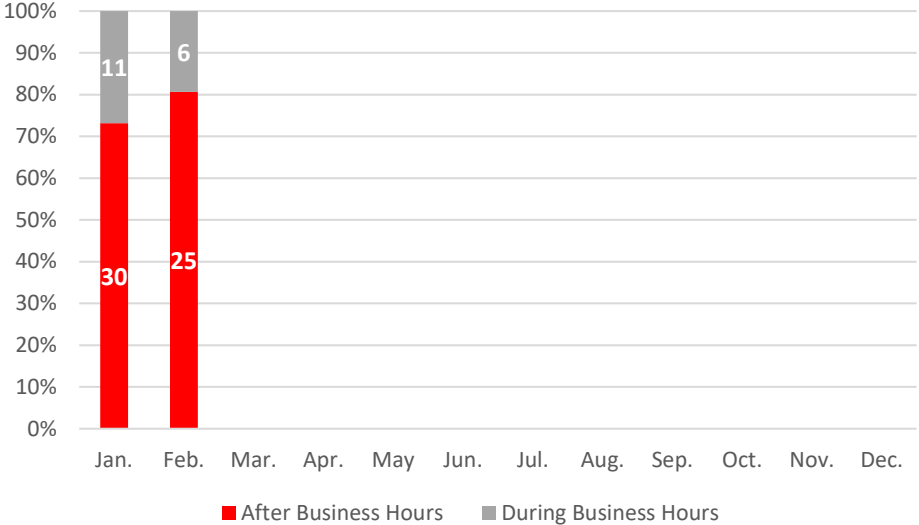

During Business Hours vs. After Business Hours

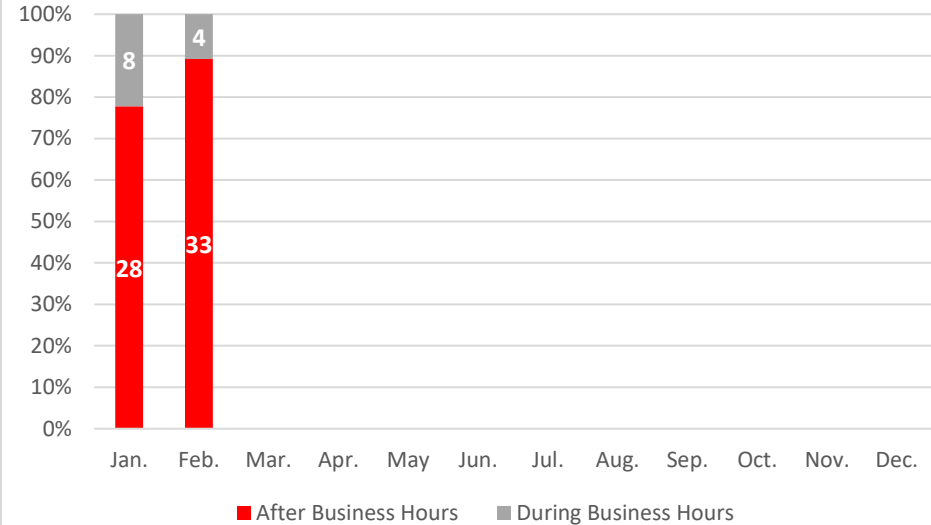


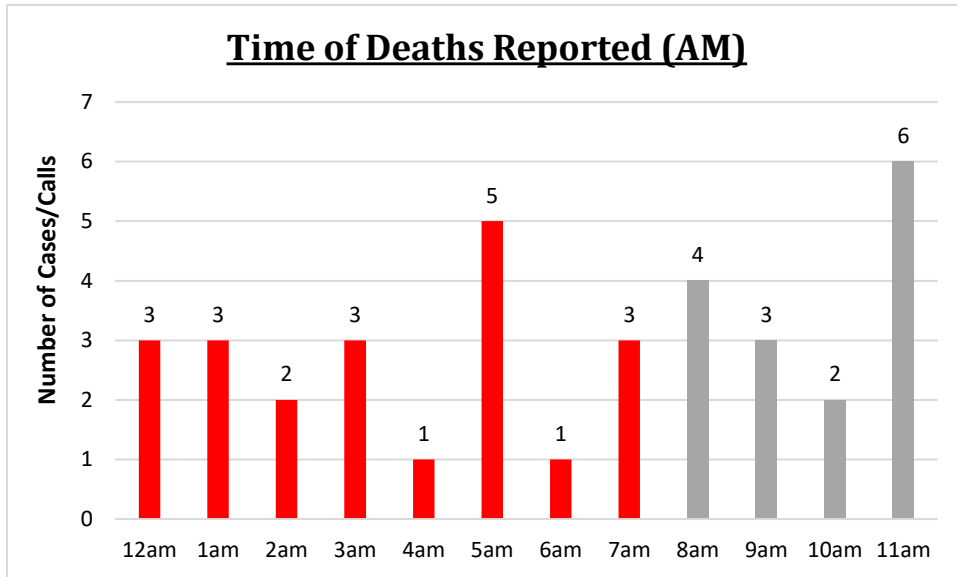
In February, **81%** of cases accepted for further investigation occurred **after** business hours.

In February, **89%** of cases declined for further investigation occurred **after** business hours.

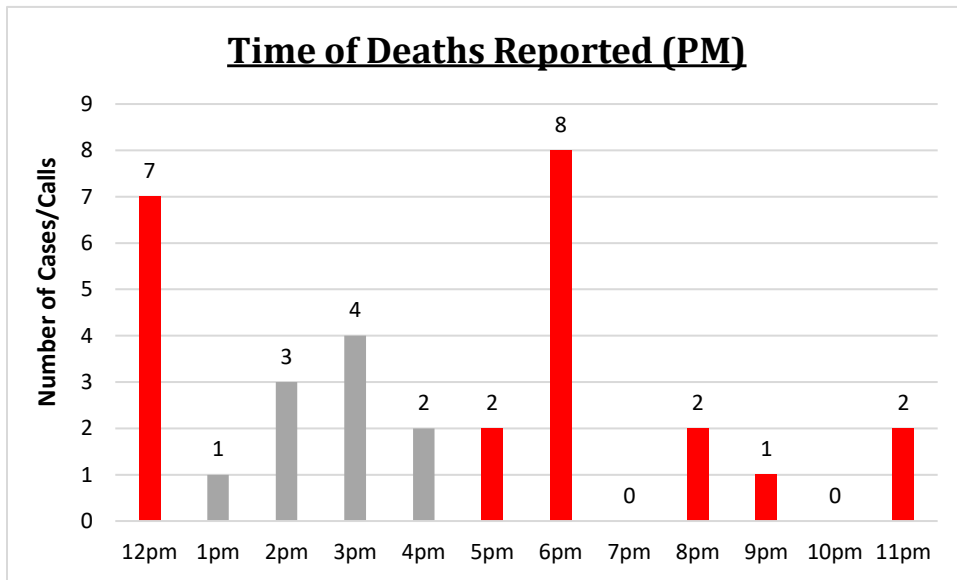
Number of Declined Cases

In February 2026, 63% of deaths reported occurred after business hours, while 37% of deaths reported occurred during business hours.
