UNDERGROUND: STORIES FROM THE BORDERLANDS

What made border cities unique during the struggle for freedom in the 1800s? What did it mean to truly be an abolitionist?

"Underground" looks at the complicated history of slavery and abolition in Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky (USA), and how this was much more than just a two sided issue.

THOUSAND YEAR FLOOD

Documentary Short | USA | 44m

Thousand Year Flood is an emotional documentary that chronicles the devastating impact of the 2022 Southeastern Kentucky flood. Through powerful interviews with survivors, rescuers, and local community members, the film offers a raw and emotional account of the destruction, resilience, and recovery efforts in the wake of one of the region's worst natural disasters. The documentary showcases the unwavering strength of the Appalachian spirit, as communities come together to rebuild and persevere. Blending intimate stories with stunning 4K footage, drone shots, and historical archive clips, Thousand Year Flood paints a vivid picture of tragedy, resilience, and hope amidst adversity.

THE MOTORCYCLE MAN

A 21st century trip set in the birthplace of the 60's, this slice of Americana stars Tony Award winner John Glover as an easy-riding and sharp-tongued guide to two young travelers looking for Ken Kesey's cabin deep in the Santa Cruz Mountains. Examining ideas of autonomy, cultural literacy, and unexpected connection, the film was shot by National Geographic's Emmy winning director of photography Ben Mullin and directed by Northern California filmmaker Jason Ward.

FOOLS PARADISE (LOST?)

Documentary Feature | USA | 1hr38m

How do we heal ourselves through reconnection to the natural world? How do we heal what is left of the wild – our own inner wild and the outer wild? Immersed in experiences recounted by writers, filmmakers, artists, environmentalists, adventurers, therapists, and political activists, we delve into scientific inquiry around topics such as personal action, sustainable business and life practices, nature therapies and how we need and use nature to regenerate ourselves. Alongside this exploration, we address the reality that we must heal what is left of our planet. Fools' Paradise (lost?) is a love letter to our wild. In a time when climate change and environmental degradation pose dire consequences for both humanity and the planet, we hope that by revealing pathways for healing through our reconnection to the natural world, we will learn to care for it – and if the earth benefits, we will all benefit.

The film introduces two characters— a disheveled and obscure gentleman by the name of Mister Davies (who finds himself in a place of distress after being admitted into the care of a psychiatric facility) and the film's antagonist; Doctor Chausser (the chief of medicine of the psychiatric ward of which Mister Davies is being held.

SLEEP DEMON

Sleep Demon is a chilling short horror film inspired by a real event, exploring the terrifying experience of sleep paralysis. The story delves into the unsettling phenomenon many have reported—being frozen in place, unable to move or scream, while a shadowy figure looms over them. As the protagonist struggles to wake from the grip of paralysis, they begin to wonder if the "sleep demon" they see is a mere hallucination or something far more sinister that preys on those most vulnerable in the night.

GLASS VALLEY

Narrative Feature | USA | 1hr5m

Boyd Tillman is a first-generation college graduate who is returning to his hometown in rural Appalachia to work and save for grad school. On his way home, Boyd's vehicle breaks down, threatening to cripple him financially. Boyd is staying with his mother, Angie, who suggests that he visit his estranged father, Lane, to seek help with the vehicle. Lane agrees to help but uses Boyd's severe financial need as leverage to coerce him into assisting with his drug manufacturing operation. Boyd's involvement with Lane's subordinate, Ty, quickly turns south, and the aftermath of their fallout drastically alters the lives of the three men.

SHUFFLE

Documentary Feature | USA | 1hr21m

Through the lens of his own recovery, a filmmaker offers a character-driven look inside the billion dollar addiction treatment industry where young people are bought and sold for their insurance policies and ushered into a system designed to keep them sick. What begins as an investigation of a street-level scam, explodes to uncover systemic conflicts-of-interest and collusion at the highest levels of government.

Documentary Feature | USA | 52m

A portrait of 26-year-old Matthew - a young man who stutters and wants to realize his childhood dream. He wants to become a Polish champion in acrobatics.

The Phenakistoscope is an animation toy, a disk of pictures that, when spun, presents an animation. A Flower Keester Cop is just like that, but with flower power.

TRANSFORMATION

Documetary Feature | Turkey | 52m

In the following months after the USA withdrew its troops from Afghanistan, a young Kabul couple, have found their way to the dark and dodgy Afghan neighborhood, Zeytinburnu,in Istanbul. Malika - a transgender woman who together with Mohamed, the love of her life, have fled their families honor killing plan and Taliban's fatal punishments to be able to cultivate their forbidden love for each other, in the hope of achieving a new and better life in Turkey.

CAMP WIDOW

Documetary Short | USA | 15m

Camp Widow is a gathering for widowed people by widowed people. Over the course of three days, attendees speak candidly about death, forge connections with others over shared experiences of loss, and find ways to navigate the tricky waters of grief. Founded by Michele Neff Hernandez, who suddenly became a widow at age 35 when her husband died in a bike accident, the camp offers a way to both recognize tremendous loss, while at the same time celebrating continued life.
