For Kids' Sake (FKS) is an international fundraising project that helps children, schools and orphanages in Bangladesh. Through our assistance, thousands of lives are transformed in one of the poorest countries in the world. FKS also strives to create financial sustainability by supporting local cottage industries and provides project managers with on-site leadership training. A worldwide network of FKS volunteers raises money via various creative events along with donations and grants.

The For Kids' Sake Story



For Kids' Sake (FKS) supports six facilities to provide food, clothing, shelter, education, healthcare and a safe environment for approximately 550 orphans. In addition, our sites host fully registered schools and offer Kindergarten through College level education to more than 4,000 children from surrounding villages. In total, FKS supports, educates and empowers 4,000 children each month.

Along with donations, FKS facilities are financially supported by local, income-generating projects that include: aquaculture, dairy farming, fruit and vegetable farming, irrigation services, ferryboat service and village market rentals. As well, these projects also provide vocational training for the children. Currently 130 Bangladeshis are employed by FKS facilities and projects, helping to stimulate the local economy.

As early as the 1940s, Sayed Dayemullah Huzur began founding orphanages and schools in Bangladesh. Having been an orphan himself, he dedicated his life to serving those in desperate need of hope and relief.

Before his passing in 1995, Sayed Dayemullah entrusted this essential work to his successor, Sheikh Din Muhammad Abdullah al-Dayemi. To keep the promise and support his predecessor's work, Sheikh Din established "For Kids' Sake."

For Kids' Sake exists because of a promise.

For Kids' Sake has now grown to become an international fundraising program with branches in the United States, Germany and Switzerland.

FKS service projects in Bangladesh are flourishing. Daily operations are managed by the Dayemi Foundation, which is the Bangladeshi government approved NGO that administrates the service projects.

What are our plans for the future?

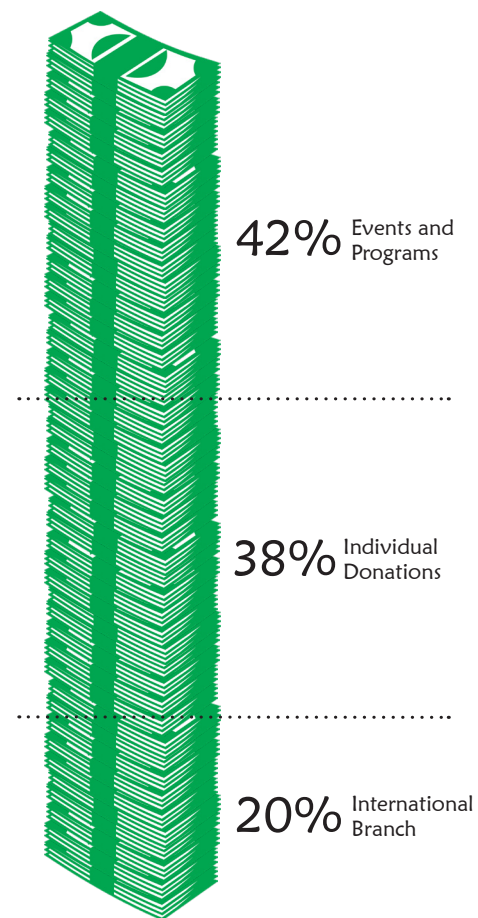
We plan to expand FKS services and continue to improve the standard of living for orphans, in addition to growing our cottage industries and vocational training.

How do we use financial contributions?

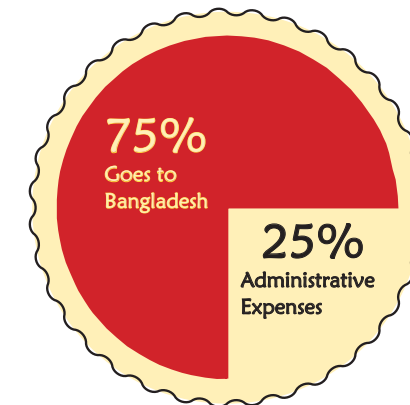
Contributions are used to provide basic necessities, pay teachers and caretakers' salaries, invest in cottage industries and new projects, such as building expansions.

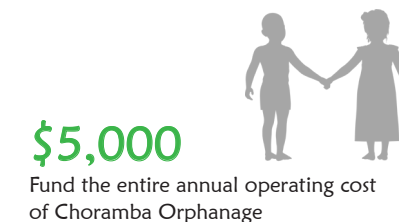
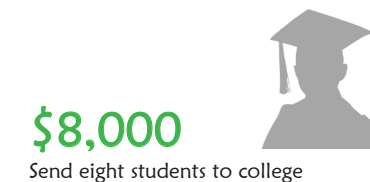

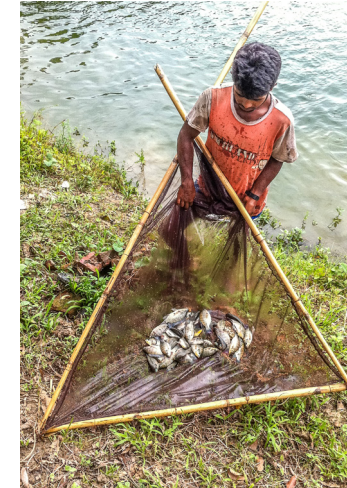

Today, Fulmia has a government job taking care of hundreds of orphans in Ibrahimpur.



Orphaned at the age of five, **Fulmia** was left to survive on his own in Dhaka, Bangladesh. His right hand was disabled from a birth defect. Fulmia lived alone on the streets when Sayed Dayemullah, the founder, invited him to live at Ibrahimpur Orphanage. The invitation saved Fulmia's life.

There, Fulmia found basic necessities

and an invaluable education. He thrived at Ibrahimpur, graduating at the head of his class in 2003.

Today, Fulmia has a government job taking care of hundreds of orphans in Ibrahimpur. He owns his own home and is married with two beautiful daughters and a son. This stunning turn of events was made possible by your contributions.

Back home, there was no one to take care of us even if we were sick. Here, I have 30 sisters who are always there for me.



When she was 10, **Tanzina Aktar** and her four sisters were without parents, as well as the means to take care of themselves. Tanzina and her sister came to Ibrahimpur in 2010. "Here we have full access to education, and we are living well. Back home, there was no one to take care of us even if we were sick.

The staff takes care of us very well, so that we don't feel the absence of our parents." Tanzina hopes that those who are able will continue to support For Kids' Sake so that children can have a better life and a better chance of building a good future.
