Therefore, we have the most up to date numbers available for Cape Girardeau County positive cases.

Cape Girardeau County COVID-19:

Testing

- Individuals should call their provider to determine if they need to be tested for COVID-19.
- SoutheastHEALTH's COVID-19 provider/nurse triage line is available 24/7 at **573-519-4983**. Anyone experiencing symptoms may use this number to speak with a health care provider. It is also available for patients, clinicians, and anyone in the community who has COVID-19 specific questions.
- The Saint Francis Nurse Hotline is **573-331-4200**. The Hotline is staffed from 8 am to 5 pm, Monday through Friday, and 9 am to 3 pm, Saturday and Sunday. Nurses provide screening for those who think they have been exposed to COVID-19. If a patient meets the DHSS and CDC screening criteria, the patient will be directed to the nearest Saint Francis testing location.

We will only provide an update on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays unless we receive new cases.
