## V. COURT ORDERS

- A. It is ordered that the Judge Executive is authorized to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the McCracken County PVA creating centralized land use data management through the PVA as it relates to the 911 Fee. It is further ordered that the Treasurer is authorized to pay invoices related to the same.
- B. It is ordered that bid openings were held at 10:00 am on May 27, 2026 at the McCracken County Courthouse for Bituminous Asphalt Paving for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027. One bid was received, that being from Jim Smith Contracting and was taken under advisement.
- C. It is ordered that the bid for Bituminous Asphalt Paving for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027 be awarded to Jim Smith Contracting.
- D. It is ordered bid openings were held at 10:00 am on May 27, 2026 at the McCracken County Courthouse for delivered fuel for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027. Three bids were received, that being from Max Arnold and Sons, Southern FS and JSC Terminal LLC d/b/a Midwest Terminal. All three were taken under advisement.
- E. It is ordered that the bid for delivered fuel for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027 be awarded to Max Arnold and Sons.
- F. It is ordered that bid openings were held at 10:00 am on May 27, 2026 at the McCracken County Courthouse for pick up and/or delivery of stone for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027. Stone sizes included dga, class 2 channel lining, class 3 channel lining, 300 pound channel lining, number 3's, ¼ inch minus, 8 inch minus and 9M. Five bids were received, that being Vulcan Materials, B&N Trucking, Overby Trucking, Keeling Farms with Arcosa material and Keeling Farms with Riverport material. All five were taken under advisement.
- G. It is ordered that the bid for dga pick up at the plant, dga delivered, number 3's at the plant and number 3's delivered for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027 be awarded to Keeling Farms with Riverport materials.

As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- N. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated May 26, 2026, to Skeeter Kell Sporting Goods for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$23,177.80. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- O. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated June 5, 2026, to DreamSeats LLC for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$3,527.00. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- P. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated April 15, 2026, to PYT Sports Inc. for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$1,445.00. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- Q. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated May 13, 2026, to BFW for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$13,642.95. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.

- R. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated May 19, 2026, to Jeff Holland, LLC. for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$18,000.00. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- S. It is ordered to pay the invoice dated May 28, 2026, to True Line Roofing for the Sports Complex Project, in the amount of \$24,255.88. This is pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated September 7, 2022, between the City of Paducah, Kentucky, the County of McCracken County, Kentucky, and the Sports Tourism Commission. As per the Interlocal Agreement, the City of Paducah pays half of the invoice to McCracken County.
- T. It is ordered to pay Mailit Xpress Inc \$3,315.94 for pre-postage on mailing the Net Profit License Fee late notices, the 1st quarter 2026 Payroll late notices and the 2nd quarter 2026 Payroll Returns.
- U. It is ordered to enter into a lease agreement with Howard D. Happy Company to replace the copier at the Road Department. It is further ordered that the Judge Executive is authorized to sign all necessary documents.

SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE AND NOTICE OF ADOPTION

The Fiscal Court of the County of McCracken, Kentucky (the “County”), at regular meetings held on May 11, 2026 and May 26, 2026, adopted an ordinance (the “Ordinance”) titled as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MCCRACKEN, KENTUCKY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2026A, IN A MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$10,000,000, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE COSTS OF VARIOUS RENOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PADUCAH-MCCRACKEN COUNTY CONVENTION & EXPO CENTER; APPROVING THE FORM OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE DESIGNATED OFFICERS OF THE COUNTY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE FILING OF A NOTICE WITH THE STATE LOCAL DEBT OFFICER; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF AND SECURITY FOR THE BONDS; ESTABLISHING A BOND PAYMENT FUND FOR THE BONDS; AFFIRMING THE MAINTENANCE OF THE EXISTING SINKING FUND; AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE BID OF THE SUCCESSFUL PURCHASER OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND THE PADUCAH-MCCRACKEN COUNTY CONVENTION CENTER CORPORATION WITH RESPECT TO THE USE OF A PORTION OF THE COUNTY’S TRANSIENT ROOM TAXES FOR THE PAYMENT OF A PORTION OF THE DEBT SERVICE ON THE BONDS; AND REPEALING ANY INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES.

The Ordinance authorizes the County to issue a series of its general obligation bonds, to be designated as “General Obligation Bonds, Series 2026A” (the “Bonds”), in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$10,000,000, for the purposes of (i) financing all or a portion of the costs of the acquisition, construction, installation, and equipping of various renovations and improvements to the Paducah-McCracken County Convention & Expo Center, for the benefit of the citizens of the County (the “Project”); (ii) paying the costs of credit enhancement on the Bonds, if any; and (iii) paying the costs of issuance of the Bonds. Provisions are made in the Ordinance for the payment of the Bonds and the security therefor, the application of the proceeds of the Bonds, the establishment of a Bond Payment Fund, the continuation of the County’s existing sinking fund, and certain covenants of the County with respect to the Bonds. The Bonds will be sold at public, competitive sale, and shall mature, or be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption, in varying amounts on August 1 of each year,

commencing August 1, 2027, through and including August 1, 2046. The Bonds pledge the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the County, and provision is made in the Ordinance for the collection of a tax to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds, subject to certain credits, as provided in Section 16 of the Ordinance. The sale of the Bonds is contingent upon the satisfaction of the requirements and conditions of the County regarding the Project. Section 16 of the Ordinance is set forth below in its entirety:

“Section 16. General Obligation. The Bonds shall be full general obligations of the County and the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the County are hereby pledged for the prompt payment of the Bonds and the interest thereon. During the period the Bonds are outstanding, there shall be, and there hereby is, annually levied on all the taxable property in the County, in addition to all other taxes, without limitation as to rate, a direct tax in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as and when due, it being hereby found and determined that the current tax rates of the County are within all applicable limitations. The tax shall be, and hereby is, ordered to be computed, certified, levied, and extended upon the tax duplicate, and shall be collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of the years the Bonds are outstanding are certified, extended, and collected. The tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof; provided, however, that in each year, to the extent that other lawfully available funds of the County are available for the payment of the Bonds and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such direct tax upon all the taxable property in the County shall be reduced by the amount of such other funds so available and appropriated.”

This Ordinance reduces the tax on premiums received by insurance companies for all insurance categories from the current rates to four point forty-five (4.45) percent, with an effective date of July 1, 2027. The reduction of this tax is a result of McCracken County now being in a sound financial position and the Fiscal Court’s determination to take measured action

to reduce the tax burden on McCracken County residents and businesses, whenever practical and always in accord with principles of sound fiscal management.
