Soccer will continue to be strong in our area for the boys this fall. The Little 10 is a hotbed of quality boys soccer teams in the smaller schools. Indian Creek will be joined by Paw Paw in all sports for 2018-19 school year. Earlville-Leland will continue to co-op in boy's soccer, but in some other sports they will field their own teams at each school.

The Yorkville Foxes had a tough year in 2017 going just 2-7 and their opponents in the two wins are not on their schedule for 2018. The Foxes beat Marian out of Chicago Heights, 49-0, in Week 2 last season and ended the year with a 28-7 win over LaSalle-Peru.

Four new teams are on the Foxes schedule this season as they will play Kankakee High School at home in Week 1 and travel to Centralia for a Saturday game in Week 2. McHenry will come to Campbell Field in Week 3 and Yorkville will host Ottawa in Week 9.

The Foxes had two games last season that could have gone in the win column

with a couple of plays in each of those losses being the difference. Those two teams from last season Morris and Sycamore follow the McHenry game this year.

Like other teams in our area this will be the last year for the Northern Illinois Big 12 East conference and foes like Kaneland and DeKalb would have to be non-conference games it they remain on the Foxes schedule.

Head Coach Dan McGuire told me that the Foxes defense should be a strong part of their team this year led by players like Cale Reeder, Zach Katula, Jake Polowy and Phil LoChirco leading the way at DB and LB. Keenan Ness and Josh Slavin will anchor the defensive line.
