ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS'
MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY
RESTRAINING ORDER

This matter came before the Court on Plaintiffs' motion for a temporary restraining order. The Court heard oral argument on the matter. All parties appeared and were heard on the record; and the Court having considered the following when reaching its decision:

- 1. The original Complaint and Exhibits in this matter;
- 2. Plaintiffs' Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order;
- 3. Declaration of Dru Van Ausdle;
- 4. Declaration of Elise Severe;
- 5. Declaration of Elise Severe in Support of Temporary Restraining Order;

Being fully advised on the matter, the Court GRANTS Plaintiffs' Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order and ORDERS that:

1. Columbia County's ballot initiative Proposition 2 ("Proposition 2") is invalid on the grounds that (a) it exceeds the scope of the initiative authority granted to the people of the Unincorporated County; (b) the dissolution statute, RCW 27.12.320, as applied, is unconstitutional and internally inconsistent such that the petition process and a vote are invalid; (c) there is substantial evidence of fraud and good cause to restrain Defendants to permit the mandatory investigation of these allegations and/or vitiate the validity of petition signatures; (d) it clearly appears from specific facts by affidavit that immediate and irreparable injury, loss or damage will result before all parties can be heard; (e) that actual and substantial injury will occur without the temporary restraining order in place.
